



February brings the end of yet another great football season. This year's Super Bowl will be held in the exciting city of New Orleans and as always we hope that it will live up to the hyped expectations. For many, game day food is as important as the game itself, and everyone has their favorites. The following recipes have become standard fare at our house for the big game. Double or triple the recipes depending on the size of your gathering. Serve with an assortment of condiments. Sit back and enjoy the game with family, friends, and fellow boaters!

Deviled Eggs

12 eggs (makes 24 deviled eggs)
1/4 cup mayonnaise
1 tablespoon Dijon mustard
1/4 cup finely chopped
sweet onion
2 tablespoons sweet relish
(squeeze out the liquid)
1/4 cup finely chopped celery

salt and pepper to liking



Let eggs sit at room temperature for half an hour. Place water and eggs in a saucepan and bring to a boil. Boil for 5 minutes. Remove pan from the burner and keep eggs in the pan with the water for another 4 minutes. Remove the eggs from the pan and let cool. Peal the shells from the eggs and slice each egg in half. Carefully scoop out the yolks and place in a bowl. Mash the yolks with a fork until smooth. Add the mayonnaise and mustard blending until creamy. Add the onion, relish, and celery mixing well. Add the salt, pepper, and Tabasco to your liking. Using a teaspoon, place the mixture back onto the egg whites. Lightly sprinkle on the paprika. You can serve the eggs with toppings such as a parsley sprig, a sliced olive, or a for a spicy egg add a jalapeño slice.



Sloppy Joes

This dish is best prepared the day before serving. One pound of hamburger makes 8 Sloppy Joes. A pound of ground turkey can be substituted for the hamburger. Serve on nice, fresh buns.

1 pound hamburger 1 tablespoon butter 1/2 med. chopped green pepper 1 large chopped onion 6 finely chopped garlic cloves 1 can of diced tomatoes -

14.5 ounces (drain well, use the back of the spoon to squeeze out the liquid)
2 teaspoons dark brown sugar

3/4 cup ketchup
2 teaspoons apple cider vinegar

1/2 teaspoon cayenne pepper 1/2 teaspoon black pepper

1/2 teaspoon salt
1/2 teaspoon garlic powder

1 teaspoon Worcestershire sauce 1 teaspoon dry mustard

(such as Coleman's)
3/4 cup beer
squeeze of lemon or lime
dash of cinnamon

Brown the hamburger in a large saucepan. Drain well and remove from the pan. In the same pan melt the butter. Sautee the green pepper, onion, and the fresh chopped garlic for one to one and a half minutes on medium heat. Add the remaining ingredients with the browned hamburger. Simmer uncovered for about an hour stirring occasionally until liquid is absorbed. Cover the pan if the dish appears to becoming dry.



But art and love will win. As her first marriage passed, she found her true love. Arnold Biskar. He emboldened some of the most prestigious her and filled her with confidence, telling her to trust her

love of art again. He was filled with ambition of his own and they fueled each other's fires for life and travel. They left Washington DC, where they had spent their lives. and moved to Portland OR. where Rosie blossomed as an artist.

At the age of 50 Arnold said they had both passed up the first half of their lives afraid to live and chase their dreams. so Rosie applied to the Northwest College

of Arts and was accepted as their oldest art student to date. School was hard and the teachers were harder. They were not gentle with Rosie, whom they viewed as a wealthy woman looking to pass the time. If it were not for the support of her husband and the other students she might not have been able to endure. Art and love win again.

When Rosie graduated with a Bachelors degree in Fine Arts at 54, she was greeted with open doors at art galleries in Portland such as Butters Art Gallery, where

she showed her work for years. Rosie and Arnold had begun to find out how limitless they truly were, as he pursued a variety of careers including his own radio talk show, real estate investing for a large firm, and even politics. 





DEMA Honors "Hyperbaric Dick" Rutkowski

The Coconut Telegraph salutes Dick Rutkowski of Key Largo, who was presented with the Reaching Out Award at the November 2012 DEMA convention in Las Vegas.

DEMA, the Diving Equipment & Marketing Association, is an international organization dedicated to the promotion and growth of the recreational scuba diving and snorkeling industry. Each year since 1989 DEMA has bestowed the award, which is now considered the "DEMA Hall of Fame Award" and is presented only to those who truly deserve to be recognized for their outstanding efforts and contribution to the sport of diving. They are the pioneers, leaders and heroes of the sport. Jaques Cousteau was inducted to the Hall of Fame in 1989.

Rutkowski is a pioneer in the fields of hyperbaric and



diving medicine and diver training, especially in relation to the use of breathing gases. He helped change the course of modern diving through his continued efforts to test and promote the use of gases, such as Nitrox and Trimix. His work helped develop tech diving and clinical hyperbaric medicine as we know it today. In 1973, Rutkowski became a NOAA Aquanaut by working in the undersea lab located in Freeport, Bahamas, During this time he was directed to obtain a recompression chamber for NOAA to serve the recreation and military diving communities in areas of Miami, as well as Central and South America.

In addition to his affiliation with NOAA, Rutkowski is a graduate of Divers Training Academy and past owner and president of "Dive Incorpo-

> rated," a commercial diving company whose primary purpose was to service oil rigs. Upon retiring from federal service in 1985, he formed Hyperbarics International, Inc. to educate and consult in the field of hyperbaric medicine, use of various diving gases and life support systems.

Since retiring from NOAA, Rutkowski has

continued to use his vast knowledge to conduct training programs for NOAA and other agencies such as USN, USAF, NASA, EPA, U.S. Customs, Panama Canal Commission, hospitals, commercial diving companies and foreign navies. Rutkowski has taught thousands of professionals in programs such as recompression chambers, engineering, diving gases, physics, physiology, pathophysiology, and the medical aspects of diving. His contributions to hyperbaric medicine, as well as his work with mixed breathing gases, have made diving a much safer

sport today. His publications include: Instructor/Student Guide for baric medicine visit the Use of Nitrogen-Oxygen Mixtures as a Divers' Breathing Gas, The Complete Guide to Nitrox Diving, Introduction to Nitrox Diving, Instructor/ Student Guide for the Use of negative hype surrounding Breathing Gases During Hyperbaric Exposures, and Mixing/Blending for Nitrox and Trimix. He has also been a contributor and editor of the NOAA Diving Manual and

training films. He currently teaches a course titled "Advanced Diving / Hyperbaric Medical Team Training Program with Chamber Operations," which takes place monthly in the Ocean Diver's Building 522-A Caribbean Drive, Key Largo, FL. For more information on hyper-HyperbaricsInternational.com.

According to a March 2004 edition of Rodale's Scuba Diving magazine, "In the process of overcoming the oxygen-enriched air, he also gave us one of his other significant contributions to diving—a now famous quote-"Science Always Wins Over Bullshit."
