



You are probably thinking that this is a happy ending, well luckily for Dixie it is. Unfortunately Dixie's previous owners have more pets!

## Key Largo Woman Wins Wave National Championship

Leah White of Key Largo, known business-wise as the "Plant Lady," won the 13th Annual Hobie Wave National Championship the weekend of December 3-5 held at Founders Park Watersports at Founders Park in Islamorada, Florida.

When the family first moved here from Germany they were faced with extreme culture shock and spoke very little English. But, in no time at all they were fluent in the language and came to love the Florida Keys.



Team Reel McCoy won the 47th Annual Islamorada Sailfish Tournament releasing a total of 16 Sailfish over the three-day event. Captain George McElveen led anglers Larry Amoyette (Silver Springs, FL), Sean Smith (Ft. Lauderdale, FL), Kiki Ferrer (Islamorada, FL), and Justin Miller (Islamorada, FL) to the winner's circle.

The Reel McCoy team has also won an entry into the 2011 IGFA Offshore World Championship in Cabo San Lucas. The Reel McCoy took the lead on the first day, as mate Lee Gahagen grabbed the leaders, releasing eight Sailfish. The Olympic Gold was hot on their heels with seven releases. # Dive Record Hall of Famer Named Grand Marshal of the 2010 Key Largo Boat Parade

Neal Watson legendary diver and DEMA Hall of Famer is to be the Grand Marshal for this year's boat parade. Watson's achievements are legendary. has been in the industry since 1953 and I have known and admired him for many years," said Spencer Slate Captain of the Grand Marshal Boat.







Start with a large glass measuring cup and measure 1 cup of boiling water. Dissolve 1 envelope of Lime Jell-O (3 oz size) and stir until fully dissolved. Add 1/2 cup of cold water, 1/4 cup of 151 Rum, and 1/4 cup of Cherry Brandy. Stir well and cool before pouring into Jell-o shot cups.

Makes about 16 shots

#### The Coral Reef Concussion

3 cups of boiling water and dissolve 1 package of Orange Jell-o, 1 package of Strawberry Jell-o, and 1 package of Pineapple Jell-o (all the 3 oz size) and stir until fully dissolved. 











