
One-Sided Relationships A Question of Balance

One example of this is a mentor relationship in which you are learning from someone. Another example is a relationship in which you are helping someone who is sick, disabled, or otherwise needy. In these instances, you can simply be grateful that you are able to help and be helped, trusting that the balance of give and take will even out in the big picture of your life.

All relationships have one law. Never make the one you love feel alone, especially when you're there.
