





In the last few years, Rodney has taught himself glass etching and is proficient at that too! He loves the challenge of something new and guarantees satisfaction.





Getting Ourselves Worked Up

Often we get anxiety for no reason, as we are almost always stronger and more capable than we believe ourselves to be.

Our capacity to cope successfully with life's challenges far outstrips our capacity to feel nervousness. Yet in the weeks, days, and hours leading up to an event that we believe will test our limits, we can become nervous. While we may have previously regarded ourselves as equal to the trials that lie ahead, we reach a point at which they near and our anxiety begins to mount.

We then become increasingly worked up, until the moment of truth arrives and we discover that our worry was all for nothing. We are almost always stronger and more capable than we believe ourselves to be. But anxiety is not rational in nature, which means that in most cases we cannot work through it using logic as our only tool.

Reason can help us recognize the relative futility of unwarranted worry but, more often than not, we will find more comfort in patterns of thought and activity that redirect our attention to practical or engaging matters.

Most of us find it remarkably difficult to focus on two distinct thoughts or emotions

at once, and we can use this natural human limitation to our advantage when trying to stay centered in the period leading up to a potentially tricky experience.

When we concentrate on something unrelated to our worry, such as deep breathing, visualizations of success, pleasurable pursuits, or exerciseóanxiety dissipates naturally. Meditation is also a useful coping mechanism as it provides us with a means to ground ourselves in the moment. Our guides can aid us by providing us with a focal point wholly outside of our own sphere.

The intense emotional flare-up you experience just before you are set to challenge yourself is often a mixture of both excitement and fear. When you take steps to eliminate the fear, you can more fully enjoy the excitement. Though you may find it difficult to avoid getting worked up, your awareness of the forces acting on your feelings will help you return to your center and accept that few hurdles you will face will be as high as they at first appear.

The Ten Legal Commandments of Photography

As Publisher of the paper, I get asked often if it is legal for me to take photos of people in public. The answer, for the most part, is yes and here is why.

- Anyone in a public place can take pictures of anything they want. Public places include parks, sidewalks, malls, etc. Malls? Yeah. Even though it's technically private property, being open to the public makes it public space.
- 2. If you are on public property, you can take pictures of private property. If a building, for example, is visible from the sidewalk, it's fair game.
- 3. If you are on private property and are asked not to take pictures, you are obligated to honor that request. This includes posted signs.
- Sensitive government buildings (military bases, nuclear facilities) can prohibit photography if it is deemed a threat to national security.
- 5. People can be photographed if they are in public (without their consent) unless they have secluded themselves and can expect a reasonable degree of privacy. Kids swimming in a fountain?
 Okay. Somebody entering their PIN at the ATM? Not okay.
- 6. The following can almost always be photographed from public places, despite popular opinion:
 - accident & fire scenes, criminal activities

- bridges & other infrastructure, transportation facilities (i.e. airports)
- industrial facilities,
 Superfund sites
- public utilities, residential & commercial buildings
 children, celebrities, law
- enforcement officersUFOs the Loch Ness
- Monster, etc.

 7. Although "security" is often
- given as the reason somebody doesn't want you to take photos, it's rarely valid. Taking a photo of a publicly visible subject does not constitute terrorism, nor does it infringe on a company's trade secrets.
- 8. If you are challenged, you do not have to explain why you are taking pictures, nor do you have to disclose your identity (except in some cases when questioned by a law enforcement officer.)
- Private parties have very limited rights to detain you against your will, and can be subject to legal action if they harass you.
- 10. If someone tries to confiscate your camera and/or film, you don't have to give it to them. If they take it by force or threaten you, they can be liable for things like theft and coercion. Even law enforcement officers need a court order.

Dealing with Loss

wrote the following heartfelt plea online. "My friend just died. I don't know what to do."

Many people responded. Then there's one old guy's incredible comment that stood out from the rest that might just change the way we look at life and death:

"Alright, here goes. I'm old. What that means is that I've survived (so far) and a lot of people I've known and loved did not. I've lost friends, best friends, acquaintances, co-workers, grandparents, mom, relatives, teachers, mentors, students, neighbors, and a host of other folks. I have no children, and I can't imagine the pain it must be to lose a child. But here's my two cents.

"I wish I could say you get used to people dying. I never did. I don't want to. It tears a hole through me whenever somebody I love dies, no matter the circumstances. But I don't want it to "not matter".

"I don't want it to be something that just passes. My scars and it's different for everyare a testament to the love and the relationship that I had for and with that person. And if the scar is deep, so was the love. So be it. Scars are a testament to life. Scars are a testament that I can love deeply and live deeply and be cut, or even gouged, and that I can heal and continue to live and continue to love. And the scar tissue is stronger than the original flesh ever was. Scars are a testament to life. Scars are only ugly to people who can't see.

"As for grief, you'll find it comes in waves. When the ship is first wrecked, you're drowning, with wreckage all around you. Everything floating around you reminds you of the beauty and the magnificence of the ship that was, and is no more. And all you can do is float. You

Recently, someone on reddit find some piece of the wreckage and you hang on for a while. Maybe it's some physical thing. Maybe it's a happy memory or a photograph. Maybe it's a person who is also floating. For a while, all you can do is float. Stay alive.

"In the beginning, the waves are 100 feet tall and crash over you without mercy. They come 10 seconds apart and don't even give you time to catch your breath. All you can do is hang on and float. After a while, maybe weeks, maybe months, you'll find the waves are still 100 feet tall, but they come further apart. When they come, they still crash all over you and wipe you out. But in between, you can breathe, you can function. You never know what's going to trigger the grief. It might be a song, a picture, a street intersection, the smell of a cup of coffee. It can be just about anything...and the wave comes crashing. But in between waves, there is life.

"Somewhere down the line, body, you find that the waves are only 80 feet tall. Or 50 feet tall. And while they still come, they come further apart. You can see them coming. An anniversary, a birthday, or Christmas, or landing at O'Hare. You can see it coming, for the most part, and prepare yourself. And when it washes over you, you know that somehow you will, again, come out the other side. Soaking wet, sputtering, still hanging on to some tiny piece of the wreckage, but you'll come out.

"Take it from an old guy. The waves never stop coming, and somehow you don't really want them to. But you learn that you'll survive them. And other waves will come. And you'll survive them too. If you're lucky, you'll have lots of scars from lots of loves. And lots of shipwrecks."







THE STUFFING BOX

For those arriving to the Gilbert's party fashionably late, you can park on the

main access road and take the FREE air-conditioned shuttle to and from

Gilbert's on Saturdays and Sundays from noon-8pm.

What, you may ask, is the stuffing box? Ok, how about the packing gland? It has other names to be sure, to me it's a giant pain in my

Good play on words huh? Alright, the stuffing box is where your boat's drive shaft goes through the hull, you know where that little spinning thing is, which makes the boat move. Of course this is only if you have an inboard motor. What the stuffing box consists of is a large rubber tube attached to the drive shaft with hose clamps and a metal plate at one end, on the inside the metal plate has threads and a couple of large

Now, these nuts are what control the lubrication of your drive shaft, so it doesn't get overheated and burn up your engine, which is a bad thing. Inside one of the nuts is a space for a product called "Flax" which is square braided rope impregnated with wax and lubricant. This should keep the water on the outside of the boat. When you run your boat it should, and usually, drips, a drip every ten seconds is ok.

Mine is gushing now, it's a shower if you could stand under it! Luckily this thing is in the aft bilge, so as long as my bilge pump holds out, She Breeze keeps floating. I do so get tired of the sound of

major dripping, my bunk is above the bilge area. Drip. drip, drip... you get the picture, I have to tighten the nuts up.

Ok, I've pulled up the floorboard and yes it's still gushing, I've got two large and very heavy pipe wrenches of the day, YES, it's still to loosen the packing nut from the locking nut. Did I mention these wrenches are f---ing heavy? It's not WORKING, I finally gave in and found my hammer. That did the trick, now I've got more water gushing in, PLEASE bilge pump don't give up on me now!

Ok according to the video I watched, I just have to turn the packing nut righty tighty, to get it to stop gushing. What, may I ask, am I to hold on to while turning the blasted nut? Oh goody, the rubber boot thing with hose clamps that love to cut my hands up, here I go, quar-



He showed his surprise and asked, "What kind of bets?"


The elderly woman replied, "Well, I bet you \$25,000 that your testicles are square."

PORK CHOPS AND RICE

2 cups instant rice

1 10.5 oz can onion soup

1 cup water

1 Tbsp. butter

2-4 thin-to-medium thick pork chops Frozen vegetable of your choice

(peas, corn, green beans).

Garlic powder to taste

Generous sprinkle of Italian Seasonings Salt/pepper

In a large sauté pan, add the can of soup and cup of water, pad of butter, and bring to a boil. Stir in rice, reduce heat, and place the pork chops on top of the rice. Sprinkle the seasonings over the chops, spread a single layer of the vegetable on top, and cover.

Cook on medium heat until the rice has soaked up the water and the chops are cooked through. You may have to stir in just a small amount of water if the chops take a little longer to cook.
