Day 2 - We found ourselves in Nassau, now that is beautiful! A few of us elected to walk around the town and found some excellent shopping there. The salespeople were very nice. I would advise to avoid the flea market. It is about a hundred desperate vendors all selling the same things crammed together under a sweltering tent.

As we roamed the street in search of a local bar for refreshments we ran into a funeral procession. A local dignitary had died and a huge parade was taking place. It appeared that the whole town came out to pay their respects. We were exhausted from the heat so we made our way back to the ship electing to skip Atlantis. We decided to save that for another cruise.

The first and second day of our trip we won big in the casino on 2 cent slots. The third and fourth day we weren't so lucky.

Day 4 - We awoke to a tropical paradise at Great Stirrup Cay, an island owned by NCL. Video Dave was the only one in our group to disembark and roam the island shooting photos with his new camera. of devastating loss, whether it is the loss of a loved one, a dream. or a relationship, feelings may arise within us that are overwhelming or difficult to cope with. This sense of arief can also come up when we are separated from anyone or anything we have welcomed into our lives. And while it may feel like we are caught up in a neverending spiral of sadness and emptiness, it is important to remember that the grief we are feeling is not a permanent state of being. Rather, grief is part of the process of letting go that in many ways can be a gift, allowing us to go deeper within ourselves to rediscover the light amidst the seeming darkness.

The emotions that accompany any kind of loss can be intense and varied. A sense of shock or denial is often the first reaction. to be replaced by anger. Sometimes this anger can be directed at your loved one for "abandoning" you; at other times you may feel outrage toward the universe for what you are enduring. And while there are stages of grief that people go through - moving from denial to anger to bargaining to depression

When we experience any kind to acceptance - the cycles of grief often move in spirals, sometimes circling forward and then back again. You may even experience moments of strength, faith, and laughter in between. While these emotions seem to come and go sporadically, it is important to feel them, accept them, and allow them to flow. With time, patience, and compassion, you will eventually find your center again.

> As we move through our grief, we may find ourselves reluctant to release our pain, fearing we are letting go of who or what we have lost. We may even regard our movement toward healing as an act of disloyalty or giving up. Know that while the hurt may fade, the essence of what you had and who you loved will have already transformed you and forever stay with you. If anything, once you are ready for the pain of your loss to subside, their memories can then live more fully within you. Remember, that healing is a part of the spiraling cycles of grief, and that in letting yourself feel restored again, you are surrendering to a natural movement that is part of the dance of life.

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The Florida Keys Wild Bird Center is in a terminal financial situation. There is little or no money to continue, and to lose this unique rescue center for injured wild birds and the rehab of birds too injured to release would diminish our community.

Laura Quinn has devoted a large part of her life to the birds and the center, including a reverse mortgage on her homestead property to keep the Center alive.

## Wild Bird Center Story: Visualize This

Real accounts from the Florida Keys Wild Bird Center.

An osprey is thrashing around eight feet above the around, entanaled by its right wing in a length of heavy fishing line strung between a power pole and the palm tree in your front yard. That was what was described to us in a recent call for a bird rescue on Lower Matecumbe Key in Islamorada. We hate these end-of-day calls, especially when they mean a twenty-mile trip - but we go.

While we jumped into the car with our long-handled net and raptor rescue gloves, (we didn't think to bring our camera), the callers put a folding ladder under the bird so that it could stand on it, sparing the wing from being destroyed. They knew better than to try to deal with those talons and awaited our arrival to do the rescue.

Upon our arrival and approach to the bird, she jumped off the ladder trying to escape from us. With one of us She had to be fully grabbing her legs and supporting her, the other rescuer cut the strong line with scissors that the homeowners had thoughtfully fetched, she was free from entanglement. But she would have to be taken to the Center for a check-up to insure that she had not damaged her wing. The homeowners pointed out a nest on the top of a

neighboring tall Norfolk pine which they believed was hers. They asked that she be returned so that she could return to her nest. It was clear that we could not return her to her aerie and that the

electric co-op, who often access osprey nests, could not do so using their bucket truck. The height and location in the back yard of a canal front home made that impossible. recuperated to fly back up

there on her own. Fluoroscopic examination back

at the Center disclosed neither a fracture nor a dislocation, but she did show a slight droop to her wing which was caused by the strain of hanging by it. They next morning, we found one consequence of the event; an egg was on the cage floor, cracked from the fall from her perch.

After a day of rest and flight in our flight cage, she was deemed ready to return home. Upon her release, she flew directly to her nest, celebrating with a lot of loud

chirping, proclaiming her safe return. The quick thinking of the residents probably saved this bird's wing, and enabled the resulting successful release.

#### And This Too....

Caloosa Cove Resort on Lower Matecumbe is named for its picturesque oceanfront cove. Like most coves in the Keys, it is shallow and filled with soft sediments of silt and sand with patches of sea grass.

This cove was unique because one of its usual wading birds was a great white heron with a broken wing and about which we received a call for a rescue.

It was standing just offshore, as it had been for the past few days. Upon the approach of our rescuer, it Continued on page 14...



...continued from page 10. started walking away while the rescuer became mired in everdeeper muck. The heron's bia feet let it walk on the muck outpacing the mired rescuer.

With a borrowed kayak, the rescuer resumed the pursuit into the cove. The going was good except for the intervening patches of shallower sea grass that were too shallow for paddling an occupied kayak. There was too little water and too much muck, especially on the outgoing tide. The rescue was rescheduled until the water returned with the tide. In the late afternoon, using our

rescue canoe, staff members returned and out-paddled the non-flighted heron and completed the rescue.

Sadly, the heron did not survive the night, succumbing from emaciation and loss of blood, of which there was a lot in the canoe. Regrettably, we can not save every bird, even when the rescue has been successful. We cringe when a caller reports that a bird in distress "has been there all weekend"







5. During mid-meal turn to mom and say, "See mom, I told you they wouldn't notice that the turkey was past expiration date. You were worried for nothing."


### Run-a-Way Experiment
