

I love raw fish. Sushi. The Bagel Roll - salmon, cream cheese, scallions, and rice rolled in seaweed... delicious. Originally there were only two restaurants serving sushi in Key Largo, Num Thai at MM 103 and Sushi Nami at MM 99. Num Thai has always been the locals favorite, and when Sushi Nami was cited by the Health Department, many of us locals were not surprised.

Right after that, two new sushi restaurants opened in Key Largo, Sushi Saki, a restaurant chain from Miami, and Key Thai. My friend and I made it a point to visit both new places and neither can begin to compare with Num Thai. We enjoyed the decor and our fantastic waitress Melissa at Sushi Sake in the Pink Plaza and the food was fair but the prices were high and portions smaller than what we are used to... and then my friend became ill after we left. At Key Thai in the Waldorf Plaza, our fish tasted like it was old and on the verge of going bad. Although we did not get sick, we are not going back there.

Nothing beats Num Thai.
They have been in business

over 20 years and they live in Key Largo. When the radio station was awarding "Best of the Upper Keys" awards, they won every year in their category. Their menu is the largest and you will see many other restaurant owners dining there too. Call in an order to go and it will be ready when you get there: 305-451-5955.

The absolute best new restaurant in town is the Blackwater Siren, located on Yacht Club Drive just under the Jewfish Creek Bridge (next to the Anchorage) and across the water from Gilbert's Resort. Stop in and meet the owners, Jessi and Chef Lolo. Enjoy cocktails in their screened in tiki bar, and watch the sunset over Blackwater Sound. At Blackwater Siren, locals get 20% off thru the month of May. See their ad on page 4, and for more details check out their Facebook page or call 305-780-7382.

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


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John Shirila

John was an army veteran, serving in the Vietnam war. Those close to him knew a warm, kind, joyous soul and always saw the best in every situation and person. He is gone but never forgotten.

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Walter Minor "Scott" Berwick - A Patriot's Life

November 10, 1940 - April 15, 2017

Born on November 10, 1940, in Philadelphia, Scott graduated from Upper Darby H.S. and enlisted in the Navy in 1957. He served as an Electronics Technician in the Submarine Service (Diesel) attaining the rank of Petty Officer 2nd

Class

In 1961 Scott transferred to the Naval Reserve Submarine Division while he attended Fairleigh Dickinson University in NJ, where he received his BA in Political Science in 1965. (In 2009, Scott received an Honorary Doctorate from the University for his distinguished career.)

Scott was appointed an Ensign in the Naval Reserve and attached to the Submarine Division in Washington, D.C. where he later attained the rank of Lieutenant JG. In 1967, he was assigned as a Foreign Service Officer for the CIA.

Scott became legendary in the annals of the CIA's classified history as he was personally involved in challenging and thwarting the spread of Soviet and Cuban influence in the Caribbean, South and Central America as well as the Far East during the Cold War.

Scott attained the rank of SIS-2 (the military equivalent of an Army Major General) before

he retired in 1990 He received many achieve ment awards.

In 1990, Scott started his own business, BPA Berwick, specializing in hostage negotiations worldwide. One of Scott's cases on which he worked later became the basis for the movie "Proof of

Life" with Meg Ryan and Russell After 9/11, Scott was again

sought for service by his country, personally involved in tracking and eliminating Al-Qaeda in Afghanistan, Africa, the Middle East, Latin America and the Philippine Islands. He also worked at Guantanamo Bay for several months obtaining information from the terrorists responsible for 9/11. In addition, he was part of a group of career CIA professionals training young officers in D.C. and Virginia.

In June of 1994, Scott married his current wife, Christie Jean "C.J." Berwick, co-owner of The Fish House and The Fish House Encore restaurants in Key Largo.

Scott is survived by C.J., his wife, four children, two stepchildren, and seven grandchildren.

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
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4 Local Churches Battle Iguanas

Named in honor of Charles Darwin, the father of evolution, these awards commemorate those who improve our gene pool by removing themselves from it.

Semifinalist #1:



Semifinalist #4:

A man in Alabama died from rattlesnake bites. It seems that he and a friend were playing a game of catch, using the rattlesnake as a ball. The friend - no doubt a future Darwin Awards candidate - was hospitalized.

Semifinalist #5:

Employees in a mediumsized warehouse in west Texas noticed the smell of a gas leak. Sensibly, management evacuated the building extinguishing all potential sources of ignition; lights, power, etc.

After the building had been evacuated, two technicians from the gas company were dispatched. Upon entering the building, they found they had difficulty navigating in the dark. To their frustration, none of

the lights worked. Witnesses later described the sight of one of the technicians reaching into his pocket and retrieving an object that resembled a cigarette lighter! Upon operation of the lighter-like object, the gas in the warehouse exploded, sending pieces of it up to three miles away.

Nothing was found of the technicians, but the lighter was virtually untouched by the explosion. The technician suspected of causing the blast had never been thought of as "bright" by his peers.

Now, the winner of this year's Darwin Award (awarded, as always, posthumously):

The Arizona Highway Patrol came upon a pile of smoldering metal embedded in the side of a cliff rising above the road at the apex of a curve. The wreckage resembled the site of an airplane crash, but it was a car. The type of car was unidentifiable at the scene.

Police investigators

finally pieced together the mystery. An amateur rocket scientist had somehow gotten hold of a JATO bottle (Jet Assisted Take Off, actually a solid fuel rocket) that is used to give heavy military transport planes an extra 'push' for taking off from short airfields. He had driven his Chevy Impala out into the desert and found a long, straight stretch of road. He attached the JATO unit to the car, jumped in, got up some speed and fired off the JATO!

The facts as best as could be determined are that the operator of the 1967 Impala hit the JATO ignition at a distance of

approximately 3.0 miles from the crash site. This was established by the scorched and melted asphalt at that location.

The JATO, if operating properly, would have reached maximum thrust within 5 seconds, causing the Chevy to reach speeds well in excess of 350 mph and continuing at full power for an additional 20 -25 seconds.

The driver, and soon to be pilot, would have experienced G-forces usually reserved for dog fighting F-14 jocks under full afterburners, causing him to become irrelevant for the remainder of the event.

However, the automobile remained on the straight highway for about 2.5 miles (15-20 seconds) before the driver applied and completely melted the brakes, blowing the tires and leaving thick rubber marks on the road surface, then becoming airborne for an additional 1.4 miles and impacting the cliff face at a height of 125 feet leaving a blackened crater 3 feet deep in the rock.

Most of the driver's remains were not recoverable. However, small fragments of bone, teeth and hair were extracted from the crater, and fingernail and bone shards were removed from a piece of debris believed to be a portion of the steering wheel.


Epilogue: It has been calculated that this moron attained a ground speed of approximately 420-mph, though much of his voyage was not actually on the ground.

We have been experiencing this year's spring. Though we have had some wind, it still is a nice time of year... before the heat of summer approaches. This is also the month that we celebrate Mother's Day. which is May 14th. Many moms are celebrated by a special brunch or dinner topped off with a tasty dessert. The pie recipe below is slightly different in that it combines chocolate with the taste of orange and is quite yummy. So prepare it for a special event or any night of the week Enjoy!

CHOCOLATE FUDGE AND ORANGE PIE

4 ounces unsweetened chocolate, cut into pieces

10 tablespoons unsalted butter

2 large eggs, plus 2 large egg yolks

 $1\frac{3}{4}$ cup sugar

 $\frac{1}{4}$ teaspoon salt

1 teaspoon vanilla extract

½ cup orange juice (or you may use Grand Marnier)

2 tablespoons orange marmalade One 9-inch frozen pie crust

Powdered sugar and whipped cream for serving

Defrost and prebake the pie crust according to the instructions on the package. Place aside. Meanwhile, melt the chocolate and butter in a sauce pan on low heat. Set aside. In a bowl, combine the eggs, yolks, sugar, salt, vanilla extract, and flour. Whisk to combine. Whisk in the orange juice, marmalade, and the chocolate

Pour into the pie crust and bake in a preheated 375° oven for 45 minutes. If the edges of the pie appear to darken too quickly, just cover with strips of foil. Cool completely.

Sprinkle on the powdered sugar and serve with a dollop of whipped
