

Now that is awesome! Thank you Rep. Holly Rashein, you are the best!







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
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The opening reception for the photography exhibition Innocent Souls: Vietnam 1968 and Yesterday's Kids, was held at the Florida Keys History and Discovery Center (FKHDC) in Islamorada on Nov. 2nd. Joining photographer Glenn Hoover was renowned Vietnamese artist Huong. Huong, a war survivor and immigrant, now lives in Miami and owns the Peace Gallery on Washington Avenue in Miami Beach. She is loaning the exhibition her famous "Red Rain" painting.

The exhibition features photographs taken during the peak of the conflict known by Americans as the Vietnam War and by Vietnamese as the American War. The images were captured by Key Largo resident Glenn Hoover while he was serving as an Infantry 1st Lieutenant in the Republic of South Vietnam. They focus on the Vietnamese and Montagnards people who lived there, as well as the young American soldiers who were visiting. The exhibition can be previewed on line at www.innocentsoulsvietnam.org.

Dr. Clarice Yentsch, President of the sponsoring Waypoint Foundation and exhibition Curator, states "We are excited about having the full exhibition in Islamorada and will be introducing a new element, Yesterday's Kids, to the existing classmate and canvases. Yesterday's Kids is a collection of contemporary portraits including several local Florida residents who actively participated in the war, or protested against it. Their poignant reflections about their personal involvement and the lessons learned are stated in each photo's caption. Images of several Montagnards refugees, who I personally interviewed, are included." The Montagnards are the indigenous people of Vietnam who fought bravely next to US Special Forces units in Vietnam's Central Highlands.

Hoover has been pleased with how

these nearly 50-year-old images have been received. "Each time we open a new exhibition we receive many heartfelt emotional comments and notes of appreciation. We thought that we might get this reaction from those who were there or otherwise closely affected by the War. However, we never anticipated the interest and feed back that we have received by many younger observers, including elementary school children.

Dr. Yentsch and Glenn agree that it is not the intent of the exhibition to be a documentary, nor to pass any moral judgment about the period. The photographs are a series of snap shots taken during a brief moment in time by one person. It is their hope that by looking through the eyes into the souls of the subjects, the observers will contemplate the consequences of such conflicts and perhaps ask some questions.


Glenn Hoover, now a resident of Key Largo, Florida, arrived in Vietnam in January of 1968 through a series of voluntary choices, based on beliefs of service to his country instilled in him by his father. An Army ROTC graduate of Cornell University, he received a Silver Star, Bronze Star "V" Device, Army Commendation Medal and a Combat Infantryman's Badge during his 12-month


tour in Vietnam. He worked years in the hospitality industry and now owns Glenn Hoover Real Estate. He is the proud father of four children who have given him eight grandchildren.

The exhibition is dedicated to Marine Captain Jerry Zimmer, Glenn's high school football teammate. A F4 Phantom jet pilot, he was shot down while on a mission August 29th, 1969 in the mountainous Central Highlands of South Vietnam. Classified as an MIA, his wife Elaine continues an effort to locate his remains and "bring Jerry home." A

longtime writer, Elaine has chronicled her labor-of-love mission in an ongoing blog, www.bringingjerryhome.com. She welcomes all visitors to Jerry's site for an insider's look at their journey.

The Waypoint Foundation is a relatively new, private, not for profit devoted to celebrating human creativity and operating out of Key Largo. It is the primary sponsor of the exhibition. The exhibition will be available for viewing at the Florida Keys History and Discovery Center, 82100 Overseas Hwy, Islamorada, Florida 33036 from November 3rd through December 4th. The Center is open Thursdays through Sundays from 10 am to 5 pm. The Center will also be hosting a presentation by Glenn Hoover, with an opportunity for questions the evening of November 30th.




If you haven't experienced an infestation, you are



They all look to the Marine. "Private," he says.


