
In 1992, 23-year-old Karen Norman accidentally backed her car into Galveston Bay after a night of drinking. Norman couldn't operate her seat belt and drowned. Her passenger managed to disengage herself and make it to shore. Norman's parents sued Honda for making a seat belt their drunken daughter (her blood alcohol level was 17 nearly twice the legal limit) couldn't open underwater. A jury found Honda seventyfive percent responsible for Karen's death and awarded the Norman family \$65 million. An appeals court threw out the case.

In May 2003, Stephen Joseph of San Francisco sued Kraft Foods for putting trans-fat in their Oreo cookies. Joseph wanted an injunction to order Kraft to stop selling Oreos to children. 

The holidays have descended upon us and now is the time to celebrate with family and friends. It is the time of year that we all rejoice in food. Get togethers, happy hours, and meals make December a tasty month. One of the ways that I like to celebrate is the giving of gifts in the form of food. Whether it be a special cake, pie, cookies, or bread, it is always a welcomed gift. My mother-in-law served this chocolate treat at last years family Christmas Eve. If you aren't a chocolate fan you will find this recipe a winner.

Happy holidays to all!

PEPPERMINT BARK CANDY

- 3 (four ounce) packages white chocolate
- 2 (four ounce) packages semi-sweet chocolate
- 1/2 cup miniature marshmallows

1/4 cup crushed hard peppermint candies (about 13 candies)

Place wax paper on a cookie sheet. Slowly melt the white chocolate on low heat in a saucepan stirring constantly (if you have a double boiler that works great.) Spread the white chocolate into a thin layer on the wax paper. Refrigerate 10 minutes.

While the white chocolate is cooling, melt the semi-sweet chocolate using the same procedure.

Spread the semi-sweet chocolate over the white chocolate. Sprinkle with the marshmallows and peppermint pieces. Place back into the refrigerator for 4 hours or until firm. Break into pieces or cut into shapes using a cookie cutter then serve.

The candy can be stored in an airtight container at room temperature or in the refrigerator for up to 3 weeks.
