Debra Lynn Ginsberg...the force behind Ginsberg Productions

Debra Ginsberg, while acting in community theater in Connecticut and New York, once had hopes of starring on Broadway. However, she has since answered to a much higher callina.

As the force behind Ginsberg Productions, a not-for-profit community acting and production company, Ginsberg has brought high-quality theater to South Florida venues including Key Largo's Murray E. Nelson Government and Cultural Center. Her energy and philanthropy has brought "The Producers," "Steel Magnolias" and "The Rocky Horror Show" to the Center in past

"We have taken community acting and performing to a new level, not normally available locally. We don't miss a beat," she said.

Besides providing acting and other theater opportunities to aspiring local thespians, Ginsberg has taken a page from her philanthropic father Bob Gintel and has already performed pro bono shows for elderly residents at assisted living facilities in Cutler Ridge and Forest Trace at Inverness in Broward County. Plans to include Homestead facilities are on the drawing board.

In 2006, as the major force behind another theatrical production company, she raised \$37,000 for Mariners Hospital, and along with her parents' family foundation she helped provide a technologically sophisticated electronic monitoring system that gives an extra level of care to critically ill patients, according to

of performing before audiences, but for the philanthropic gratification received, as well," she said. "Without them I have nothing. I would like to pay a sincerely felt tribute to all those actors who have ever

Ginsberg opened her first acting company in 1999 - Actors for Charity Theatrical Alliance - in hopes of raising money for charity.

"I've done this for many years," she said. " it certainly is one of the main missions in my life."

Her parents' Gintel Family Foundation supports the Ocean Reef Summer Youth Performing Arts Group, called "Broadway Bound."

"I want to raise

Key Largo students to this camp next summer," Ginsberg said.

"The arts are so important to kids. It brings them self-awareness and helps some children overcome shyness while giving them people skills. It gives people of all ages a sense of purpose."

Once again Debra will bring "The Rocky Horror Show" to the Murray Nelson stage for two nights: on Halloween, October 31 and again on November 1.

In March of 2014 she will produce at least three performances of the exciting musical smash hit "Cabaret" and later in the year will debut "I Don't Care," an original work written by Broward County resident Michael Vadnal, a long-time member of Debra's group of performers. He plays a major role in the forthcoming "Rocky Horror Show." All performances will be presented at the Murray Nelson Center at mile marker 102 in Key Largo.
