





Conch Captain Spotlight on

Captain Skip Bradeen

Coming Out of Quarantine With Skip Bradeen - Let The Sun Shine!

If anyone can lift our spirits and guide us to a brighter tomorrow, it's Captain Skip. It was a pleasure to visit with him for the Conch Captain of the Month Spotlight at Wahoo's, overlooking the Whale Harbor Marina. Between pickleball and a Key Largo Rotary meeting, I was grateful to have a few moments with this busy, humorous, and successful fishing icon of Islamorada.

Since 1964, Captain Skip has renewed his Captain's license consecutively 12 times (licenses are good for 5 years) and celebrates 55 years fishing out of Whale Harbor. Is that a Guinness World Record? He said, "there is only one captain in the Upper Keys that has been guiding longer, Billy Knowles, he has been fishing here 60 years." (Captain Billy, up for an interview?)

Besides being the Coconut Telegraph's "Conch Captain of July," Captain Skip was voted as one of the "50 Best Captains in the World" by Salt Water Fisherman magazine in 2014. He has won the "People's Choice Award" of the Upper Keys for 'Best Captain' 18 years running. Rumor has it, Captain Skip may be inducted into the IFGA Fishing Hall of Fame in 2021, the most prestigious worldwide award captains can receive, for his long-time dedica-

And speaking of dedication, he and his lovely wife Lisa, a sought-after wedding planner (Weddings by Lisa) give visitors a taste of this island paradise by planning a day of fishing on the Atlantic or a dream wedding event,




sometimes both. Many fishing charters book year after year with Skip. They both have dealt with 'monumental cancellations' as a result of Covid-19. He reminded me, we are not in the clear yet, and still should wear a face mask and follow social distancing guidelines now that the Keys has reopened to tourists. He is hoping that all businesses in the Keys can get back on their feet after this pandemic. As a community, we plan on closures in hurricane season, but never planned on a shut down for the height of tourist season; 2020 has been an unprecedented year.

Prior to 'living the 55-year dream' in Islamorada, Skip grew up in Long Island, New York. After high school he ioined the Air Force and served in Vietnam. He recalls talking to a buddy who was going to Florida for a vacation, some place called, "Isa-slama-doora." Call it fate, call it 'Keys Disease,' call it what you will, Skip answered the call. He went fishing one time with his buddy, was paid \$5 to mate and got a \$5 tip (and in 1964 that was a good day on the water!) and he was hooked, reeled in and the rest is history.

The "Always" was the first boat Skip owned, for "Always catches fish." Since then he has had the Blue Chip 1, The Blue Chip Too and the Blue Chip Too 2. He is looking forward to the painting and upgrades to be done soon and getting her back on the water. (You know what BOATT stands for? Break out another ten thousand!)

Captain Skip has a son, Brad, who lives in Ft. Lauderdale and works on cruise ships. He also has a daughter, Kristine, a Nova University alum, who lives in Toronto and has three daughters. He got a little twinkle in his eye when he mentioned the granddaughters.

Beginning in 1987, Captain Skip did the 'On the Water Fishing Report.' It was the daily listen for what fish are being caught, sea conditions, and weather for fisherman on the local radio stations. His report recently ended when radio station 96.9FM went off the air, just before the pandemic.



Matt Bellinger does the report on Sun FM, 103.1. He says stay tuna'd, he may do the fishing report again in the

Obviously they were thinking, "That poor old couple - all they can afford is one meal for the two of them."


As the man began to eat his fries, She answered, "the teeth."

Early Fourth of July Celebrations

In the pre-Revolutionary years, colonists had held annual celebrations of the king's birthday, which traditionally included the ringing of bells, bonfires. processions and speechmaking. By contrast, during the summer of 1776 some colonists celebrated the birth



of independence by holding mock funerals for King George III as a way of symbolizing the end of the monarchy's hold on America and the triumph of liberty.

Festivities including concerts, bonfires, parades and the firing of cannons and muskets usually accompanied the first public readings of the Declaration of Independence, beginning immediately after its adoption. Philadelphia held the first annual commemoration of independence on July 4, 1777, while Congress was still occupied with the ongoing war.

George Washington issued double rations of rum to all his soldiers to mark the anniversary of independence in 1778, and in 1781, several months before the key American victory at the Battle of Yorktown, and Massachusetts became the first state to make July 4th an official state holiday. It has been a federal holiday in the United States since 1941.

Attention Seekers: We all know at least one.

An emotionally immature person has low levels of self-esteem and selfconfidence and consequently feels insecure; to counter these feelings of insecurity they will spend a large proportion of their lives creating situations in which they become the center of attention. It may be that the need for attention is inversely proportional to emotional maturity, therefore anyone indulging in attention-seeking behaviors is telling you how emotionally immature they

Attention-seeking behav- one organizing ior is surprisingly common. Being the center of attention alleviates feelings of insecurity and inadequacy but the relief is temporary as the underlying problem remains unaddressed: low selfconfidence and low selfesteem, and consequent low levels of self-worth and self-love.

The sufferer: This might means to an end) include feigning or exaggerating illness, playing on an injury, or perhaps causing or inviting injury. The attention-seeker excels in manipulating people through their emotions, especially that of quilt. It's very difficult not to feel sorry for someone who relates a plausible tale of suffering in a sob story or "poor me" drama.

The rescuer: She's the one who will dash in and "rescue" people whenever the moment is opportune - to herself, that is. She then gains gratification from basking in the glory of her humanitarian actions. She will necessary distorted to prey on any person suffering misfortune, infirmity, illness, injury, or anyone who has a

vulnerability. The act of rescue and thus the opportunities for gaining attention can be enhanced if others are excluded from the act of rescue; this helps create a dependency relationship between the rescuer and rescued which can be exploited for further acts of rescue (and attention) later.

The organizer: She may present herself as the one in charge, the everything, the one who is reliable and dependable, the one people can always turn to. However, the objective is not to assist people (this is only a but to always be the center of

attention.

The manipulator: She may exploit family relationships, manipulating others with guilt and distorting perceptions; although she may not harm people physically, she causes everyone to suffer from an emotional injury. A common attentionseeking ploy is to claim she is this person confesses to being persecuted, victimized, excluded, isolated or ignored.

The drama queen: Every incident or opportunity, no matter how insignificant, is exploited, exaggerated and if become an event of dramatic proportions. Everything is elevated to crisis proportions.

The busy bee: This individual is the busiest person in the world if her constant retelling of her life is to be believed. Everyday events which are regarded as normal by normal people take on epic proportions as everyone is invited to simultaneously admire and commiserate with this oh-so-busy person who never has a

> has time to sit down, etc. She's never too busy, though, to tell you how busy she is.

The feigner:

counterattack - feigning victimhood strategy to manipulate everyone present, especially bystanders

and those in authority. The most effective method of feigning victimhood is to burst into tears, for most people's instinct is to feel sorry for them, to put their arm round them or offer them a tissue.

The false confessor: crimes they haven't committed in order to gain attention from the police and the media. In some cases people have confessed to being serial killers, even though they cannot provide any substantive evidence of their sucked in and nip it in the crimes. Often they will confess to crimes which have just been reported in the

media. Some individuals are know to the police as serial confessors. The false confessor is different from a person who make a false confession and admits to a crime of which they are accused because of emotional pressure and inappropriate interrogation tactics.

The abused: a person moment to herself, never claims they are the victim of abuse, sexual abuse, rape, etc. as a way of gaining attention for themselves. Crimes like abuse and rape are difficult to prove at the best of times and their incidence is so common that it is easy to make a plausible claim as a way of gaining attention.

> The victim: she may intentionally create acts of harassment against herself. for example; send herself hate mail or damage her own possessions in an attempt to incriminate a fellow employee, a family member, neighbor, etc. Scheming, cunning, devious, deceptive and manipulative, she will identify her "harasser" and produce circumstantial evidence in support of her claim. She will revel in the attention she gains and use her glib charm to plausibly dismiss any suggestion that she herself may be responsible. However, a background check may reveal that this is not the first time she has had this happen to her.

> What can you do? Don't feed the behavior by participating in the drama. Be aware when you're getting bud. A mental health professional can offer longer-term guidance and help.

The Mangrove Galley by Sandi Mieszczenski



It came out in conversation last week that we had not had fresh spinach in a while. I recalled reading about a spinach soup some months ago and decided to come up with my own version. The following dish is healthy, easy and delicious.

WHITE BEAN AND SPINACH SOUP

1 large chicken breast diced into $\frac{1}{2}$ inch cubes

1 cup chopped celery

1 cup sliced carrot

1 cup sliced onion

1 bag fresh baby spinach (5 to 9 oz. bag)

32 oz. carton of chicken broth 1 chicken bouillon cube

dissolved in a cup of water

1 15 oz. can of white beans drained and rinsed 1 Tbls. Italian seasoning

4 cloves of garlic

finely chopped fresh ground pepper to taste

1 Tbls. olive oil

1 Tbls. butter

Heat the oil and butter in a large sauce pan and add the celery, carrot, onion and garlic, stirring until the mixture begins to soften. Dissolve the bouillon cube in a cup of boiling water. If you are following a salt reduction program you can skip this ingredient. Pour the chicken broth and the cup of bouillon into the sauce pan with the Italian seasoning and bring to a boil. Remove from the heat and let stand for 15 to 20 minutes so the flavors can mesh. Return to the heat and bring to a boil. Add the beans and chicken, stirring frequently and checking for the meat to just turn white. Be careful as this happens quickly. Stir in the bag of spinach and cook until just wilted. Top with the pepper to taste and serve with a slice or two of garlic bread. Enjoy!


- clock went off from the candidate's brief case. He took it out, shut it off, apologized and said he had to leave for another interview.
