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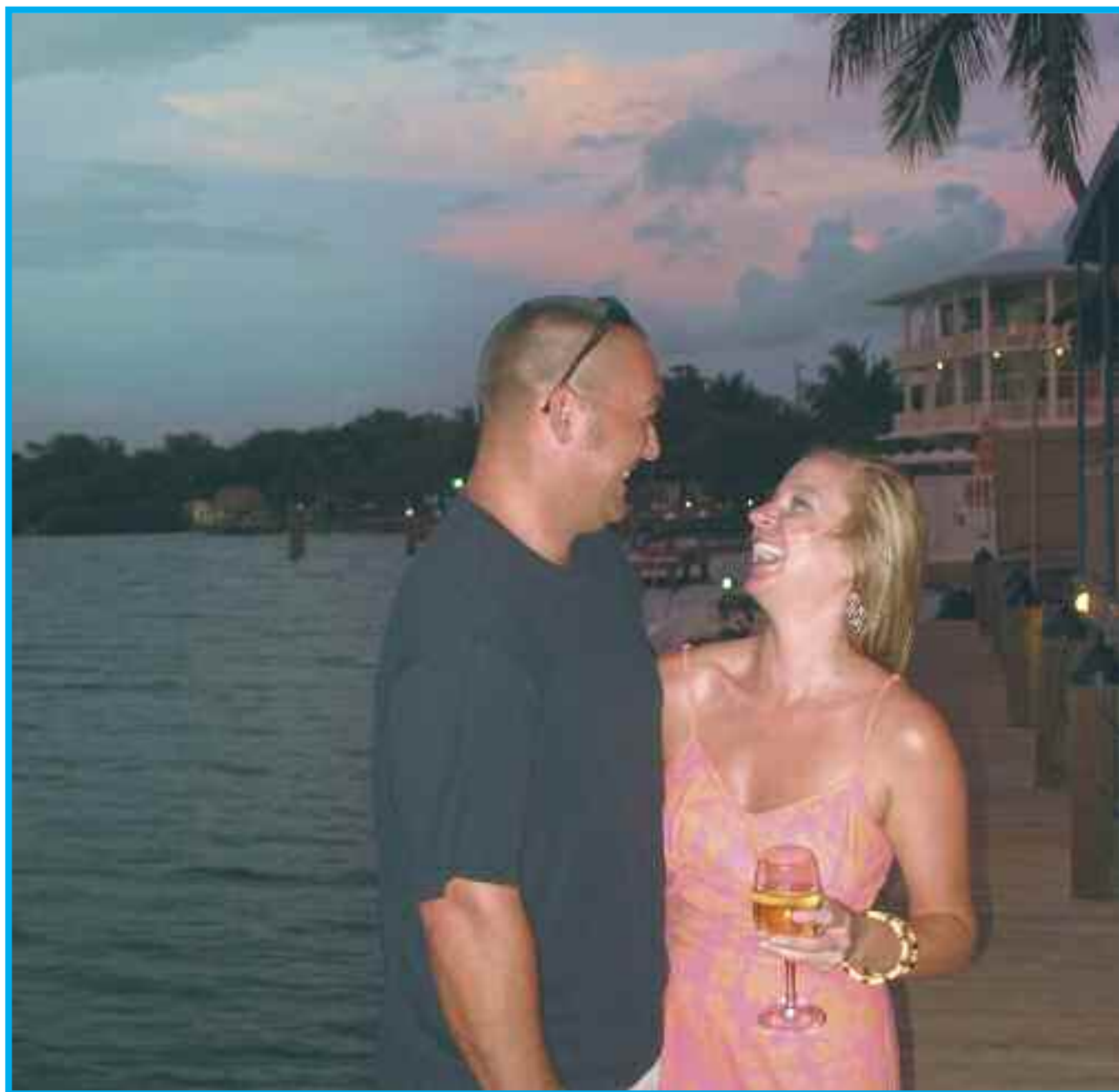

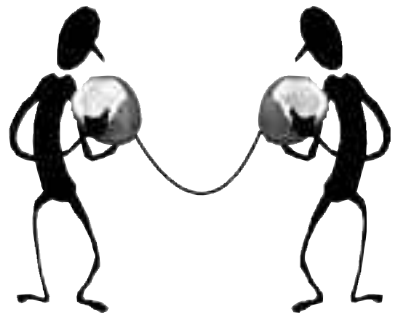

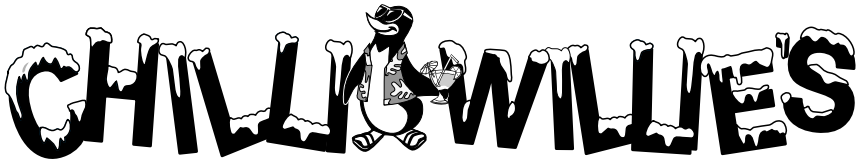
- Plastic bags litter our highways and waterways. They breakdown into tiny toxic particles that

Island Grill Tournament Nets \$5,000 for Team Bodacious

Team Bodacious took home a Pasta Pantaleo print, and a check for \$5,000.00 on Saturday June 19th in the 6th Annual Island Grill Charity Dolphin Tournament, sponsored by Mercedes-Benz of Cutler Bay and Tavernier Creek Marina. The tournament raises money for the Baptist Children's Hospital Cancer Center. With Henry Danzig from Tavernier, FL at the helm, friends Tim Hampson of Tavernier and Mark Wheaton from Key Largo, FL teamed up with Mike Thaler from Palmetto, FL. Mike, a representative from Bacardi who was a major sponsor of the event, was quoted as saying "I've just had the best fun fishing ever" The teams combined weight of their three biggest Dolphin totaled 54.8 pounds.

Second place went to team Yank'em with Sue Rielhman and Peter Villiere both from Tavernier, FL, John Lewis from Pompano, FL and Dave Brasher of Weston, FL. The team weighed a total of 46.4 pounds sending them home with a \$1,000.00 check.

also from Acworth, GA and Woody Long from Kennesaw, GA weighed in a total of 39.0 pounds of Dolphin. Jim would weigh the biggest fish of the tournament, a 26.2 pounder.

Tammi Amberg from Naples, FL fishing aboard the TNT weighed the largest fish caught by a female angler at 25.8 pounds. Junior Angler Chase Bertucci from Naples, FL weighed a 10.6 pound fish caught aboard the Game Hunter for the largest fish caught by a Junior Angler. Payton Zeschke landed an 8.6 pound Dolphin putting her in second place junior while fishing on the Sweet & Law. The largest Wahoo was caught by Troy Rodkey from Naples, FL weighing in at 13.8 pounds.

The Island Grill Charity Dolphin Tournament hosted 115 anglers on 38 boats during the 6th Annual event. With an increase in anglers, boats and sponsorship dollars, Jack McCormick and the Island Grill will soon be awarding a very nice check to the Baptist Children's Hospital Cancer Center. Keep Our Birds Flying: Have Your Donation Matched

Recently, Ocean Reef resident Robert Gintel, also Chairman and President of the Florida Keys Wild Bird Center in Tavernier, challenged the Ocean Reef Foundation to help finance a long term solution to the financial and operating problems of one of the most popular and widely supported institutions in the Florida Keys, namely the FKWBC.

The Ocean Reef Foundation picked up the gauntlet and "Phoenix Project," aptly named after the mythological bird reborn from its own ashes, was launched. With the Gintel Family Foundation putting up \$750,000, the Ocean Reef Foundation agreed to seek matching donations from both its own donors and from all other community minded citizens in the Keys and beyond to provide a total \$1.5 million to achieve virtually overnight the completion of the first two phases of the bird center's three phase long term building and development program.

Foundation President John Taylor said, "We strongly encourage all concerned fellow citizens, not just Ocean Reef Members, to join us and participate in this extraordinary matching opportunity to give back to our community and to this common cause, which impacts anyone and everyone who lives or vacations here."

"We are a part of the Upper Keys Community and committed to giving to worthy causes that improve the

quality of life in Key Largo," Taylor says. While people may

their gates in the last three years alone.

According to Gintel, "This latest project also shows how importantly we at Ocean Reef view the Florida Keys Wild Bird Center, not for just the survival of our wild bird

and support of our tourism and many other small businesses that form the very backbone of our cherished and very special way of life down here in the Florida Keys. Nothing has embedded that more strongly into our conscious awareness than the current oil spill crisis."

The genesis of Project Phoenix came six months ago when the bird center was faced with large operating losses, a privately owned and heavily mortgaged property, an inability to retain qualified staffing and maintain facilities and no budget for needed capital expenditures. The Florida Keys Wild Bird Center faced the prospects of becoming an endangered species itself. Fortunately,

the public's response at the time to newspaper publicity and other appeals resulted in a significant influx of ongoing donations while, at the same time, several motivated individuals took on the responsibility of restructuring the Board, and strengthening its management.

In the six months since the community came to its rescue, the Center has risen from the proverbial ashes in the tradition of the fabled Phoenix with a new leadership team, a new veterinary team and a clean, modern medical facility at mile marker 94. The gift shop, educational exhibit and daily 3:30 pm feeding remain at mile marker 93.6 bayside, and continue to draw some 17,000 eco-tourists and locals to enjoy, observe and photograph the resident flock each year.

The Bird Center's new management has developed a three-phase program, which envisions the long-term transformation of the Florida Keys Wild Bird Hospital and Sanctuary into an attractive and rewarding experience and seeks the financial wherewithal to accomplish its goals and objectives.

"If the Phoenix Fund meets its objectives," Gintel elaborates, referring to plans already in the works, "We'll raise \$1.5 million, purchase and preserve the property and be well on our way to renovating and staffing a wild bird rehabilitation facility that is second to none."

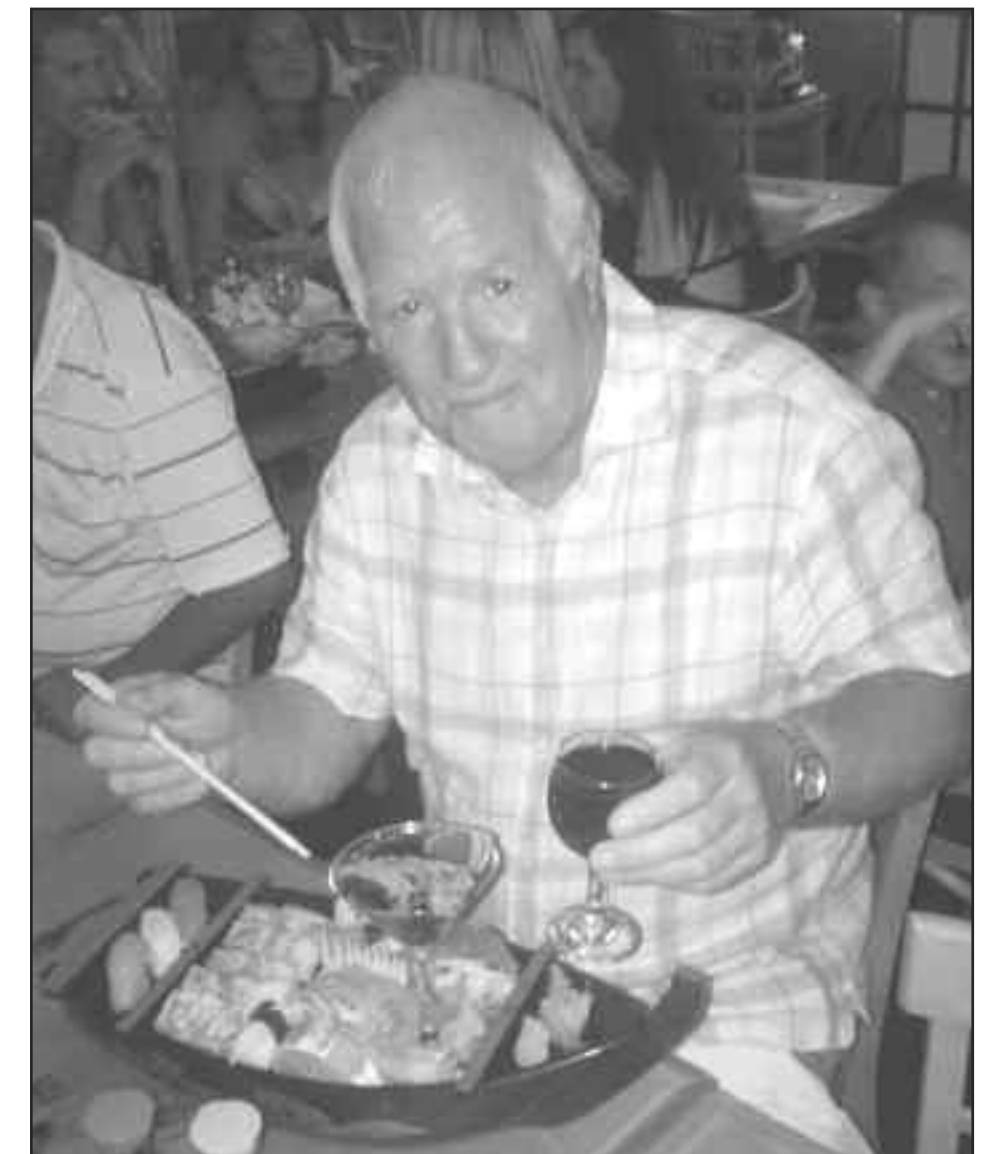

No Hard Edges Creating Space in the Body

When our minds are cluttered with too many thoughts and information, our bodies respond by trying to take action.

Our minds and bodies are interconnected, and the condition of one affects the condition of the other. This is why meditation is such a powerful tool for healing the body, as powerful as physical therapies. When our minds are cluttered with thoughts, information, and plans, our bodies respond by trying to take action. When the body has a clear directive from the mind, it knows what to do, but a cluttered, unfocused mind creates a confused, tense body. Our muscles tighten up, our breath shortens, and we find ourselves feeling constricted without necessarily knowing why.

When we sit down to meditate, we let our bodies know that it is okay to be still and rest. This is a clear directive from the mind, and the body knows exactly how to respond. Thus, at the very beginning, we have created a sense of clarity for the body and the mind. As we move deeper into meditation, the state of our mind reveals

A meditation teacher pointed out that if you put a cow in a small pen, she acts up and pushes against the boundaries, whereas if you provide her with a large, open space, she will peacefully graze in one spot. In the same way, our thoughts settle down peacefully if we provide them with enough space, and our bodies follow suit.

When we settle down to examine and experience our consciousness, we discover that there are no hard, definable edges. It is a vast, open space in which our thoughts can come and go without making waves, as long as we let them by neither attaching to them nor repressing them. As we see our thoughts come and go, we begin to breathe deeper and more easily, finding that our body is more open to the breath as it relaxes along with the mind. In this way, the space we recognize through meditation creates space in our bodies, allowing for a feeling of lightness and rightness with the world.

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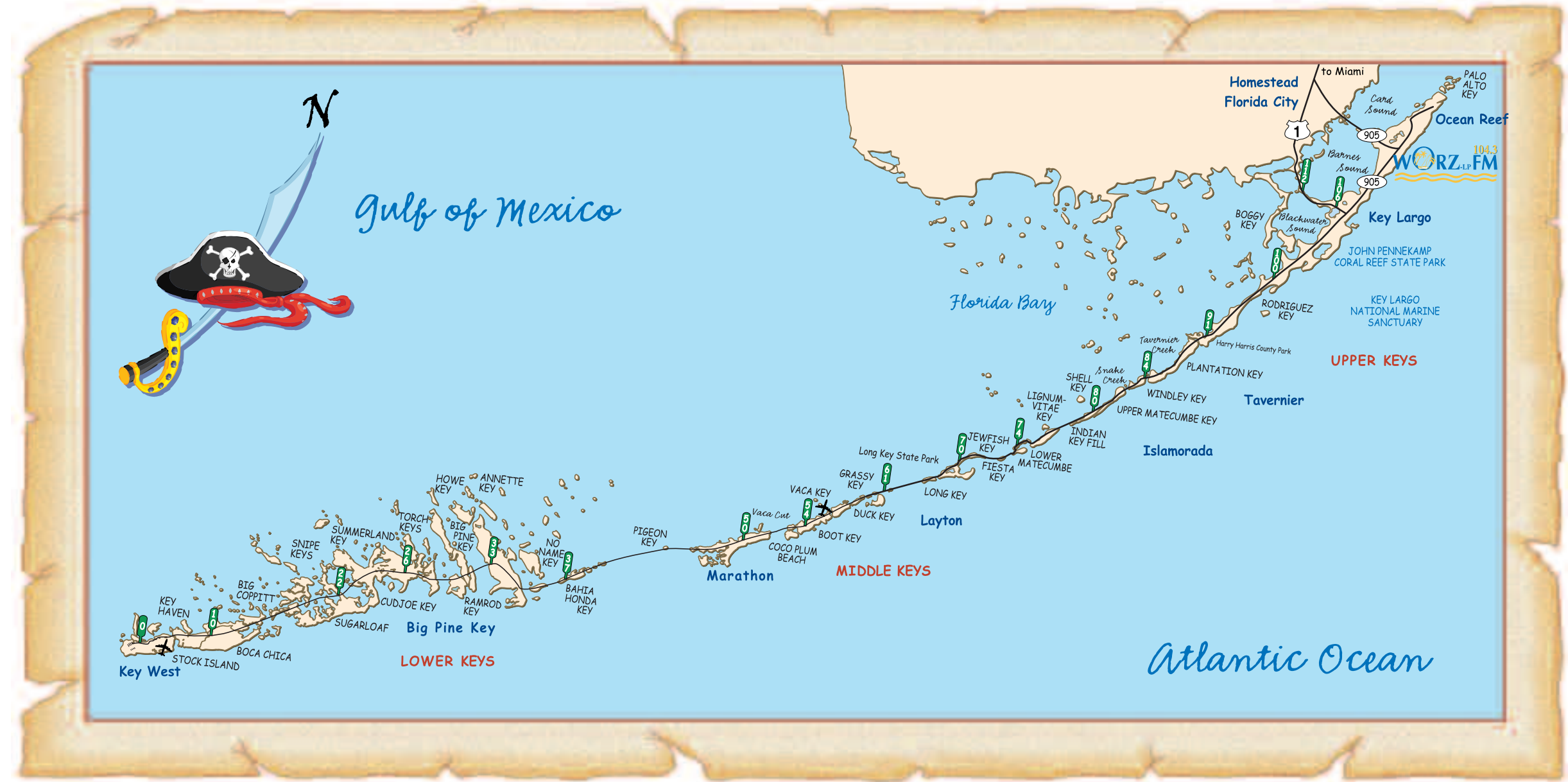

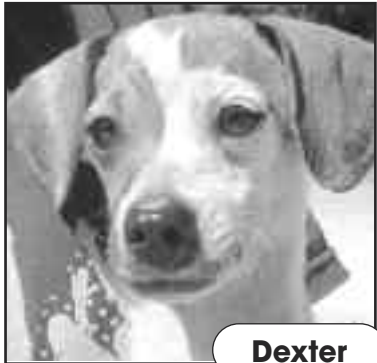

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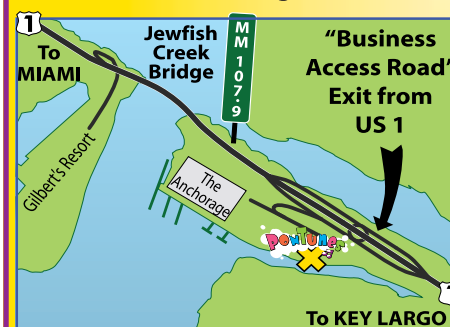
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
