

Drink it. If you can taste it then it is reasonable to assume you


are currently free of the virus because the loss of the sense of smell and taste is a common symptom.

Uh Oh. The Queen is not Amused!

To the citizens of the United States of America from Her Sovereign Majesty Queen Elizabeth II.





Contagious wins 57th Annual Islamorada Sailfish Tournament

The 57th Annual Islamorada Sailfish Tournament kicked off at the Whale Harbor seafood buffet all with social distancing and covid restrictions in place. The sailfish action started on Friday December 4th and continued over the next two days, concluding Sunday. Over the three days of fishing 90 sailfish were released out of 103 called in hookups with over \$90,000 paid to the winners.

The first cold front of the season greeted 98 anglers fishing on 21 boats. Juan Vilorio aboard the Hellreyzer would release the first sailfish of the three day tournament while Cloud Nine was fighting a double header. At the end of day one 32 sailfish were released and the Cloud Nine was in the lead with 5 fish.

Day two started early for Tackle Center as captain Charlie Scoble called in a triple header of sailfish at 8:42 AM followed by Last Dance calling in a double. Eleven other sails were released before Donny Lange released the third fish of the

Tackle Center triple header at 10:12AM. As the day ended, Tackle Center lead day 2 with a total of 8 releases followed by the Contagious with 6 and the Cloud Nine with 5.

The final day of fishing was calm and cloudy. The bite started out slow but Contagious picked at the sails all day. In the end Contagious took home the top honors with 11 releases.

Contagious angler and Keys Gentle Dentist Travis Bennett released 5 of those fish, winning the Bill Hirni highpoint angler award.

Debbie David of Hollywood FL, fishing aboard the Relentless with Captain Paul Ross, released 3 sailfish winning the Top Lady Angler award.

Second and Third Place Junior Angler awards went to Laurel David with 2 releases and Christopher David with 1 release, both fishing aboard the Relentless.

The Islamorada Sailfish Tournament is the first leg of the Florida Keys Gold Cup Sailfish Championship.



Captain Brian Cone aboard his charter boat *Contagious* led anglers Mark Mitchell and Kenneth Padgett both from Charleston, NC, Travis Bennett and Andy Cone from Tavernier, FL and Greg Tolpin from Key Largo, FL to the winner's circle with a total of 11 sailfish releases.




Junior angler 10-year-old Andy Cone took first place in the junior division with 3 releases.








- should never impose on their time. If you are riding in the same vehicle and you want to stay out later than your host, call Mom's Taxi 305-852-6000.

Pushing Buttons

When someone continues to open our old wounds on purpose, they must be told that their behavior is no longer welcome.

We've all had our buttons pushed to the point where we feel we can't take it any more, and chances are we've all pushed somebody else's buttons, with or without knowing it. The button pusher may not be conscious of what they're doing, but in the end the buttons belong to us, and we are the ones who must deal with what comes up. The more we take responsibility for our own feelings and reactions, the less tender these buttons will

We've all had the experience of having someone snap at us, seemingly out of nowhere. This happens when we unconsciously push a button in someone else we didn't even know was there. This can happen with a complete stranger and sometimes with a person we've known and been close to for years. We ourselves may have a relationship with someone whose buttons we secretly like to push. Buttons are just soft spots that have been touched one too many times, and they symbolize some pain that needs to be acknowledged and healed. This may be a wound from childhood, or some recent trauma, that we haven't adequately tended. Whatever

the case, when our buttons get pushed, the person who most needs our attention and caring is us, and blaming the button pusher only distracts us from finding a true resolution to our suffering.

At the same time, if someone continually opens our wounds so that they never have time to heal, we are well within our rights to set a boundary with that person.

Compulsive button pushers, who seem to find pleasure or satisfaction in hurting us, are not welcome in our personal space. In the end, knowing where our buttons are enables us to do the work necessary to heal. Freedom comes when we deal with the pain behind the button, thus disconnecting our automatic reaction to being pushed.

Crock Pot BLACK EYED PEAS

In my Yankee family it is a superstitious tradition that we must eat some peas, any kind of peas on New Years day to insure that you will have enough money to get you through the year. In the south it must be Black Eyed Peas and nothing else will do. For those of you who are like I was there is no need to panic. - 2 cloves garlic minced
- 3 oz can green chilies
- 1 1/2 tsp chili powder
- 1 1/2 tsp pepper
- 1 tsp cumin

Instructions

- 1. Soak beans overnight in a large bowl with 6-8 cups of water. Drain the next morning
- 2. Add beans to the slow cooker
- 3. Add in water, ham, onion, green chilies, garlic, chili powder, pepper and cumin
- 4. Stir gently to combine
- 5. Cook on high for 6 hours and check seasoning
- 6. Add in more salt and other seasonings as necessary, keep cooking until ready to serve
