

# Editorial: Childhood Bullies Turn Into Adult Bullies

You would think that as people 2. Impulsive Adult Bully: get older they would mature and learn to stop the behaviors of their youth, but that isn't always the case. Adult bullying exists right here in the Keys. The goal of the adult bully is to gain power over another person and make themselves the dominant adult. are more spontaneous and plan their bullying out less. Even if consequences are likely, this adult bully has a hard time restraining his or her behavior. In some cases, this type of bullying may be unintentional resulting in periods of stress, or when the bully is actually upset or concerned about something unconnected with the victim.

### 3. The Physical Bully:

While adult bullying rarely turns to physical confrontation, there are, nonetheless, bullies that use physicality. In some cases, the adult bully may not actually physically harm the victim, but may use the threat of harm, or physical domination through loom-

ing. Additionally, a physical bully may damage or steal Adult bullies in this category a victim's property, rather than physically confronting

the victim.

#### 4. Verbal Adult Bully:

Words can be guite damaging. Adult bullies who use this type of tactic may start rumors about the victim, or use sarcastic or demeaning language to dominate or humiliate another person. This subtle type of bullying also has the advantage - to the bully - of being difficult to document. However, the emotional and psychological impacts of verbal bullying can be felt quite keenly and can result in reduced job performance and even depression.

#### 5. Secondary Adult Bully:

This is someone who does not initiate the bullying, but joins in so that he or she does not actually become a victim down the road. Secondary bullies may feel bad about what they are doing, but are more concerned about protecting themselves.

Hopefully this will help you to recognize the characteristics of a bully and realize you are not going crazy, they are the ones that are crazy. Their goal is to get you to break down and do what they want. If this happens in the work place keep a record of it. Report it to your supervisor. If you get no satisfaction go to your family physician and explain it to him or her. Talk to a lawyer.
