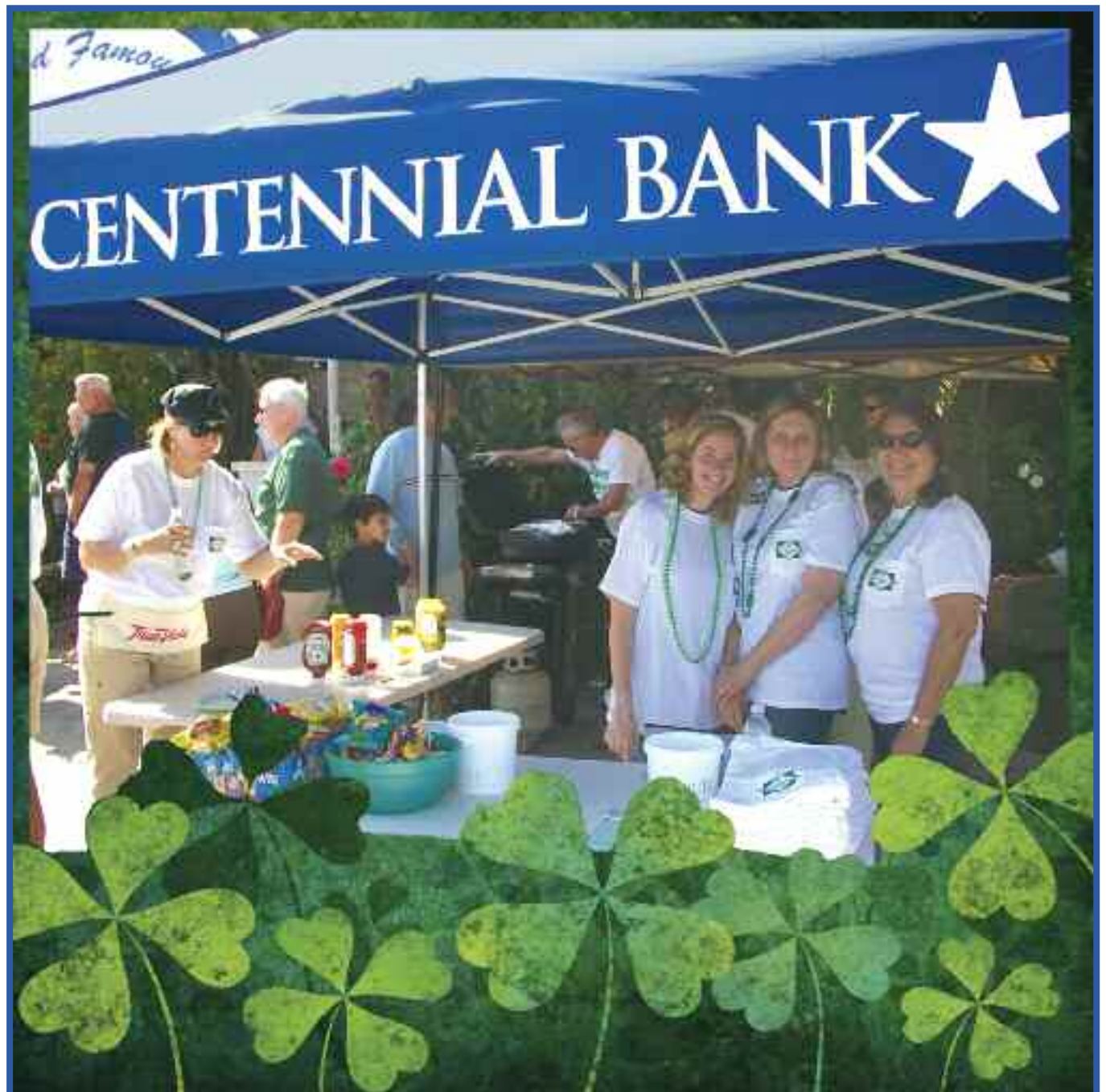

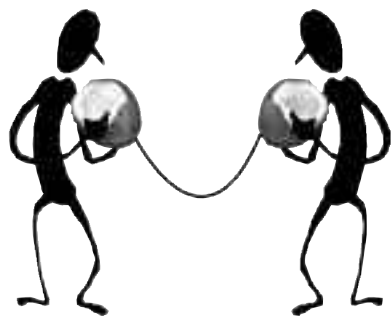

Editorial: Advice for Tourists and Day-trippers

Before the new Jewfish Creek Bridge was built I owned a visitor center located at Gilbert's Resort. The purpose of that type of business is to book hotel rooms and water sports including fishing trips, snorkeling, waverunner rentals, glass bottom boat trips, and more. While there I heard some of the frustrating tourist questions all locals have been asked. Question like: "We only have 2 hours, what can we see and do in the Keys?" or "We brought a cooler, where is the beach?" The worst one was "Can we walk to the reef?" So here is some information and advice for people visiting our beautiful Florida Keys...

The Florida Keys are famous for our Coral Reef State Park. Nowhere else in the continental U.S. can you see live coral. It is hard to describe the incredible beauty. Since it is a state park the fish are

protected and they seem to know it. If you have only one day in the Keys this is a must see. But you have to get on a boat because it is four miles of shore out in the ocean.

All along the highway there are snorkel and dive shops, pick one, they all go to the reef. We like Sundiver Station because they are friendly and dependable. If you don't want to get wet, we recommend a trip on the Key Largo Princess Glass Bottom Boat (see page 12 for coupon). Food and drinks are available and you can kick back and relax while the narrator describes the different coral and sea life. It is educational as well and fun for the whole family.

If you only have a couple of hours the next best thing in the Keys is our fabulous fresh seafood. In this newspaper you will find only the very best restaurants in the Upper Keys. These restaurant owners buy

the seafood fresh from the fishermen. After tasting fresh fish, lobster and crab you will swear off the frozen forever.

There are no public sandy beaches in Key Largo. The closest is Anne's Beach MM 73.8. If you are short on time Gilbert's Resort at MM 108 has a beach and they welcome visitors but coolers are not allowed. You are welcome to enjoy the beach and pool but food and drinks must be purchased at the tiki bar or inside the air conditioned restaurant. Boat and waverunner rentals are also available. And you can always just sit back and enjoy the live local entertainment and watch the boats come and go.

Changing your itinerary and deciding to stay longer is HIGHLY recommended. Gilbert's has reasonable motel rates with views of the water. Please enjoy your stay and come back often.

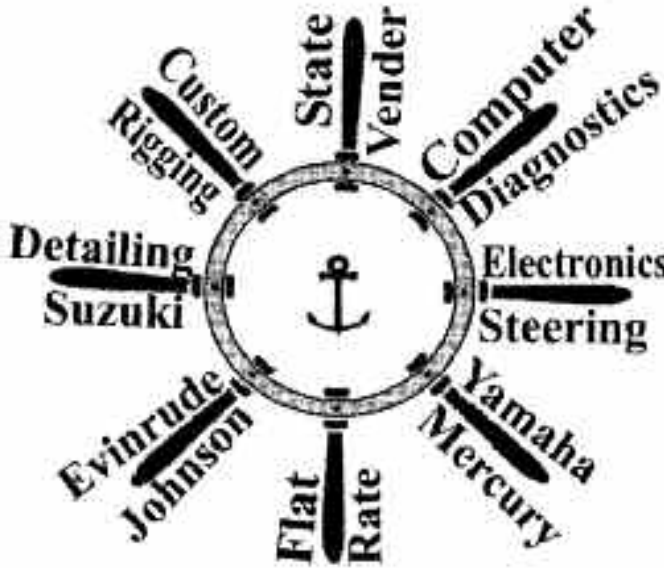

New Website Lists Non-Profit Needs

A non-profit in the Keys needs patio furniture. Another is looking for frozen corn. And a third could use paper towels. In fact, local non-profit groups have a laundry list of many common items they need, some on a regular basis. At the same time, many local residents have these very things, some of them destined for the trash, but don't know where or to whom to donate them.

Now a new local website has been launched that seeks to match what people might have in storage with what non-profit groups require. The site, Keysreuse.com, lists nearly 200 different things from household cleaning products and office supplies to appliances that cash-strapped groups require. Much of this stuff might be in storage closets, lying unused in drawers, or even in trash bins waiting for pickup.

According to Marathon resident Michael Welber,

who created the website, even people who recycle forget that reuse is a great way to reduce our trash.

"Whether you have old sheets and towels or a discarded computer monitor, a musical instrument your child no longer plays or a bulletin board stored in a box somewhere, there's probably a non-profit group in the Keys that can put it to good use," he says. "Keysreuse.com ensures that your possessions will now be reused and not end up in the landfill or incinerated. Plus, it's a great way to help these organizations during tough times."

Keysreuse.com is updated on a regular basis as additional non-profits are added or those items that are listed are no longer needed. Currently 23 non-profits from all parts of the Keys are listed.

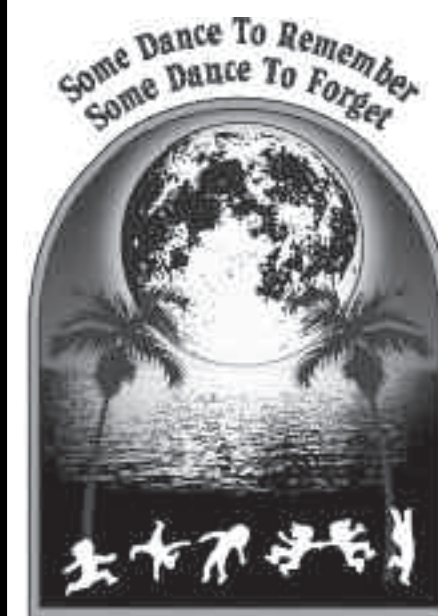

Wild Bird Center Rescues and Releases Two Hawks

Two female immature Broad-Winged Hawks were recently returned to the wild after a bit of help from the Florida Keys Wild Bird Center. The first hawk was rescued by a visiting family aboard one of Captain Sterling's Everglades Tours on December 21. While the tour-group was traveling through Adams Cut, the water-logged bird was spotted floating and trapped in a cave-like crevice in the canal. "One of the kids spotted the hawk first," Says Captain Dave Eaton, who was heading the eco-tour that day. "It was incredibly camouflaged-even looking directly at the bird it was hard to spot. I was amazed he noticed it at all."

Captain Eaton eased the boat towards the crevice. Then the teenager volunteered to lay down on the boat deck and reached for the bird with a towel. He scooped it up in a bundle and the boat headed back for Sundowner's. They called the bird in to the FKWBC's emergency hotline; staff retrieved her and rushed her to the hospital where she was slowly warmed by a heat-light and then re-hydrated.

"She was in advanced hypothermia," comments Lela Larned, FKWBC's Director. "If they hadn't scooped her up she

would have died within the hour. We could tell she was rescued gently because she didn't inhale



any water during the rescue, so important for her recovery." The second Broad-Winged

Hawk was clipped by a car on the Overseas Highway on December 22 and dropped off

from the trauma. She was treated for shock and emaciation. Initially separated in the Hospital's ICU, each of the hawks re-gained over 10% of their body weight on a diet including mice, quail, chicks, and vitamins. About a week later they were advanced to pre-release caging for flight conditioning, where they recovered together.

Broad-Winged Hawks summer and breed throughout the Eastern United States and into Canada but the majority of the population heads for warmer wintering grounds on a migratory path that leads down to Central and South America via Mexico during the early Fall. A fraction of Broad Wings, particularly Juveniles, winter in South Florida, especially in the Florida Keys.

"When you spot birds in the Keys, much like when we meet tourists, it's a lot of fun to imagine where they are from. These birds can actually be from as far away as Thunder Bay Canada, Detroit, or Maine," comments Larned. "You start to truly appreciate how pivotal Keys habitat is to sustaining wildlife populations that we actually share with the rest of North America."

Beyond Behavior Defense Mechanisms

Defense mechanism behaviors that have worked for you in the past may not fit you anymore and need to change.

We all have defense mechanisms that we've developed over time, often without being aware of it. In times of trouble, the behaviors that have worked to get us past challenges with the least amount of pain are the ones that we repeat; even when part of us knows they no longer work. Knowing that we are one with the energy of the universe allows us release any need for defense. Trusting that power, we know that we are exactly where we are meant to be, and that challenges bring gifts of growth and experience. When we can put down arms raised in defense, then we are free to use our hands, minds, hearts and spirits to mold and shape our abundant energy to create and live our lives.

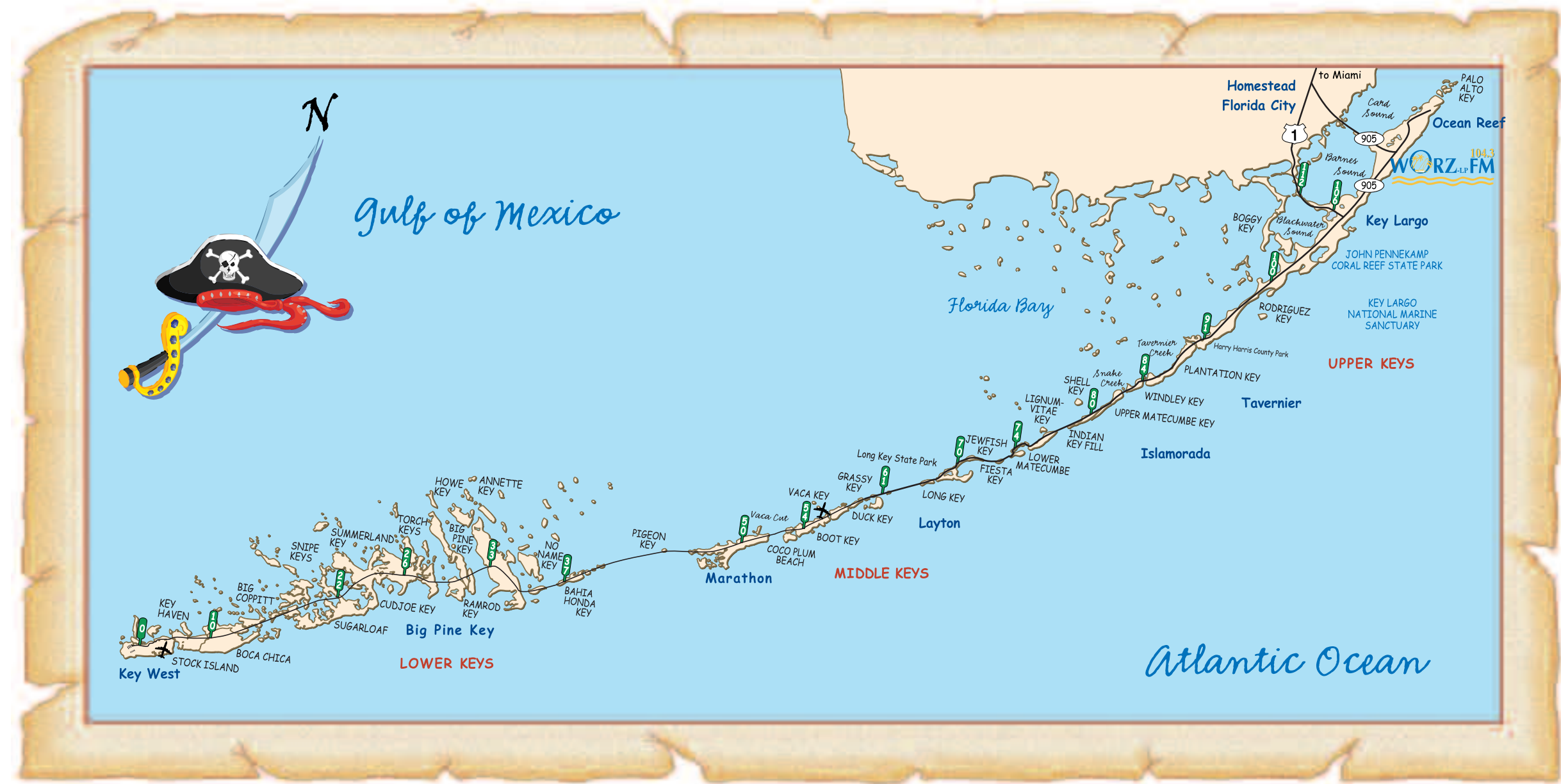

Artist of the Month Omar Perez Web Designer



Born in Texas but having spent most of his time in Miami, Web designer Omar Perez was originally a reporter and editor for various daily and weekly newspapers in South Florida. He made the shift to Web design in the early 2000s. He ran an online music magazine with the help of a friend from England who served as Webmaster. Eventually, the bloke found a day job and had little time to devote to the aspiring site. That's when Perez started dabbling with the Web.

"I just learned from trial and error," he says. "I'd sit behind computer code and manipulate it to see what happened. I still learn something new every day; the Web continues to evolve."

He continued to write and edit during the day, but moonlighted creating Web sites. Eventually, the newspaper where he was

assistant editor (the now-defunct Upper Keys Times) closed, leaving him with few choices for staying in the Keys. Luckily, he picked up enough clients during the first couple of years that he was able to go at it on his own. Today he maintains Keys Web sites that run the gamut, from marinas to charter captains to several nonprofit organizations.

While no longer a resident of the Keys (Perez lived in Key Largo for 7 years, but continues to visit regularly), he still runs Keys clients' sites from Lake Mary, near Orlando. "There's very little that you cannot do over the phone or email," he says.

People are sometimes surprised at both the complexity and ease of creating a site. Sometimes what looks simple may require complex code, and what appears complex is just a few

clicks of work. "Web design is different from graphic design. There are some similar elements, but with the Web, for example, you have to create visuals that download fast, can be read by the various browsers (Internet, Mozilla), and can be picked up by the various search engines (Yahoo, Google)."

"Once there might have been a stipulation that if you build a Web site, they'll come. Truth is that it was never like that. It always

took time and resources to promote a Web site."

The advent of social media sites have definitely helped, but he says it's important to pay attention to one's business or personal Web site.

"On Facebook or on similar sites, you can't really have your own identity; all pages are cookie cutter. With your own site, you can stand out," he says.

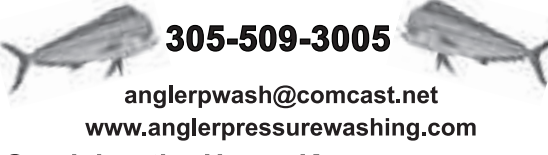
