



Type into your browser: Unclaimed Funds, and the state where you live or previously lived. There will be a place for you to type in your name to find out if the state is holding any money for you. A few vears ago I received a check of \$60 from an Allstate Insurance refund.

I recently checked again, only I typed in my deceased mother's name and found some stock dividends. Although she passed away 4 years ago the money was only transferred to Unclaimed Funds this year. These were stocks my mother didn't even

EVERYONE - Who doesn't know she had from over 30 years ago! (I must first go through the verification process before they will tell me the amount due me.) There is no charge for this service from the state comptrollers so do not be fooled by sites that want to charge you. Check every state where you have resided.

LOCALS - BP is still paying out big bucks. You may be entitled to money that you are not aware of. Not just businesses, individuals are also collecting BP funds. Although we did not get oil on our shores, what we did get is a 30% drop in tourism in 2010, that's about \$500 million dollars lost to our local economy that year so if you lived and worked in the FLORIDA KEYS in April







FKWBC Dedication Honors Gintels

2008 was a year of national economic disaster. In tently receiving over 1,000 the relatively isolated Florida birds and 12,000 visitors a Keys, there was one quiet episode of a person, and her gift to the Keys, caught up in the national tragedy. Fortuitously, there was another person with both the ability and magnanimity to intervene. be enough income to survive

In 1983, Laura Quinn was enlisted by local veterinarian Dr. Robert Foley to provide a place for wild birds that he had treated to receive rehabilitation and release when possible, and when not, a sanctuary for the rest of their lives. Laura, a widowed, retired school teacher, established this sanctuary under and around her small oceanfront stilt-home in Islamorada. It grew, and gained permits and licenses, and was established as the Florida Keys Wild Bird Rehabilitation Center, Inc., (FKWBC), a 501(c)(3) charity. The Center became known as the place to take rescued birds and to visit to be saved! and view the sanctuary for pelicans, herons, hawks and more, all done with donations and Laura's own limited funds.

Then Code Enforcement decided that the Center did not belong in a residential neighborhood. It would have to be relocated, with all the bureaucratic complexities.

Laura's funds were tapped to relocate the Center to $4\frac{1}{2}$ acres of mostly wetland bayside in Tavernier, the Center's essential. current location. Opened in June of 1990, the Hospital and pending Code Enforcement Offices were located under the stilt house, below flood elevation, with living quarters for Laura and interns above.


A "Hail Mary" email letter to potential supporters was sent. One addressee was Robert Gintel.

A discussion with the e-mail sender led to a rescue donation to keep the Center from going under and an in-depth inquiry into the merits of the Center and its founder. The realization that here was an 80-year-old retiree giving all her waning energy and resources to the care of wild birds and their rescuers was enough to warrant deeper involvement. The Center had

Bob provided not only salvation of the Center and to ease Laura's worsening health. His business and financial acumen saved the Center. Bob spent several days a week at the Center helping with the many issues confronting it. His personal networking for additional funds was immediate. Reconstituting and enlarging the Board of Directors was

She and her assistant had worked at a foundation-established Rehab Center that did not survive 2008. They both needed a place to live in the Keys. Again, Bob came through with the funds to set up a two-bedroom apartment


Another vital issue that needed to be addressed was Laura's ownership of her home and the property that consti-

tuted the Sanctuary. With Bob's donation of funds. FKWBRC Inc. purchased the property. Laura did not have to be concerned about the perpetuation of the Center.

As Laura's health continued to decline, a caregiver was needed, and again Bob came through with funding. With the knowledge that the work of her life would continue, Laura passed away in September, 2010.

It is only through Bob's continuous generosity that the Center survives today. Bob Gintel has surely made the greatest contribution to "Keep Them Flying."
