





Singing is an act of vibration. It takes music from the realm of the unformed-- whether that is in your mind or from that magical space of inspiration--and moves it from within to without.






Catch Rogue Theory at Gilbert's Before They're Gone!

Koala for Sale





My husband created this delicious but easy soup. It is better if prepared the day before, and we found that mixing the onions such as yellow, sweet, and red make a nice combination.



PAUL'S FRENCH ONION SOUP

- $\frac{1}{4}$ stick of butter
- 3 to 5 finely chopped garlic gloves
- 1 large diced onion 5 cans of beef broth
- 3 cans of consume
- $1\frac{1}{2}$ cans of water
- 5 large sliced onions
- 2 tablespoons of catsup
- 2 tablespoons Worcestershire sauce
- Sprinkle of salt
- Sprinkle of cayenne pepper Freshly ground black pepper ¹/₂ cup of sherry (optional)

Melt the butter in a large stockpot. Sautee the garlic and diced onion. Add the remaining ingredients. Bring to a boil. Then simmer until the onions are tender. Refrigerate overnight then heat the next day.

Cut French bread into $\frac{1}{2}$ inch slices. Lightly spread extra virgin olive oil on each side and sprinkle with granulated garlic. Bake under a low broiler until slightly browned on both sides.

Ladle the soup into oven proof crocks placing the bread on the top. Add a slice of mozzarella on the top of the bread and broil until the cheese is melted and bubbly. Enjoy!
