### Interview with Vincent Tubiana, Esquire

Vincent Tubiana is a local attornev who has created quite a name for himself in the Upper Keys and Miami and comes highly recommended. We at the Coconut Telegraph thought our readers would enjoy his story.

CT - You grew up in the Keys? VT - Yes. Although I was born in Paris, France, I grew up and lived the majority of my life between Islamorada and Key Largo. I attended elementary school, and high school at Island Christian School, graduating in 1995. The Keys was a wonderful place to grow up.

CT - You were inspired by the late great Attorney Russ Cullen? VT - I was privileged to first meet Russ while I was in high school. I was close friends with his sons and we spent many weekends on the water. It was during this time that Russ first sparked my interested in the law. Over the years, while I was in college, we would have many conversations about the law as a profession. He was a big influence in my decision to ultimately go to enroll in law school.

CT - Where did you attend law

VT - Even though the Keys were home, I wanted a change of scenery. Never having been to the state. I drove over 1.500 miles and moved to Oklahoma to attend the University of Tulsa. Looking back, It was the best decision I could have ever made. I was very fortunate to have had wonderful professors who took a great interest in their craft and made it a point to always be available for questions, or simply to discuss the law and its eventual real world application.

Law school is known for having a cutthroat environment. However, that was not my experience as I made so many wonderful friends that I still spend

time with to this day. Although I never became used to the crazy weather (High of 82° and low of 24°), the Sooner State will always hold a place close to my heart!

CT - Why did you choose per-

sonal injury to specialize in? VT - I decided to specialize in personal injury after a close friend of mine became seriously injured. I began assisting with his case and was first exposed to the great power wielded by insurance companies. Although he paid premiums every single month, the moment he needed his insurance carrier to compensate him for his claims, he was denied any relief. The insurance carrier refused to provide him with reasonable value for his injuries. Instead, the carrier drew the process out as long as possible. I realized that this was the M.O. of the insurance company - frustrate the claimant so that they eventually either go away and abandon their claim, or accept a minimal offer. The only chance my friend had to level the playing field was to hire an attorney to vigorously represent his interests. It was this experience - the ability to have a real impact in someone's life that ultimately led me to spending the majority of time representing individuals who have been injured in car accidents, slip and falls and medical malpractice actions.

CT - Are you limited to just personal injury?

VT - It's not the only type of law that I practice. In addition to personal injury, I also represent individuals in the area of criminal defense, landlord/tenant, wills/trusts, worker's compensation, social security disability, commercial litigation, family law, and several other areas. The reason the Keys is a nice place to practice is that in such

a small community, you cannot specialize in a single area. You must diversify your practice. As a result, as an attorney, you must stay sharp by constantly staying current with various areas of law so that you are familiar with any changes. Although I spend the majority of time representing individuals in personal injury cases, I enjoy the opportunity to represent individuals in other matters. The diversification is not only interesting, but helps one become a better attorney.

CT - You and David Hutchinson

make a great team, I hear. VT - David Hutchison has been my partner since 2005. However, well before that (in 2000), I was answering telephones in David's office. I was trying to decide whether I really wanted to enter this industry, or perhaps pursue a Ph.D. in Sociology, and continue in that field. After spending a few months learning under David, going to court with him, and assisting him in trials, I knew that I wanted to become an attorney David ran a very busy general practice, so this is where I was first exposed to many areas of the law. I was able to get much experience in both criminal and civil matters that I would not have had in other offices or working for the State. David taught me not only how to practice law, but also the business aspect of being an attorney. This is not taught in law school and is necessary to maintaining a successful practice. The practice of law goes well beyond the classroom.

CT - You also have a lot of cases in Miami?

VT - I have an office in Miami as well as the practice David Hutchison and I maintain. I split my time between the Keys and Miami depending the case load for a particular week.



CT - What exactly is personal injury? Chasing ambulances? VT - Personal Injury is, essentially, the practice of law that assists individuals who are injured by others in making a claim to recover the damages to which they are entitled. In English, it is helping others make a claim against the negligent party that caused them harm. Usually, it is making a claim against an insurance carrier, or filing a lawsuit and attempting to convince a jury that the Defendant injured your client, and that your client should be compensated for those injuries. While chasing an ambulance may seem like good business sense, it is unethical conduct and strictly forbidden by the Florida Bar! It is considered solicitation, and is a big "no-no"! An attorney could face serious trouble from the Bar if he or she literally followed prospective clients to the hospital and attempted to sign them up. While you are, of course, allowed to visit clients in the hospital, you cannot walk the halls to attempt to get new business.




This traveling troubadour is a great fan of the Beatles and Led Zepplin, and hits from the 60s and 70s, but his taste is all over

The month of February brings a time of love and romance as Valentine's Day approaches. One of my favorite ways to celebrate this holiday is with a special dinner. My favorite part of the dinner is the dessert, especially if it is a chocolate dessert. A friend of mine shared this delicious but easy recipe with me that really ends the meal on a high note. Try it for Valentine's Day or any other time of the year. Enjoy!

### "SIXTY SECOND" CHOCOLATE MOUSSE

- 1 cup semi-sweet chocolate chips
- 2 eggs, separated
- 1 teaspoon vanilla OR 1 tablespoon of a liqueur such as Grand Marnier, Amaretto, Kahlua, or Crème de Menthe
- 1 cup heavy cream

Place the chocolate chips, egg yolks, and flavoring in a food processor or blender. Scald the cream in a small saucepan until little bubbles form around the edge. (DO NOT BOIL.)

With the machine running, pour in the hot cream. Blend one minute. Pour the mousse into four serving bowls and cover with plastic wrap.

For a lighter mousse, beat the two egg whites until they form soft peaks. Gently fold into the mousse before pouring into the serving bowls.

Cool in the fridge for several hours.

travels throughout Monroe County, connecting artists and community.


