





All along the highway there are snorkel and dive shops, pick one, they all go to the reef. We like Sundiver Station because they are friendly and dependable. If you don't want to get wet, we recommend a trip on the Key Largo Princess Glass Bottom Boat (see page 12 for coupon). Food and drinks are available and you can kick back and relax while the narrator describes the different coral and sea life. It is educational as well and fun for the whole

If you only have a couple of hours the next best thing in the Keys is our fabulous fresh seafood. In this newspaper you will find only the very best restaurants in the Upper Keys. These restaurant owners buy

the seafood fresh from the fishermen. After tasting fresh fish, lobster and crab you will swear off the frozen forever.

There are no public sandy beaches in Key Largo. The closest is Anne's Beach MM 73.8. If you are short on time Gilbert's Resort at MM 108 has a beach and they welcome visitors but coolers are not allowed. You are welcome to enjoy the beach and pool but food and drinks must be purchased at the tiki bar or inside the air conditioned restaurant. Boat and waverunner rentals are also available. And you can always just sit back and enjoy the live local entertainment and watch the boats come and go.

Changing your itinerary and deciding to stay longer is HIGHLY recommended. Gilbert's has reasonable motel rates with views of the water. Please enjoy your stay and come back often.

Entertainer of the Month Mike Mitzner at Sharkey's Pub

The great Yogi Berra once said "This is like deja vu all over Entertainer's of the Month. They both later went on to play again!" No, your eyes are not playing tricks on you. Mike Mitzner is the only musician in the history of the Coconut Telegraph to ever be featured as Entertainer of the Month three times.

The musical phenomenon was first featured in the April 2008 issue (see the conchtele graph.com archives for the original story) as one half of the extraordinary duo Mike and Drein Drein Vernon was Mike's partner, girlfriend and best friend. Together they were one of the most sought after singing sensations to ever rock the Keys. They even produced a CD together called "Live, Loud, and Proud" which was recorded live at the Caribbean Club.

We are very sad to say that shortly after the article appeared in the Coconut Telegraph Drein, then age 43, passed away in her sleep. While all the Conch Republic mourned Mitzner was devastated. Most people

would have crawled into their shell, but he grabbed his guitar and sat in with any entertainer who would let him.

"Music is my therapy. It's my balance," explains Mitzner. "When life starts to spiral out of control music pulls me back and keeps me grounded. Life goes on."



New Website Lists Non-Profit Needs





Wild Bird Center Rescues and Releases Two Hawks

Two female immature Broad-Winged Hawks were recently returned to the wild after a bit of help from the Florida Keys Wild Bird Center. The first hawk was rescued by a visiting family aboard one of Captain Sterling's Everglades Tours on December 21. While the tourgroup was traveling through Adams Cut, the water-logged bird was spotted floating and trapped in a cave-like crevice in the canal. "One of the kids spotted the hawk first," Says Captain Dave Eaton, who was heading the eco-tour that day. "It was incredibly camouflagedeven looking directly at the bird it was hard to spot. I was amazed he noticed it at all."

Captain Eaton eased the boat towards the crevice. Then the teenager volunteered to lay down on the boat deck and reached for the bird with a towel. He scooped it up in a bundle and the boat headed back for Sundowner's. They called the bird in to the FKWBC's emergency hotline; staff retrieved her and rushed her to the hospital where she was slowly warmed by a heatlight and then re-hydrated.

"She was in advanced hypothermia." comments Lela Larned, FKWBC's Director. "If they hadn't scooped her up she



from the trauma. She was treated for shock and emaciation. Initially separated in the Hospital's ICU, each of the hawks re-gained over 10% of their body weight on a diet including mice, quail, chicks, and vitamins. About a week later they were advanced to prerelease caging for flight conditioning, where they recovered together.

Broad-Winged Hawks summer and breed throughout the Eastern United States and into Canada but the majority of the population heads for warmer wintering grounds on a migratory path that leads down to Central and South America via Mexico during the early Fall. A fraction of Broad Wings, particularly Juveniles, winter in South Florida, especially in the

Keys, much like when we meet tourists, it's a lot of fun to imagine where they are from. These birds can actually be from as far away as Thunder Bay Canada, Detroit, or Maine," comments Larned. Artist of the Month Omar Perez Web Designer



Born in Texas but having spent most of his time in Miami, Web designer Omar Perez was originally a reporter and editor for various daily and weekly newspapers in South Florida. He made the shift to Web design in the early 2000s. He ran an online music magazine with the help of a friend from England who served as Webmaster. Eventually, the bloke found a day job and had little time to devote to the aspiring site. That's when Perez started dabbling with the Web.

"I just learned from trial and error," he says. "I'd sit behind computer code and manipulate it to see what happened. I still learn something new every day; the Web continues to evolve."

He continued to write and edit during the day, but moonlighted creating Web sites. Eventually, the newspaper where he was

assistant editor (the nowdefunct Upper Keys Times) closed, leaving him with few choices for staying in the Keys. Luckily, he picked up enough clients during the first couple of years that he was able to go at it on his own. Today he maintains Keys Web sites that run the gamut, from marinas to charter captains to several nonprofit organizations.

While no longer a resident of the Keys (Perez lived in Key Largo for 7 years, but continues to visit regularly), he still runs Keys clients' sites from Lake Mary, near Orlando. "There's very little that you cannot do over the phone or email," he says.

People are sometimes surprised at both the complexity and ease of creating a site. Sometimes what looks simple may require complex code, and what appears complex is just a few
