



## Captain John Ciulla: From the Docks to the Stage ...

Celebrating his seventh year in the fabulous Florida Keys, Captain John Ciulla is truly living the dream. By day, he takes to the high seas either scuba diving or free diving our fabulous reefs, spearfishing giant groupers and other monster fish. On Monday, you can catch him doing snorkel and dive trips exploring Molasses and other Pennekamp area reefs. He operates out of Pirate's Cove Watersports at the Marriott MM103. In 2019 I did an article spotlighting Captain Dave, owner of Pirate's Cove Watersports, where I first met John. John left an impression of being a fun-loving spirit.

Fate brought John around the world and landed him in the Florida Keys. He says he came here with nothing but the clothes on his back, his skills and determination. The sleeve of tattoos John wears on his right arm tells the story of his life with vivid artistry. Overcoming life's hardships with the burning desire to succeed and learning lessons from failed attempts. He might make it look easy, but it really IS a long way to the top if you wanna rock n' roll!

As a snorkel and charter dive boat captain, John's first job in the Keys was at Robbie's





(so busy there they should have their own zip code!). Hurricane Irma washed that dream job away, but not his spirit. It was the rebuilding efforts in the aftermath of a hurricane, when he realized the Conch Republic is a tough community that bounces back by coming together in times of crisis. That Conchs are a common unity of people who help each other after disasters, hosting fund raisers for locals and practically doing anything to help our fellow human here. (That IS why you

Before he moved to the Keys, he was a guitar player touring the US with his band "One." They had four number 1 hits and warmed up for Sevendust and other heavy metal bands. Born in Poughkeepsie, New York, when he was 5 his family moved to France. Then back to the states, where he attended school in Boca Raton, Florida, Minnesota, and Con-

necticut. After graduation he went to college in Palm Beach, Florida and grew to love spearfishing and scuba diving on the Atlantic. He has now had his captain's license for 12 years. In tournament fishing, he landed a record setting Warsaw grouper.

The first time I saw John

perform, I recognized him from Pirate's Cove Watersports. He played a set list that rocked, no country, no Jimmy Buffett; he was performing rock n' roll, kudos John! He is a "self-taught, by ear musician" with an amazing sound, no background tracks, or vocal enhancements, that's not his style. This rock soldier is accompanied by an acoustic quitar, a couple of foot pedals and an outstanding voice. He started honing his singing skills about 4 years ago. He says he got tired of the "lead singer ego." (You know... How many lead singers does it take to screw in a lightbulb? Only one, because the world revolves around them!)

When my friend, Badge from Los Angeles, and I did our "Covid Covert Cross Country Road Trip," amid the pandemic September 2020, we caught John playing at Hog Heaven. Covid rocked his family, around Thanksgiving 2020, one of his 3 older brothers and his mom (86) got it. His mom got sick but recovered and his His dad (90), 2 brothers and he didn't get Covid at all. His parents, who now live in Stuart, are still together after 67



years of marriage... kudos again! He has one brother living in Florida, one in North Carolina and one in Idaho.

John has had an amazing journey on his way to his home in the Keys. He seems blessed with a patient, kind, familiar quality. He has performed live from the Sunset Strip in Hollywood, CAto the Cruzan Amphitheater in West Palm Beach. He toured with "One" around this great nation for 3 years, living life on the road doing over 50 concerts a year, he lived the rock n' roll dream. (He's even driven through Hell - Hell, Michigan.)

Two words come to mind after getting to know John, authentic and adventurous. He is a dedicated, hard worker driven by his goals and ideas with a charisma that gets him noticed. Someone who truly is living out his dreams.
