




Gilbert's Resort gave a very generous grant to get the book published. The book is small but mighty. There will be a book signing and benefit







This 32-page book was created with the idea of poking fun at our life here in the Florida Keys. It was published and made available for sale so that the proceeds could help local musicians and their families.


The book started as a collection of random observations by Sue Beal, on our life here in the Keys. It grew when she shared them with others, as people chimed in with their own observations.



North American Darwin Awards Submitted by Trader Dick

Named in honor of Charles Darwin, the father of evolution, these awards commemorate those who improve our gene pool by removing themselves from it.

1. San Jose Mercury News An unidentified man. using a shotgun like a club to break a former girl friend's windshield, accidentally shot himself to death when the gun discharged, blowing a hole in his gut.

2. Kalamazoo Gazette

James Burns, 34, (a mechanic) of Alamo, MI, was killed in March as he was trying to repair what police describe as a "farmtype truck." Burns got a friend to drive the truck on a highway while Burns hung underneath so that he could ascertain the source of a troubling noise. Burns' clothes caught on something, however, and the other man found Burns "wrapped in the drive shaft."

3. UPI. Toronto Sun Police said a lawyer demonstrating the safety of windows in a downtown Toronto skyscraper crashed through a pane with his shoulder and plunged 24 floors to his death. A police spokesman said Garry Hoy, 39, fell into the courtyard of the Toronto Dominion Bank Tower early Friday evening as he was explaining the strength of the buildings windows to visiting law stu-

Hoy previously had conducted demonstrations of window strength, according to police reports. Peter Lawson, managing partner of the firm Holden Day Wilson, told the Toronto Sun newspaper that Hoy was "one of the best and brightest" members of the 200-man association.

(A person has to wonder what the dimmer members of this law firm are like.)

4. News of the Weird

Michael Anderson Godwin made News of the Weird posthumously. He had spent several years awaiting South Carolina's electric chair on a murder conviction before having his sentence reduced to life in prison. While sitting Ward. on a metal toilet in his cell attempting to fix his small TV set, he bit into a wire and was electrocuted.

5. The Indianapolis Star

A cigarette lighter may have triggered a fatal explosion in Dunkirk, Indiana. A Jay County man, using a cigarette lighter to check the barrel of a muzzleloader, was killed Monday night when the weapon discharged in his face, sheriff's investigators said. Gregory David Pryor, 19, died in his parents' rural Dunkirk home at about 11:30 PM. Investigators said Pryor was cleaning a .54-caliber muzzle-loader that had not been firing properly. He was using the lighter to look into the barrel when the gunpowder ignited.

6. Reuters, Mississauga, Ont.

A man cleaning a bird feeder on the balcony of his condominium apartment in this Toronto suburb slipped and fell 23 stories to his death. "Stefan Macko, 55, was standing on a wheelchair when the accident occurred," said Inspector Darcy Honer of the Peel Regional Police. "It appears that the chair moved and he went over the balcony," Honer said.

Finally, THE WINNER! Race To The Death, 2014, NY For most people the

danger of a high speed road is common-sense obvious, and few people will attempt to

cross a major highway. On racetracks the danger is even more obvious: when cars inside a compact oval are moving faster than freeway speeds, common sense shouts in your ear, "Do not walk!"

...And then there is Kevin

Kevin Ward is a Sprint Car

racing driver. Sprint Car racing is one of the most popular forms of racing in the United States. The cars have a very high power-to-weight ratio making speeds in excess of 140 miles per hour possible on some tracks. A Sprint Car race typically takes place on a dirt track in a machine designed to drift around corners, and the traction of the racetrack surface is much less than the traction of an asphalt surface.

Sprint Car drivers are shielded in specially-designed race vehicles that are meant to take a beating so that the occupant can survive. The importance of staying inside the vehicle until track personnel arrive to protect the crash site is essential knowledge drummed into every race car

...And then there's Kevin Ward

You don't have to be Captain Obvious to notice that race cars move rapidly, and collisions and spin-outs happen frequently. In Sprint Car races the vehicles drift through corners, meaning they are moving at the very limit of their traction. It was in this environment that Kevin's vehicle was bumped by another driver, causing it to spin around and knock into the wall. Kevin's vehicle was out of the race. For most people being knocked out of the race is a time of reflection, and a time of considering what to say at

the end of the race when you discuss the collision with the driver who knocked you out.

And then there is Kevin

In a rage that defied common sense, he decided to confront the driver who bumped him. Not only did he exit his vehicle without consideration for the slippery dirt track, and put out of his mind corner drifting, but he also failed to consider the black color of his uniform and helmet and their near-invisibility on a dimly lit racetrack at night... all factors that would instill the fear of death in many drivers.

...Then there's Kevin Ward Even during a yellow flag the race cars move quickly, and Sprint Cars cannot turn or stop on a dime as the track is made of dirt. After climbing out of his vehicle and walking onto the middle of the track Kevin spotted his target and made many gestures as the driver was coming around the bend. However the offending driver did not see the figure in the dark jumpsuit. His car was behind another race car in single file during the caution lap. The car in front of him dodged Kevin in the nick of time. The next car, the car that had knocked Kevin out of the race, attempted to dodge the shadowy figure but it was at that point that Kevin's luck ran out.

In an attempt to swerve, the car slid sideways and the back of the vehicle impacted against Kevin and knocked him flat. He was down and out. a tragic end to the last race of Kevin's life.

Moral of the story? Stay off a busy road. Especially a dirt racetrack. And most especially when you're a Sprint Car professional who knows better.



CRÈME BRULÉE, THE PERFECT DESSERT

When ever I would go out to dinner, if it was on the menu, I'd order crème brulée for dessert. That is until I discovered how easy it is to make at home. Translated from French, the words "crème brulée" mean burnt cream. It is an elegant, rich, but not heavy dessert, and the portion is just right. Prepare the custard in the morning and chill it all day. It will be ready to serve for dinner.

All that is left to do is to brown the sugar prior to serving. To brown the sugar, you can place it under the broiler, or use a cooking torch. The sugar crust makes the dessert. Use a heavy granulated sugar such as raw sugar, or mix 1/2 cup of brown sugar with 1/4 cup of regular sugar and spread evenly over the custard dishes. Place the custard cups under the broiler (or use a torch) and watch constantly as the sugar browns rapidly. Can be served warm or cooled. Enjoy!

WHITE CHOCOLATE CRÈME BRULÉE

5 large egg yolks 1/2 cup white sugar 1/4 tsp. vanilla extract 2 tablespoons sugar

2 cups whipping cream 3 ounces white chocolate, finely chopped

Whisk egg yolks and 1/4 cup of sugar in a medium bowl. Bring the cream and remaining 1/4 cup sugar to simmer in a saucepan. Reduce heat to low. Gradually add the chopped chocolate and whisk until smooth. Whisk the chocolate mixture into the yolk mixture. Add vanilla. Pour the custard into four 10-oz, custard cups. Place the cups in a large baking pan and add enough hot water to cover halfway up the sides of the cups. Bake 1 hour in a preheated 300° oven, until set. Remove custards, cover and refrigerate until dinner. When ready to serve, sprinkle $\frac{1}{2}$ tablespoon of sugar over each custard. Broil or torch until sugar caramelizes, about 2 minutes.

RUM CRÈME BRULÉE

4 cups whipping cream 1 cup + 10 teaspoons sugar 1.5 T. vanilla extract

6 large egg yolks 1 large egg 2 T. dark rum

Whisk the cream, 1 cup of sugar, egg yolks, egg, rum, and vanilla in a large bowl. Divide mixture among ten custard cups. Place the cups in a large baking pan. Fill pan with hot water so that it reaches halfway up the sides of the cups. Bake in a 350 degree over for 50 minutes. Remove and cool. Cover and refrigerate at least 4 hours. Sprinkle the remaining sugar on the custards. Broil or torch until the sugar caramelizes.

COCONUT CRÈME BRULÉE

13/4 cups heavy cream

13/4 cups milk

1 vanilla bean, split lengthwise

6 large egg yolks 1 large whole egg

1/2 cup white sugar

2/3 cup packed, flaked coconut

toasted lightly to a golden brown 1/4 cup firmly packed light brown or raw sugar

In a saucepan heat the cream, milk, and vanilla bean over medium high heat until it just comes to a boil. Remove from heat. Steep the vanilla bean 10 minutes and with a sharp knife scrap the seeds into the milk mixture. Discard pod.*

In a bowl whisk together the yolks, whole egg, and the half cup of sugar. Mix well. Add the milk mixture in a steady stream, whisking. Skim off any froth. Pour the custard in eight half-cup ramekins. Crumble the coconut and add. Place the ramekins in a baking pan and add enough hot water to the pan to reach halfway up the sides. Bake in a 325° oven for 40 minutes (custard should be set). Remove and cool. Refrigerate custards for at least 4 hours or overnight. Sprinkle sugar over the top and broil or torch until the sugar caramelizes.

Everybody in the Keys knows the sailboat people. whether it's seeing them come and go out of the marinas or seeing them dingly in from a boat out on the hook. Some of you may be curious of their choice of lifestyle, or jealous, or just sick of seeing them. Me, being a person living on a sailboat at a dock, I might just have a little insight into the whys and hows of some of this. Let me tell how I became one of the "boat people."

I come from the corporate the house ready to sell, get world; pumps, pantyhose, eight-to-five crowd. We've all been there, living for the weekend. I decided to retire a little early, to quote a friend, "everyone should retire early and often." It wasn't a simple or an overnight decision; I had a mortgage, debts, and an aging mother to take care of.



So it was a two-year plan Get rid of the accumulation of years of being a landlubber. I have been in love with sailing since I have been an adult, reading every cruising and sailing magazine in publication that I could get my hands on. So it was easy to see myself on a sailboat cruising around the world, or at least the

Caribbean, I took up the mantra of "not going to need that on a sailboat," whenever I was cleaning out the house, the garage, my personal life.

I have been here in the Keys living on my boat for almost ten years; it is a daily adventure. Living on a vessel on salt water is one of the harshest places you can live; salt water being very corro-

sive by nature, then you add electricity to the mix. Now not only do you have to worry about keeping the water on the outside of your hull, you have to worry about stray electrical current leaking out of your boat or somebody else's vessel. Stone Soup The Wisdom of Sharing

Imagine a world in which we all shared our gifts and bounty with each other rather than focusing on self preservation.

There are many variations on the story of stone soup, but they all involve a traveler coming into a town beset by famine. The inhabitants try to discourage the traveler from staying, fearing he wants them to give him food. They tell him in no uncertain terms that there's no food anywhere to be found. The traveler explains that he doesn't need any food and that, in fact, he was planning to make a soup to share with all of them.

The villagers watch suspiciously as he builds a fire and fills a cauldron with water. With great ceremony, he pulls a stone from a bag, dropping the stone into the pot of water. He sniffs the brew extravagantly and exclaims how delicious stone soup is.

As the villagers begin to show interest, he mentions how good the soup would be with just a little cabbage in it. A villager brings out a cabbage to share. This episode repeats itself until the soup has cabbage, carrots, onions, and beets—indeed, a substantial soup that feeds everyone in the village.

This story addresses the human tendency to hoard in times of deprivation. When resources are scarce, we pull back and put all of our energy into self-preservation. We isolate ourselves and shut out

As the story of stone soup reveals, in doing so, we often deprive ourselves and everyone else of a feast. This metaphor plays out beyond the realm of food. We hoard ideas, love, and energy, thinking we will be richer if we keep to them to ourselves. when in truth we make the world, and ourselves, poorer whenever we greedily stockpile our reserves.

The traveler was able to see that the villagers were holding back, and he had the genius to draw them out and inspire them to give, thus creating a spread that none of them could have created

Are you like one of the villagers, holding back? If you come forward and share your gifts, you will inspire others to do the same. The reward is a banquet that can nourish many.

Gunfight Rules

"Peace is that brief glorious moment in history when everybody stands around reloading."

- 8 Make your attacker advance through a wall of bullets ... you may get killed with your own gun, but they'll have to beat you to death with it because it will be empty.
- 9 If you're in a gun fight: If you're not shooting, you should be loading. If you're not loading, you should be moving. If you're not moving, you're dead.
- 10 In a life-and-death situation, do something ... it may be wrong, but do some-
- 11 If you carry a gun. people will call you paranoid. Nonsense! If you have a gun, what do you have to be paranoid about?
- 12 You can say "stop" or any other word, but a gun pointed at someone's head is pretty much a universal language, and you won't have to press 1 for Spanish, or 2 for Chinese, or 3 for Arabic.
- 13 If you have to shoot, shoot to kill. Never leave an enemy behind. In court, yours will be the only testimony.
