

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
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## **Animal Shelter Passes** 9,000 Free Spays/Neuters

The Upper Keys Animal Shelter at mile marker 106, Key Largo, operated by Humane Animal Care Coalition, has provided 9,000 free spays/neuters of communityowned animals at their clinic as of August 23, 2016.

The Animal Shelter opened the clinic on July 27, 2000 to provide free spays and neuters to all the citizens living in their service area. The clinic is operated using private funds. They are happy to report the success of providing this continuous free service. which has resulted in the reduction of the number of dogs and cats coming to the

shelter. The data shows that just after 5 years of providing this service, the animal intakes were reduced by about 50%. Today they continue to see this reduction after 16 years of providing free spays; for example, last year the total dogs and cats intake was 752, compared to the intake of 1,642 dogs and cats that came to the shelter in 2001

exist to take in all unwanted and unadoptable animals. including the sick, injured and dangerous ones. It is unthinkable to turn these animals away to be abandoned in the community. Animal experts agree this is a community problem that can only be solved by responsible pet ownership and spaying and neutering your family pets.

The Shelter thanks the Upper Keys community for supporting your local animal shelter and adopting pets from the shelter. The adoption fee of \$10.00 for a spayed/neutered healthy dog or cat has not changed for over 20 years. They look forward to seeing you again at your next visit to the Animal Shelter.






## Don Moffett - 82nd Airborne Division, 5th Degree Black Belt...

The first question we locals hear from newcomers and visitors is "How long have you lived in the Keys" and the second is "What brought you here?" For Key Largo resident Don Moffett the first answer is simple, 28 years, the second answer is intriguing.

Moffett is originally from New York City. He joined the Army and was stationed in Ft. Brag in the 82nd Airborne Division of the Army Paratroopers from 1951 to 1954. During that time, this fearless guy jumped out of an airplane 13 times. After the service he went back to work as an iron worker. Climbing planks of hot metal and dangling from sky scrapers for 35 years is no big deal when you aren't afraid of heights, right?

During that time he met his good friend, Joe Hess, the former heavy weight full contact Karate champion. Don took Karate lessons from him, earning his 5th degree black belt. At that time Joe Hess owned a piece of paradise in Key Largo and Don and his family visited him here.

Soon Don and his friends retired and all started moving down here.

Moffett had joined the South Florida Chapter of the 82nd Airborne and about 15 years ago brought the chapter to march in the Key Largo 4th of July parade. They have done it every year since. Originally there were 15 paratroopers marching for us, but now they are down to just 5, with Moffett driving the truck. Since he had an operation on his ankle he can no longer

Don raised 3 children, 2 adopted sons and a beautiful biological daughter. He has been married to his lovely wife Phyllis for 32 years. Over the years he has appeared in movies with his friend Joe Hess who, by the way, got his ass kicked by Kevin Kostner in the movie "The Bodyguard!"

When Moffett was in his late 20s he discovered that he and drinking alcohol did not mix, he says, "much like Mentos and Diet Coke cause an eruption similar to Mt. Vesuvius." Don joined Alcoholics Anonymous and has been sober for 52 years. Over the years he sponsored many people in AA, one of which was Dion DiMucci, a famous singer song writer known as Dion and the Belmonts who has been sober 43 years. Moffett sends Dion a medallion each year to celebrate his AA birthday. He continues to sponsor people who need help.

Moffett designed the 82nd Airborne's license plate. The proceeds go to the state homes for Veterans Trust Fund, a measure that was sponsored by the late, great former Rep. Ken Sorensen in 2003.

Moffett is 82 now and in very good shape for his age. We thank him for his service to our country and his continuing support of our community.



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


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## The Poohpocalypse. It's for Real!

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

Crepes, what a delicious recipe to prepare! Savory or sweet, the varieties of how they can be served are numerous. Prepared as a main course, they can be filled with meat, seafood, or cheese. My favorite way to present a crepe is as a dessert. A dessert crepe can be filled with fruit, ice cream, or something as simple as Nutella.

#### CREPES

- $1\frac{1}{2}$  cups all purpose flour
- 1 tablespoon sugar
- ½ teaspoon baking powder
- $\frac{1}{2}$  teaspoon salt
- 2 cups whole milk
- 2 eggs
- 2 tablespoons melted unsalted butter
- ½ teaspoon vanilla extract

Droppings vegetable oil

Mix together the flour, sugar, baking powder, and salt. Stir in the remaining ingredients. Beat until smooth.

The trick to preparing crepes is temperature and technique. Place an 8" sauté pan on your stove top with the temperature at medium to medium high. Lightly coat the pan with a small pat of butter or a little vegetable oil. Pour in ¼ cup of the batter and rotate the pan until the batter is round and uniform in thickness. Place back on the stove top and cook until the edges began to curl, carefully flip the crepe to lightly brown on the opposite side. Separate each crepe with wax paper until it is time to fill them. Often the first or even second crepe might not be prefect, but they are a tasty treat for the chef while making the remaining crepes. Enjoy!
