The first of July dawned hot and sultry in the mid-Atlantic. No hurricane had formed this season; that was about to change.

A thousand-mile string of thunderheads streaming off the deserts of Africa brought with it immense clouds of red dust. A couple hundred miles off Florida's coast, it began to draw power from a freak eddy of superheated Gulfstream water. To the alarm of the Weather Bureau, up jumped Hurricane Al, a full-blown Category 2, bore-sighted on the town of Jupiter.

"Oh, you have NO idea," my wife agreed, collapsing with laughter.



2016 Monroe County Regulations for Recreational Harvest of Lobster*

Measuring Lobster

- No person shall harvest or attempt to harvest spiny lobster by diving unless they possess, while in the water, a gauge made for measuring
- All lobster must be measured in the water, if harvested by diving.
- Lobster carapace must be greater than three (3) inches to be harvested or possessed. All undersized lobsters must be released unharmed
- All recreationally harvested lobster must remain in whole condition while at sea.
- Tails can only be separated on land. When the tail is separated from the body, it must be greater than 5-1/2 inches.



Florida Spiny Lobster (Crawfish) Panulirus argus

Facts for All Seasons:

Possession: Lobster must be of legal size before they are in possession. NOTE: You may not have lobster in your possession in Everglades National Park (Florida Bay).

Bag Limits: The Federal bag limit cannot be combined with the State bag limit

Egg-bearing (berried) lobster regardless of species must be released unharmed.

Stripping egg-bearing females of eggs, and possession of spiny or ridged slipper lobster tails from which eggs have been removed is prohibited. Eggs are an orange, yellow, brown, or red mass found covering the underside of the lobster's tail

Coral is protected from damage and removal in State and Federal waters. Do NOT touch, hold on to, stand on, break or otherwise harm coral. It is a fragile living animal.

Regular Season:State and Federal Waters

August 6 through March 31.

Begins at 12:01 a.m. on August 6. Ends at 12:00 midnight on March 31

Bag Limit: Six (6) per recreational harvester per day. Diving at night for lobster is permitted.

Excerpts from pamphlet by Florida Keys National Marine Sanctuary: 07/2016

*This is not an official publication of lobster season rules and regulations.

No person shall remove by any means, whether by trap, diving, spearing or otherwise, any Florida spiny lobster from any waters within the city limits.

- During the Regular Season no person shall harvest any lobster species from or within any coral formation (patch reef) regardless of its proximity to, or exclusion from, a marked "Pennekamp Lobster Exclusion Zone."
- "Pennekamp Lobster Exclusion Zones" are closed during the Regular Season to the harvest of any lobster species and are marked with white and orange spar buoys:

"Pennekamp Lobster Exclusion Zones" Turtle Rocks • Cannon Patch

- · Basin Hills North
- Basin Hills East
- · Basin Hills South
- Higdon's Reef
- Three Sisters North • Three Sisters South

• Mosquito Bank North

• Mosquito Bank South East

• Local Jurisdictions

Local jurisdictions have specific restrictions on snorkeling and diving. Jurisdictions have extended the rule beyond the Lobster Sport Season.

In the local jurisdictions, there is no diving or snorkeling within:

- 300 feet of improved residential or commercial shoreline, any manmade or private canal, any public or private marina.
- Dive means to wholly or partially submerge one's body while equipped with a mask or goggles, whether or not any type of underwater breathing apparatus is used.
- **Kev Colony Beach** (Ch. 5 Art. I) Rule applies during the 4 days preceding Sport Season and continues until 10 days have elapsed after the opening of Regular Season.
- **Islamorada** (Ch. 66 Art. I) Rule applies during the 3 days preceding Sport Season, the entirety of Sport Season and the first 5 days of Regular Season.
- Layton, Key West and Unincorporated Monroe County (Monroe County Ch. 26 Art. IV) Rule applies during the 3 days preceding Sport Season, the entirety of Sport Season and the first 5 days of Regular Season. Exception: diving and snorkeling is allowed in front of his or her property to the center line of the canal or 100 feet of open water.

Gear: Harvesting or attempting to harvest spiny lobster using any device that will or could puncture, penetrate, or crush the exoskeleton (shell) or the flesh of the lobster, and the use of such devices is prohibited.

"Bully-netting" is using a circular frame attached at a right angle to the end of a pole and supporting a conical bag of webbing Possession of bully nets is prohibited in Everglades National Park (Florida Bay)

"Hoop-netting" is using a frame, circular or otherwise, supporting a shallow bag of webbing and suspended by a line and bridles. Possession of hoop nets is prohibited in Everglades National Park (Florida Bay).

"Artificial Habitats in State Waters" is any material placed in the waters of the state that is reasonably suited to providing cover and habitat for spiny lobster. Placing artificial

habitat or harvesting lobster from artificial habitat is prohibited. Such material may be constructed of, but is not limited to, wood, metal, fiberglass, concrete, or plastic, or any combination thereof, and may be fabricated for this specific purpose or for some other purpose. Artificial habitat does not include fishing gear allowed by FWC or artificial reefs permitted by Florida DEP or Army

License Requirements: Recreational harvesters are required to possess a valid Florida Saltwater Fishing License with a current spiny lobster permit. Consult your license agent for exemptions.

Spanish and slipper lobster are closed year round to harvest in Key Largo and Looe Key Existing Management Areas, Everglades and Dry Tortugas National Parks, Florida Keys National Marine Sanctuary Ecological


Reserves, Sanctuary Preservation Areas and Special-use Research Only Areas. During the Regular Season, they are closed to harvest in John Pennekamp Coral Reef State Park Lobster Exclusion Zones and from or within coral formations (patch reefs) within the Park.

Commercial Lobster Traps: It is a felony to molest, damage, or take lobster from traps in State or Federal waters.

Dive Flag: All divers and snorkelers in the water are required to prominently display a diver down flag. Vessel operators must slow to idle speed within 100 yards of a dive flag














We are now enduring one of the hottest summers ever. With the high temperatures and heat index coupled with little to no rain, we are in the midst of some very uncomfortable weather. Anything to get out of the kitchen is a relief. For my husband and myself that usually means salads. The recipe below is one of my favorite salads. It can be served as a side as is, or you can purchase a rotisserie chicken and place chicken chunks on it for a refreshing meal. Try it and I promise that you will like it.

MANDARIN ORANGE SALAD

- ½ cup silvered almonds
- 5 tablespoons sugar, divided
- 1 head of Romaine lettuce (you can vary the salad by using
- $\frac{1}{2}$ Romaine and $\frac{1}{2}$ of another type of lettuce such as Boston or bibb)
- ½ cup chopped celery
- $\frac{1}{2}$ of a thinly sliced red onion
- 1 11-ounce can of Mandarin oranges, well drained

1/4 cup vegetable oil 2 tablespoons red wine vinegar Dash of Tabasco sauce (optional) Salt and pepper to taste

In a sauce pan, sauté the almonds with the sugar until lightly browned. Tear or cut the lettuce and place in a large bowl. Add the sugared almonds, celery, onions, and the oranges, tossing well.

To prepare the dressing, mix together the oil, vinegar, Tabasco, and the salt and pepper. Pour the dressing over the salad just before serving and toss one more time.

Living Dockside

Things you take for granted, unless you live on a boat!

again! To most of you land lubbers that is less-thanexciting news. I, for the last 5 years, have lived with one of those small apartment-size refrigerators. It is built into an old ice box and it works great; it even has a tiny freezer in it, in which I can make a small tray of ice cubes. This is not your average apartment fridge, it's a marine fridge and it's AC/DC (no. nothing to do with the rockand-roll group).

A marine fridge costs 4 times what you would pay for an ordinary refrigerator. With luxury we don't often see its 48 cubic feet of roominess, I can now buy a whole dozen eggs, or a gallon of milk, or two bottles of wine and a case of beer. The down side to getting the big fridge running again: it's only DC powered. That means I have to make sure I keep my battery banks in good shape.

So recently I had to replace my aging two-battery house bank with three brand new ones at the painful tune of, well... a lot. Nothing on a boat comes easy or cheap.

Now let's take a look at the marine head (toilet). Boat people do not have the magic handle, we have a pump handle. First we have to put water in the bowl, then we get to pump the darn thing to make sure we send uh, the stuff, off to

Getting into the sailboat. first you must take your shoes off; this is just being courteous to the boat and her captain. Then you must maneuver around or over the toe breaking stanchions, stays and other various deck obstacles just waiting to grab an unsuspecting digit. Yes, I have broken, sprained and bloodied my share of toes, until I learned to just slow down and be aware of what is around me on deck.

Head room on a boat is a unless it's a large boat. I have just over 6 feet of head room in the salon area, but to get to the aft cabin, the walk through is about 5 feet. At 5'10", I have developed quite a stoop. There's a permanent bump on my forehead from not remembering to duck! This all sounds like I'm

complaining. I could put my "She Breeze" on the market and go buy a nice little condo up near my children, but what's the fun in that? I'll do that when I'm too old to avoid the deck hazards, or forget how to change the oil in my diesel engine. For now I look forward to 15-20 knot winds out there so I can go raise a sail and remind myself why I've chosen this path less traveled.
