



Barbara Gintel loves people, life and the beauty of the world around her. Originally from New York State she majored in art at at the Bennett Junior College in Millbrook where she became the school's photographer. A long-time resident of Key Largo's Ocean Reef Club, Barbara has won many awards for her photography.

The famous photo on this issue's cover is a perfect example of Gintel's creative talent. Just 50 yards past Alabama Jack's Card Sound Restaurant sat an old man and his dog, every day for years just watching the cars go by. One day in 1996 Barb grabbed her camera and took off in search of the old man.

He agreed to allow her to photograph him and like most people sat up straight to pose. She took a couple of shots and turned away as she did not want a posed photo, she wanted a natural one.

The old man relaxed but the dog was looking away at approaching traffic. In order to get the dogs attention Gintel began to growl and bark till the dog looked in her direction and she got the shot she was looking for.

Several years later Gintel gave an exhibition of 67 of her photographs, donating the proceeds to the Ocean Reef Art League who sponsored the event. The Card Sound Man far outsold every other picture in the gallery. You cannot purchase that picture, as it is only available through selected charitable events and it brings in over \$1,000 per copy. ## MMC On Standby to Rescue Marine Mammals from Oil Slick

The Marine Mammal Conservancy (MMC) has been requested by the National Marine Fisheries Service to be on standby for possible deployment to the Gulf of Mexico for a rescue and recovery operation. The oil slick from the recent rig explosion and sinking poses a potentially serious threat to marine wildlife. MMC, in partnership with Dolphins Plus (Key Largo, FL), Dolphins Cove (Key Largo, FL), Ocean Embassy (Orlando, Fl) and the National Marine Fisheries Service; is now marshalling the resources, equipment and personnel required to immediately respond to this disaster.

The Marine Mammal Conservancy (MMC) is an all volunteer nonprofit corporation dependent on the support of the public for operation. Located on a three-acre lot on the Gulf coast of Key Largo, Florida. MMC encourages the public to participate in its efforts to conserve and protect marine mammals and our oceans. The Marine Mammal Conservancy, Inc. is authorized under a Stranding Agreement with the U.S. National Marine Fisheries Service to respond, rescue, transport, and rehabilitate stranded and injured marine mammals under the Marine Mammal Protection Act.

## What Do You Do If You Find A Baby Wildlife

Healthy wild birds and mammals need to be raised by their parents. Humans cannot duplicate, but only approximate, all learning skills baby animals need to get from their parents in order to thrive as adults in their natural habitat.

#### **BIRDS**

Baby birds go through 2 main stages of development before becoming self sufficient juniors:

Nestlings - At this stage baby birds are naked or have some soft feathering, they are immobile and totally depended on adults for survival.

If you find a bird at this stage on the ground, try to locate the nest, and if possible, put the baby back. Despite of what you may have heard, the parents will not reject the baby (Mammals have a keen sense of smell and will not take back a baby that was handled).

**Fledglings** - at this stage the bird will be feathered but has a short tail. It is mobile on ground but not flying yet. It is still being fed and cared for by its

If you find a bird at this stage on the ground - it is normal - all songbirds


jump out of nest at this stage and learn how to fly from the ground up.

Unless the fledgling is injured, wet, cold, not moving, or in a dangerous location, it is best to let the parents finish raising their baby - it is only a short period of time before they fly.

MAMMALS - If found on ground and there is no sign of parents, the baby should be picked up and transferred to the center. (please call the center for farther instruction on the different species of mammals).

If you determined a rescue is needed Place the bird in a box (with breathing hole punched into the side and top) keep it warm and quiet.

Please do not give food or water. Then call Florida Keys Wild Bird Center (305) 852-4486 or bring the animal to the center at 93997 Overseas Hwy, Tavernier, mile marker 94. Ocean Side.
