Thank you little Jose for the roof fix. I can sleep without worrying the roof will fall in during the heavy thunder storms we have been having.

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

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## Letter to the Editor

"RENTERS BEWARE'

local professionals have been confronted with an issue when deciding on a place to call home. Though our Florida Keys have been paradise for many throughout the decades, we continue to experience housing issues. Renters doing their homework will soon learn that many of the rentals here in Monroe County are owned by absentee landlords or slumlords demanding high rents for properties that renters soon learn provide substandard hous-

Further, our community has paid taxes for moderate housing for our locals, even though these moderate housing facilities have tossed out our local professionals and replaced them with Section 8 families from Miami-Dade and other counties, causing many charitable sources to fall below operating ability for local families. In many of these situations, our professionals here in Monroe

County providing emergency services, such as police officers, EMTs, nurses, mental health and other social services counselors, and fire rescue personnel are leaving Monroe County like a mass exodus as a direct result of experiencing the effects of being prev to such unstable and substandard living conditions. In many cases, renters are subjected high rents, loss of security deposits, living without air conditioning, heat and other dire necessities, only to find themselves in a position to incur legal fees after being defrauded of the comfort of stable housing.

However, homeowners seem confident that the legal system will back them, despite such substandard conditions. Tenants pay high rents in a timely manner and, in many situations even upgrade these properties that have been left unattended, especially in cases when absentee landlords are those who have inherited properties, have never been members of, nor

contributed to, this community, yet remain in violation of State and Federal housing laws, directly resulting in the loss of our local professionals contributing to our community for many years.

Even longtime elderly & disabled members of our community fall prey to these illegal tactics.

Homeowners may feel that this is not their problem, but the fact is that our Florida Keys community is changing rapidly as drugs and crime infiltrate what we know as "home". No one will be experiencing paradise in this county much longer, should this trend continue, leaving only drug dealers and criminal element, while losing the very emergency responders needed to address these issues in our community, especially our police officers. nurses and mental health and substance professionals. The final result, if left unaddressed, will result in the reality that no one will be living in Paradise much longer. -C.Leroux



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## Artist of the Month: Kimberly Lahr



Kimberly Lahr has lived in Islamorada FL for the last seven years, and two years ago discovered scuba diving. The sport opened up a whole new world for her. as she discovered an underwater environment where there's an infinite number of living creatures.

As an artist Kimberly moved by things that elicit strong emotions, especially moved by the beauty of animal life that she observes in the ocean. And....as you can see, especially sea turtles. She does paint other animals, (sea horses, sting rays, and jellyfish), but she says she's just getting started.

"That's the thing about the ocean. I will never become complacent because there are so many things to paint, and every new one I discover is a challenge. And I love challenges, they keep me excited about my subject matter, and what I paint. I believe that as an artist, or whatever it is that you do, you need something in your life that makes you excited to get up each morning."

Kimberly tells a short story: "One day while snorkeling, I wasn't looking where I was going and I bumped into a sea turtle. I guess she wasn't paying attention either. We were both startled by this incident, and we looked at each other, just for a second, and then the turtle took off. Now, when I'm in the water, I always look for sea turtles. They are so beautiful, the way they glide through the water."

Kimberley's philosophy on art is simple. She thinks art should be about what moves a person. It should be something that when you view it, it makes you feel good. Many of us have heard artists, whether it be painters, writers, or the performing arts. go into long tirades explaining why they do what they do. After all the talk, we have a hard time retaining, or recalling what in the heck they just said. It's like a doctor speaking in medical jargon, and you say, "Could you just give it to me in layman's terms." Kimberly does!

Lahr's opinion, is that that art should not be bought just because it matches the color of the walls, or furniture.

She also believes that art shouldn't be seen as precious or permanent. She says, "I like to change things up a bit depending on the time of year, or my mood. For example, if I have a painting of a winter scene, I will take it down, and hang something different as the seasons change."

Kimberley also thinks that art should be priced so that someone with an average income can afford it. Although, she smiles and says, "Ok, if I become another Picasso, I might charge a little more."

To wrap this up, Kimberly says, "I hope you enjoy viewing my turtles. I hope it makes you feel something, because isn't that what art is all about?"

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## A Blast from Our Conch Republic Past

This month we came across a piece of history in the creation of the Conch Republic. Just a few weeks after the Border Patrol put up a roadblock and the Conch Republic was formed in April of 1982, a south Florida group called The Blue Waters Band was performing

in the Keys and decided to write a song commemorating the event, the Hymn of the Conch Republic. It became the Conch Republic's National Anthem!

Members of the band, since 1979, have been Brett Dolar, Jim Pardinas, Rick Doane, Dave Ruiter, Gary Dees, Dave Mishkin, and Steve Marshall.

The band was presented the Key to the City of Key West from then Mayor and Conch Republic Prime Minister Dennis Wardlow, upon presenting them with the song. Blue Waters Band then traveled to the Upper Keys and performed the song at numerous events, such as the Conch Republic cabinet meeting (mentioned below).

Based in South Miami, the band also opened their own place and named it "The North Key" because Key West and Key Largo were already taken! They performed the song every year for the Chamber of Commerce events in Key West during anniversaries of the The Conch Republic Days, and on other Keys every April over the years.

When preparing a night's meal, a nice change is a stir fry. The beauty of a Chinese stir fry is that it is relatively easy (the chopping is the most time consuming part of the preparation) and you can use a variety of vegetables based on your taste. Try to avoid the pre-pack Chinese vegetables as I have found the packages contain more cabbage than actual Chinese vegetables themselves. I placed in this meal some of my favorite vegetables but you can add or replace with such items as bamboo shoots, green/red pepper, mushrooms, or even broccoli. If you are in the mood for a stir fry, try this recipe. I promise that you will not be disappointed. This meal will serve two people.



Stir Fry Tip: Pay attention to your veggies before tossing 'em into the pan. Cook thicker and harder vegetables first, since they take longer. For example, tomatoes or thin slices of garlic will burn while sturdy carrots and broccoli are taking their time getting tender. The key is to keep it moving.

During the day continue to squeeze the bag, mixing the ingredients. In the evening, when ready to begin the preparation, slice the onion and peeled carrots. Pull the strings out of the pea pods. Set aside. Remove the chicken from the bag discarding the marinade. Slice the chicken into lengthwise strips. Heat a wok or large skillet with the peanut oil on medium high heat. When the oil is hot, add the chicken slices and brown lightly, the center of the slices should remain pink. Remove the chicken from the pan.

Add the onion, carrots and pea pods to the pan (add extra oil if necessary). Cook the vegetables until al dente. Remove the vegetables from the pan. Return the pan to the stove and add one can of chicken stock and the 2 tablespoons of cornstarch. Stir well until the cornstarch is dissolved. Add the other can of the broth and the remaining 2 tablespoons of the teriyaki sauce. Stir well. Reduce heat and cover until the cornstarch taste is no longer there. Return the meat and vegetables to the pan and cook until the meat is no longer pink. Mix in the water chestnuts, baby corn, and beansprouts.

Cook until all is heated and serve on the rice. Enjoy!
