



Thank you Claudia Moriarty for all you do to make the world a better and prettier place.




Biking for Charity





27th Annual Key Largo Steeplechase

In December, based out of Gilbert's Marina, catamaran sailors came from all around the United States and Canada to sail the 110-mile trek around the Upper Keys on high-tech, lightweight, high-speed beach catamarans.

The race began in Barnes Sounds, where the sailors headed north to Angelfish Creek, then down Hawk Channel with spinnakers flying to a first-day finish on Lower Matecumbe Key, a 70-mile jount. The first boat finished in just under four hours, averaging almost 18 mph, with top speeds over 30 mph.

Miamians Brett Moss and John Casey teamed up for the second year on a Marstrom 20 to win all the honors, both line honors and handicap, of the 2011 event. This was their second such victory in a row. Mike Phillips and Kenny Pierce, also from Miami, shadowed the leaders both days, but had to settle for second overall. They are previous winners of the event.

The race is not for the faint hearted. A complementary bottle of champagne is awarded to every one that simply makes the

entire distance and finishes. This year the event was not without problems for several of the boats. One team capsized in Hawk Channel and the skipper was separated from the boat with the crew unable to get back to pick him up. The crew notified the U.S. Coast Guard who arranged for Sea Tow to pick up the stranded sailor, unite him with his boat and crew, and go on to finish the race. Another incident happened at Card Sound Bridge when one of the boats decided to go under the bridge closer to the land to save some time, instead of the middle of the bridge, where it is highest. The mast hit the bridge and down it came.

This famous race, known around the world by catamaran sailors, was founded and is still managed by local Rick White and his wife Mary Wells. Rick has won the event a several times, but now prefers to



Bartender of the Month Ed Carboni

Pilot House



Ed Carboni has been featured in the Coconut Telegraph before as Artist of the Month for his writing, and as you read more about him you'll discover that he would most definitely be featured again if this paper had a "Traveler of the Month" category. His life has taken him on many adventures and now has him at home. bartending at the Pilot House.

In addition to being a bartender, Carboni is a world traveler licensed Merchant Marine Officer, and an avid scuba diver. He was born and raised in Philadelphia, where he graduated from Holy Family College. Carboni's extensive travels have allowed him the privilege of seeing every continent on earth with the exception of Antarctica.

During his travels a few misadventures have occurred, including an ill-advised midnight encounter with an African bull elephant in Kenya, a not-quite-as-planned shark feeding in the Bahamas, and a

search-and-recovery operation in the Caribbean for a tall ship's anchor in 100 feet of water with no visibility where a moray eel looked just like a length of chain. In Ireland, he was once presumed dead!

In 2001, Carboni found work on the Miami based liveaboard dive vessel. Sea Fever. as a deck hand/Dive Master. Over the course of three years cruising the Bahamas he worked as engineer, first mate and eventually earned his 100ton Merchant Marine captain's license. Also during that time he had the opportunity to log over 700 dives, taking him over the 1,000-dive mark. After leaving the Sea Fever in 2004, he worked as cook/emergency diver on the sail training tall ship, Concordia while it circumnavigated the globe. During that time he singlehandedly prepared over two hundred meals daily, helped the crew work the sails in occasional gale force winds

Sharing with Your Neighbors



2. To educate the public about the importance of our migratory and resident wild bird populations to the Florida Keys and to the Everglades.


