Slowly her memory came back and while she was recovering at her son's house, her three adult sons Randy, Jack and Kyle, got together and repaired and prepared her home for her return.

Deb was "determined to recover," she says, "there is too much to live for" and she couldn't wait to get back to working with plants.

For the past eight years she has been working at Silent Native Nursery in the Redlands where they sell plants native to South Florida and the Caribbean native plants. Deb found

that there was also a need for seedlings of native plants. She began collecting seeds from the yards of her friends and started growing seedlings in 60-cell pack trays. And so Sea-Shore Seeds was born in Key Largo.

Deb mostly sells wholesale to nurseries who in turn sell to landscaping contractors who use them for restoration work, which ultimately helps the environment.

She also sells some stock retail; native plants and some tropical plants as well in 1,3, and 7-gallon containers. Her motto is to "cultivate for conservation meeting the needs of future generations."


