
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Editorial: Consider the Source and Persevere.



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
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Entertainer of the Month: Dave Bowman

The melodious sound of a guitar instrument resonating in the hands of a skilled performer is a soothing sound to the soul. No matter how involved Dave became with the bands, his first love was never too far from his heart...



These days the soft-spoken, polite gentleman is also doing solo gigs at Gilbert's and Bayside beautiful and loving wife Jacki by his side. They married when he was 25 and she was 41, and this past November they celebrated their 32-year anniversary.

Barbara can be described as a genuine lady who keeps pace with New York City's creative community. Though now a local resident and fully embracing our Florida Key's life style, she speaks with a fondness for the Society of Illustrators, Art Directors Club, Overseas Press Club, and the many places her work was shown throughout her career. Raised in a family of artists that LeBrun the famous female painter of Mary Antoinette, Bar-

bara excelled in illustrating with her grandmothers instruction. Both her parents were prominent artists but her grandmother was an excellent portrait artist who taught Barbara more about illustrating than she would learn throughout the entirety of her career.

When Barbara began her career, female illustrators who illustrated men's fashion were unheard of. It was commonly thought that a woman could never capture the essence and true features of a man. So when Barbara's work relating to men's fashion was seen, the publishers who were interested in

> her work would pass it off as the work of Robert Fox or simply make no mention to the artist at all. To Barbara it made little difference; her art was gracing store advertising and magazines throughout the fashion industry, and she was in high demand. Eventually word spread, but not without causing a scandal at Bendels, who wanted to retain her for themselves, a story you simply

have to hear her tell.

Before too long. Barbara was doing portraits from life; well known celebrities such as Barbara Walters, Mary Hemingway, Barbara DePortogo, Nan Kempner, David Halberstam, Morley Safer, Harrison Salisbury, and many others.

As her work became more known

she began spending time with many affluent artists. She tells of swapping drawing stratecan be traced gies with Norman Rockwell and other prominent back to Vigee illustrators. She illustrated The Great Gatsby for Readers Digest as well as books by John Updike and Garson Kanin. Parson's School of Design and FIT requested Barbara to teach life classes. After interaction with her students Barbara began to love teaching as much as illustrating.



Barbara has retired to the Florida Keys and is doing portraits of people and animals as well as enjoying instructing portrait classes at The Art Box in Key Largo on Tuesday nights. Her work will be displayed at The Art Box as the featured artist of the month for February and you will have a chance to meet her and hear her stories on the third Thursday of the month at the Morada Way Art Walk in Islamorada.

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
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

Chocolates are a favorite gift on Valentine's Day. Serving a chocolate dessert is a wonderful idea to complete a romantic meal. Below is a rich but easy pie. It is a great boat dessert as it does not have to be baked. Serve a slice with whipped cream and a strawberry. Enjoy!

MOCHA MOUSSE PIE

2 cups (12 ounce package) semi-sweet chocolate chips

- 1/4 cup packed brown sugar
- $1\frac{1}{2}$ tablespoons instant coffee granules
- $\frac{1}{2}$ cup water
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 2 cups heavy whipping cream
- 1- 8 inch chocolate crumb pie crust

Melt the chocolate chips with the sugar, coffee granules, and water in a sauce pan over low heat until smooth. Stir in the vanilla and cool to lukewarm. Whip the cream in a large bowl with a mixer until soft peaks form. Fold in the chocolate mixture.

Spoon into the crust and chill several hours or over night.

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


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New Romance Novels by Two Florida Keys Authors



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
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Curative Attentiveness Being Aware of Your Thoughts

We seldom accept negative comments from others, however, we so often accept our own inner negative chatter.





The cost of living has now gotten so bad that my wife is having sex with me because she can't afford batteries.




















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
