He might have to fall back on another line of work, like waiting tables, and if he was going to have to wait on tables why not just buy a Restaurant? So in May of 2005 he bought the Paradise Pub.

The Paradise Pub has been a landmark locals hang out for years and years. The Clinton's didn't want to see a chain come in and take away this special place from Key Largo. It is, after all, the original home of the "Cheeseburger in Paradise", like in the Jimmy Buffet song. The cheeseburger with lettuce, tomato, onion, french fries and coleslaw is still only \$6.95. We recommend lunch with Sharon the day manager.

Sharon and the daily lunch specials listed on the back page of this newspaper are sure to make you smile.

Although you could never accuse the Pub of being a Fine Dining Restaurant, the food is excellent in it's own "Cheers" style atmosphere and they are open late. Dine indoors or outside amidst the picnic tables and palm trees. You can choose from anything on their full menu up until 1 AM on weekdays and 2 AM on Fridays and Saturdays. My friend Kiwi makes a point of getting the Grilled Grouper Dinner (\$9.95) every time he comes to town. Dance the night away or play pool till the wee hours and you'll still be able to get a bite to eat and not regret all the fun you had in the morning.

If you are a local or new in town stop in and sign up for the pool or dart tournaments. The Pub has the only steel tip electronic dartboards in town. It's a great way to meet people.

Continued from page 4 more" when the user presses the button. Lili holds the box in her left hand while she supports Jaiden on the horse with her right hand. The volunteers guide the horse for several steps, and then they stop. Lili asks Jaiden, "Do you want more?" He reaches out to the big red button and presses it. The recorded voice says, "More". They repeat this process several times, and each time the horse stops, Lili asks, "Do you want more?" Each time. Jaiden reaches for the response, the horse starts walking again.

Lili is happy with Jaiden's responses, saying, "This is the first step. We're hoping in the next few weeks to have more than one button - one that says "more" and one that says "all done". He'll have one to take home also." From there, they can progress to more complex choices.

Lili tells us, "The horse acts as a great reinforcer motivating the child to participate in activities. For kids who aren't communicating, the use of the horse can reinforce communication." Lili tells us that Jaiden's attention and walking have improved significantly -the rhythmic walking movements of the horse help in his awareness of his body. By modifying the pace of the horse, sensory processing can also be facilitated. Inefficient sensory processing can have effects on a child's arousal level, attention and motor control.

Christina, Jaiden's mom, says she's seen many changes in Jaiden, especially with his walking. "When he started, he was really unstable. He would

walk into walls, but he's gotten a lot better. He's been doing this about a year. When he's finished with therapy, he tries harder, doesn't get as frustrated, and makes more sounds."

The Hippotherapy horses Healis uses at White Star Farms are of the Paso Fino breed.

Many of the volunteers are students, who can earn volunteer hours for high school working with kids and horses in Healis' program.

Diane asked us to let our readers know how much she button, and it says, "More!"
