





Laz Guerrero, widower of Deputy Misty Powers, cancelled the event "Benefit for the family of Deputy Powers".



Florida Keys Wild Bird News: Center Welcomes New Leadership & Gets a New Name

Wild Bird Center Announces Change to Board...

The Florida Keys Wild Bird Center (FKWBC) has announced changes to its Board of Directors.

John Stuart assumes the position of president, previously held by Robert Gintel. Stuart and Gintel are co-chairs of the board. "I'm not in the Keys for four months each year, and the Bird Center is at a juncture where it needs daily hands-on oversight. Therefore, it made sense for me to resign as president and have John, a full-time Tavernier resident, take over." said Gintel.

"The Florida Keys Wild Bird Center is facing a future with many challenges and opportunities. Our Board is made up of dedicated, talented directors who are committed to the center's success. I am honored and humbled to be selected as the president of the Florida Keys Wild Bird Center, "said Stuart.

The Board also has expanded its membership to include Debra Ginsberg, a retired Wall Street executive. Ginsberg has her B.A. in psychology and economics from Vassar College. Keys residents who find injured birds or birds that need rehabilitation can take the birds to the center's hospital at mile marker 94, seven days a week from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. After 5 p.m., residents should call the center at 852-4486. Florida Rebate Offers \$1,500 Back On New Air Conditioners

State Representative Ron Saunders is encouraging homeowners to learn how to receive a Florida ENERGY STAR® Residential HVAC rebate by visiting www.rebates.com/floridahvac.

The rebate program was approved through the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (federal stimulus). The 2009 Florida Legislature approved the legislation allowing the Florida Energy and Climate Commission to apply for the federal grant. The State of Florida received \$17.6 million to establish an ENERGY STAR® appliance rebate program and an additional \$15 million to develop a residential program to increase energy efficiency within the home.

The rebate applies to the purchase of new central air conditioners, air source heat pumps or geothermal heat pump that meet all the requirements of the Florida ENERGY STAR® Residential HVAC Rebate Program. One such requirement is to have

the home duct system tested, indicating that there is no more than 15 percent leakage to the outside.

The rebate will come in the form of an American Express Prepaid Card preloaded with the value of rebate determined by processor. The American Express Prepaid card is issued by American Express and is able to be used at merchants and retailers in the United States that accept the American Express Card; however, it cannot be used at cruise lines, casinos. ATMs, or for recurring charges (such as monthly utilities or subscriptions). The program runs until Dec. 31 - or until the \$15 million runs out.

To qualify, homeowners must have their home air ducts tested, and there must be minimal leakage to the outdoors.

Tribute to Deputies Lost in the Line of Duty

According to the Washington, D.C. based National Law Enforcement Officers Memorial Fund (NLEOMF) the number of law enforcement officers who died in the line of duty last year was the lowest in 50 years. Traffic accidents claimed 56 officers' lives last year, a figure down 21% from the previous year.

Craig Floyd, chairman and CEO of the NLEOMF, attributes driver training for officers for the reduced numbers in law enforcement deaths in traffic fatalities.

"If you look at the last 12 years, more officers have been killed in traffic-related incidents than have been shot and killed or any other cause of death, and that's certainly a troubling trend that we've been concerned about for some time now."

According the MCSO website the last five officers killed in Monroe County since 1989 were due to traffic accidents. Here is a history of the loss of our deputies.



Deputy Melissa Powers, Lost June 22, 2010

Deputy Melissa "Missy" Powers, 36, was killed in the line of duty in a traffic accident which took place at 10:20 p.m. on June 22, 2010 while responding to a call.

Deputy Powers is survived by two children and her husband, who is a Detective with the Homestead Police.

Deputy Powers was hired by the Monroe County Sheriff's Office in December of 2006 as a road patrol deputy working in the city of Marathon. In February of 2010, she transferred to road patrol in the Key Largo area. Prior to working for the Sheriff's Office, she worked for the Florida Department of Corrections.



Deputy Nick Pham Lost November 26, 2008

Monroe County Sheriff's Deputy Nick Pham was killed in the line of duty on November 26, 2008 in a traffic accident. Deputy Pham was on traffic patrol, when his patrol car collided with a semi-tractor trailer truck at the 62 mile marker of highway U.S. One at 12:20 p.m.

Deputy Pham worked for the Sheriff's Office since he was hired on September 15, 2004. He was initially assigned to road patrol in the upper Keys in Sector 7 – the Key Largo area. In July of 2006, he transferred to the Traffic Enforcement Division. He leaves a wife, Jackey, and children who live in Homestead. Deputy Pham worked for Florida City Police and the Dade Correctional Institution prior to working for the Monroe County Sheriff's Office.



Deputy Robin Tanner Lost December 13, 2007

Monroe County Sheriff's Deputy Robin Tanner was killed at 7 a.m. December 13, 2007 in a single vehicle automobile accident as she was responding, on duty, to a medical call. She was responding to a report of a woman not breathing in the vicinity of 119th Street in Marathon. The single vehicle accident took place near 90th Street. She was rushed to Fisherman's Hospital where she was declared deceased a short time later.

Deputy Tanner was assigned to the Marathon area as a patrol officer. She was 47 years old when she passed.

She first came to work for the Sheriff's Office in January of 1987 as a Records Clerk. She attended the Law Enforcement Academy at Florida Keys Community College's Institute of Criminal Justice in 1988 and shortly thereafter became a patrol officer. She worked in the lower Keys until she resigned in June of 1991. She returned to work for the Sheriff's Office in June of 2004 and worked in the middle Keys as a patrol officer until her death.



Deputy Michael Alexander Lost in 1998

Deputy Michael Alexander died in a traffic accident May 3rd, 1998 while on duty working for the Monroe County Sheriff's Office.

He had just left roll call at the Plantation Key Substation and was en route to his duty station at the Ocean Reef Resort. For some reason, he had pulled off of the highway and onto Val Jean Way, in Tavernier. He was stopped at a stop sign at Val Jean Way and Highway U.S. One when he pulled out into the path on an oncoming semi tractor trailer truck, and was broad sided on the driver's side by the truck.

Deputy Alexander has worked for the Monroe County Sheriff's Office for just less than a year. He worked on the midnight shift as a deputy at the Ocean Reef Club in Key Largo. He was also on the Monroe County Sheriff's Office Special Weapons and Tactics (SWAT) team.

Prior to working in the Florida Keys, Deputy Alexander worked for the Miami-Dade Police Department for 16 years. He left that department as a Lieutenant. Deputy Alexander is survived by his wife, Stella, and their two children.



Deputy David J. Cormier Lost in1989

David J. Cormier, a reserve deputy for the Monroe County Sheriff's Office, died November 19, 1989, from injuries he received when the patrol car he was riding in collided with a pick-up truck.

The collision occurred about 10:55 p.m., on U.S. Highway 1 on Plantation Key at Mile Marker 87.5. Deputy Joseph Ferraro and Reserve Deputy Cormier were responding to a back-up call from another deputy. Patrick Walter from Davie, Florida, had just left the parking lot of the Islamorada Inn in his 1973 Chevrolet pick-up truck when, according to the Florida Highway Patrol, he "failed to yield the right of way" to the patrol car, which had blue and red lights flashing. Deputy Ferraro swerved to the left in an attempt to avoid the accident, but collided with the left side of the pick-up truck. Deputy Ferraro sustained head and neck injuries and was transported to Baptist Hospital and has since made a full recovery. 



Artist of the Month Walter Kanzler

In the world of firearms and military collectors items, Walter Kanzler is one of the elite. There are only a few people in the U.S.A. that do what he does and he is one of the most respected in the world

It all started in 1954 when a gun collector friend of his father needed help watching his table at a gun show in New Jersey. A young Walter volunteered for what was to be his first gun show. He was immediately hooked.

Kanzler is of German nationality, born and raised in Elizabeth, New Jersey. He has dual citizenship and travels to Germany four or more times a year to attend arms fairs, where he buys and sells antique guns and military items. His area of expertise is in European Antique Firearms and Military Collectibles from the 1500s to the 1950s. He also has knowledge of U.S. Firearms and Collectibles from the 1700s through the Civil War era and on thru to WWI & II to the present. His collection of antique collectibles and Holocaust items is vast, and if he doesn't have it, chances are he can get it for you. Each piece is a unique part of history and has a story to tell.

In New Jersey, Kanzler owned and operated several collector firearms and militaria shops. An avid motorcyclist and waverunner enthusiast, he came to Key Largo in the late 1980s and fell in love with the climate. Today his main focus is selling collectibles to people all over the world. His calendar is full

of trips he plans to take, up to four a month, to shows of historical guns and military items. Walter also provides appraisals and handles estate sales.

Kanzler's credentials and qualifications include Federally Licensed Firearm Dealer since 1961, Firearms Export Licenses, Endowment Life Member National Rifle Association, Charter Member the Max show, Charter Member CADA - Collectors Arms Dealers Association, Life Member Ohio Gun Collectors Association. Life Member of the Delaware Arms Collectors Association, Life Member Military Collectors Society of Florida, Life Member Ohio Valley Military Society, Member Pennsylvania Gun Collectors Association, Member Tulsa Arms Collectors Association, Mitglieder Bund Deutscher Orden Sammler (German Medals and Orders Collectors Society), Mitglieder Verband fuer Waffentechnik und geschichte e. V. (German Gun Collectors Society).

It is hard to believe that last year Kanzler celebrated his 70th birthday. His appearance is that of a much younger man. A private party was thrown at the Fish House Encore and colleagues from all over the U.S. and Europe attended. That is indeed a tribute to their respect for Kanzler's knowledge and integrity.


Dear Dumb People,
