Trash or Treasure? How do you determine the value of a coin?

The Sentimental Value of a coin is priceless if it was a cherished gift from a loved one that you wear around your neck close to your heart.

The Numerical Value is face value. The numerical value of penny is one cent.

The Perceived Value - A novice may wishfully think their 1965 penny is worth a fortune because it is old, but in fact may be only worth its numerical value.

The Intrinsic Value or "bullion" is the scrap value of the metal used to make it.

The Numismatic Value - Coins that are valued due to either rareness or condition, or a combination of both, are considered numismatic coins. Most modern coins have no intrinsic value.

A coin collector is someone who has the knowledge to purchase coins as an investment.

A coin hoarder is someone who has no knowledge of value yet purchases coins because they are shiny and pretty and doesn't care that they are a poor investment. value and leave the really

If you are interested in buying or selling coins you need to connect with an expert. Locally I know only three that I would trust.

it is best to stay away from collectable coins," says Albright, "bullion is preferable." he adds.

All US pennies have inscribed on them "In God We Trust".

All three coin dealers agree that the Home Shopping Network is the worst place to buy coins for investment. If you think about the high cost of television media, thousands of dollars per minute, you realize that they have to make an enormous profit. Unless the coins are gold or silver there is no intrinsic value. "Most people who buy currency from television will not live long

enough to see a return on their investment" says Wiggins. Most are just cheap baubles. You also should not trust companies that run expensive commercials offering you high prices to sell to them.

What about selling coins on Ebay? Of course you can, if you have: an Ebay account, bank account, Pay Pal account or if you accept credit cards for payment... plus the knowledge of a true collector, the time to

spend on the computer researching, photographing and categorizing each coin, and you realize you have to pay Ebay 11% or more plus the listing fee, take the time to insure, pack and drive to the Post Office to mail your coin. That's a full time job!

Coin collecting can be very rewarding, as with antiques. Sometimes the joy is not so much in the value of the item as it is in the find.
