



British Petroleum Oil Spill

Our fragile ecosystem and native wildlife species are now facing a potentially devastating situation. The Florida Keys (located downstream from the oil spill in the Gulf of Mexico) lie where some reports are now suggesting the possibility that oil will reach our coast. However, since we are dealing with wind and weather related uncertainties of Mother Nature, unless the oil actually reaches the current loop in the Gulf there is no way to accurately predict its eventual course.

When a disaster of this magnitude occurs the response is a federal and multi-agency effort. The United States Fish and Wildlife Service http://www.fws.gov is currently working with Tri-State Birds & Rescue Research www.tristatebird.org to

coordinate all facets of oil spill response including wildlife rescue efforts. Tri-State is an organization well known throughout the world to have a tremendous amount of

At this time they have established washing stations in the areas that are in immediate danger, and their infrastructure will progress to other areas and states as



experience dealing with oil spills, oiled wildlife rescue and treatment response since 1976.

The Florida Keys Wild Bird Center greatly appreciates the

calls we are getting from concerned citizens wishing to help. At this time all of us must go through the most difficult part of any concerted effort to save animals: We must be patient and allow the professionals to lead the way. Proper cleaning of oiled wildlife is a difficult task and involves much more than removing the oil that coats bird feathers! The ingestion of oil by birds preening their feathers in a themselves is equally harmful and toxic. Ingestion of oil by a bird can result in ulcers and internal bleeding of the lining of the gastrointestinal tract absorption of water and food by the affected bird's body. follow. 

Dumbing Ourselves Down Wanting to Join

There is a difference between shifting our energy to accommodate people we are around and dumbing ourselves down.

...continued from page 4 often fatal unless treated immediately, and is the first priority when caring for these animals. Only after administering emergency medical care for potential internal damage, do we then begin the tedious process of tackling the removal of oil from the feathers! The external oil removal procedure can take up to 5 experienced workers and 300 gallons of water (at a specific temperature) per bird in order to achieve the desired life-saving results.

Additionally, petroleum contaminated waste water cannot simply go down the drain or into the ground, but must be stored in 55 gallon drums and disposed off properly to comply with federal and state OSHA regulations. To protect volunteer and professional responders, specific safety protocols must be met prior to placing workers in contaminated areas since petroleum products are highly toxic and dangerous to humans as well. The Florida Keys Wild Bird Center is preparing for the worst scenario while praying for the best possible outcome! We are a well established facility

with over 2 decades of experience whose mission is to rescue, rehabilitate and release sick, orphaned and injured native
