Everglades Science Center Benefit Concert at Cafe Moka!

Please join us Friday November 16th at Café Moka in Tavernier for a night of food, fun, and live music! Doors open at 6pm and the music starts at 7pm. The audience will have the opportunity to participate in a silent auction that will include two large John James Audubon prints graciously donated by Audubon Florida. The Everglades Science Center (ESC) was established in Tavernier in 1939, by National Audubon's first Director of Research, Robert Porter Allen, Allen began a full-time study of the Roseate Spoonbill, living among them in a tent for weeks at a time. His research changed the way scientists studied birds. He began almost 80 years of data collection investigating the spoonbill and its habitat which is the founda-



tion for critical decision making in restoration work

Combined with this, ESC scientists are studying the flow of freshwater into Florida Bay and the impacts that diversion of this water has had throughout the Everglades ecosystem.

Dr. Jerry Lorenz continues the Roseate Spoonbill studies today, working with staff and volunteers to collect nesting information across Florida Bay. Data analyses show shifts in nesting distribution due to habitat destruction in the Keys. Lorenz has demonstrated spoonbill sensitivity to changes in the quantity and quality of their foraging habitat, and this led to the spoonbills being added as an "indicator species" to the Everglades Restoration Plan.
