
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Editorial: Ugly, Useless Toadfish

FEMA was ready with people to work Electrical companies came in from New York


And in the midst of all this debris Another storm emerged named Hurricane Marie

You could hear us exclaim as we drove out of sight "The hell with this place, Montana's just right!"





In lieu of going out, we like to pick up a rotisserie chicken. With it being just the two of us there is of course leftovers. The last time we had a precooked chicken we sliced off some of the breast meat and served it with a starch and a vegetable for dinner. For the stew, we removed the remaining meat from the bones and set aside. This is an easy dish that is cooked on the stove top making the stew a great boater's dinner. I even had enough chicken left over to make chicken salad sandwiches for a lunch.

EASY CHICKEN STEW

1 large onion, sliced Pat of butter $\frac{1}{4}$ cup of flour One 10.5 oz can of chicken broth (or more if needed) 1 bag of frozen mixed vegetables Shredded chicken

(as much or little as you like)

Melt the butter in a large skillet. Add the onion slices and sauté until slightly soft. Sprinkle in the flour coating the onion slices. Stir well. Add the chicken broth and continue to stir. Bring to a boil then reduce the heat to a simmer. Cover the pan and cook out the flour taste stirring occasionally. Add the mixed vegetables and the shredded chicken. Cook until the vegetables are thawed and the chicken is hot. It is ready to serve over biscuits or your choice of bread on the side. Now that is easy and tasty. Enjoy!

"I just don't know what to do."

I hear this phrase over and over from clients and students. I sense both desperation and anxiety as they search for a solution or advice.

It's as if they are asking for an emotional pain reliever something to ease their suffering.

In those moments, I want to leap into action and solve the problem. But my job is usually to ask questions, not give answers.

Last week I asked a student who was feeling lost and confused: "What specifically is on the other side of your roadblock?"

The response was an outpouring of clear and heartfelt desires along with an admission of how they sabotaged their healing.

Suddenly the "what to do" was very clear to them.

Return to the driver's seat of your healing journey rather than the passenger seat. Or worse, stop being the nail in your own tire.

When you abandon your needs in pursuit of making someone else responsible for your needs, you've lost yourself. And once you're lost, "I don't know" can become a common refrain.

Going from lost to found is a profound journey. And even with a clear map, the travel conditions are not always predictable or quaranteed.

Be patient with yourself and trust that the answers will come as long as you're asking the questions In the case of my student, they knew enough to ask for additional help, which led to the next breakthrough and a bit of guidance from me to get back on track.

Monkey Mind

According to Buddhist principles, the "monkey mind" is a term that refers to being unsettled, restless, or confused. Writer and Buddhist Natalie Goldberg who teaches many writing workshops, suggests that the monkey mind is the inner critic.

It's been called the monkey mind - the endless chattering in your head as you jump in your mind from thought to thought while you daydream, analyze your relationships, or worry over the future. Eventually, you start to feel like your thoughts are spinning in circles and you're left

totally confused.

One way to tame this wild creature in your head is through meditation although the paradox is that when you clear your mind for meditation you actually invite the monkey in your mind to play. This is when you are given the opportunity to tame this mental beast by moving beyond thought - to become aware of a thought rather than thinking a thought. The difference is subtle, but significant. When you are aware of your thoughts, you can let your thoughts rise and float away without letting them pull you in different directions. Being able to concentrate is one of the tools that allows you to slow down your thought process and focus on observing your thoughts.

start by focusing on the breath while you meditate. Whenever your monkey mind starts acting up, observe your thoughts and then return your focus to your breath. Some breathing meditations call on you to focus on the rise and fall of the breath through the abdomen, while others have you concentrate on the sound of the breath. Fire can also be mesmerizing, and focusing on a candle flame is another useful tool for harnessing the mind. Keep the gaze soft and unfocused while observing the color, shape, and movement of the flame, and try not to blink. Close your eyes when you feel the need and continue watching the flame in your head. Chanting, devotional singing, and mantras also still the mind. However you choose to tame the monkey mind, do so with firm kindness. The next time the chattering arises, notice it and then allow it to go away. With practice, your monkey mind will become quiet and so will
