On September 2, 1935, Labor Day, the hurricane reached a peak intensity of 892 mb, making it the third most intense Atlantic hurricane on record. later that night as a Category 5 storm, crossing the Florida Keys between Key West and Miami, FL. As it made landfall maximum sustained winds of approximately 185 mph.
