



Meet the Robot Servers at Num Thai Restaurant!

Num Thai Restaurant at MM 103 Bayside is a locals' favorite and it is so good that other local restaurant owners dine there. And, just when you thought it couldn't faster service. get any better, it does!

Meet Michelle, one of Num Thai's new robotic servers that literally works circles around the other staff. Michelle is one of 5 restaurant automated servers recently acquired to help relieve staff of repetitive tasks and expedite service. Num Thai has 5 robots in total, 2 robots to deliver food, 2 to deliver drinks and one to bus the tables.

Num Russmetes, owner of Num Thai, purchased them from a friend who works for the factory in China, and the regular price for each is approximately \$10,000 each. Thats a lot of sushi boats, but its worth it!

The human servers load the plates full of food onto Michelle's infrared induction trays and then with just a touch or two sends pre-programed Michelle gliding to the table where a

human server meets her and distributes the dishes, or the diners can serve themselves. With less handling it is more sanitary and you get

Children love Michelle. Touch Michelle's ear and she giggles and winks. She will even sing Happy Birthday! Just when you thought you'd seen it all, along comes Sherrie with your drink order. My favorite is hot saki to go with my standard order of bagel rolls, extra cream cheese and wasabi. delicious!

Num said when the robots first arrived at the Key Largo restaurant it took a little while to program them but soon they were up and running around obstacles - they will run for 24 hours on one charge and their batteries have a 10-year warranty. Reason # 487 to Move to Florida: Stone Crab Season!

It's easy to become obsessed with stone crabs because they are delicious! Named for their extremely hard shells, the claws of the stone crab are a coveted delicacy. Though a bit costly, with a flavor and texture similar to lobster they are worth every penny.

The recreational and commercial stone crab harvest seasons start Oct. 15 and remain open through May 1, closing May 2, 2022. The minimum claw size limit this season remains 2+7/8 inches.

Most of the fine restaurants advertised in the Coconut Telegraph serve them and that is your best bet if you want to try them. However, be warned, they are addicting. Years ago I worked at a local restaurant that offered "all you can eat" stone crab. Some experienced crustacean connoisseurs even brought their own professional stone crab cracking machines. They are served with drawn butter and mustard sauce. See Chef Clark's recipe.

Stone crabs are harvested locally. Fishermen set traps and when caught they rip off one of the claws and throw the crab back in the ocean where it will regenerate a new limb in a few seasons.





Fortunately, unlike other critters, stone crabs feel no pain.

If you've tasted them and now want to serve them at home, do not touch a crab trap in the ocean. This is the fisherman's livelihood and they don't take kindly to

thieves - it is against the law and you will wish you'd never been born if you mess with their traps.

Sometimes our local the fishermen get paid in crab claws and will go to the Key Largo Moose or the American Legion and sell them. They are generally \$35 for a 3 lb. bag. That is the best deal on the planet!



Chef Clark's Recipe: Mustard Sauce
1 tablespoon Colman's dry mustard,

- or more to taste
- 1 cup mayonnaise
- 2 teaspoons Worcestershire
- 1 teaspoon A-1 sauce
- 2 tablespoons light cream



Store them at 32 degrees Fahrenheit in the coldest part of the refrigerator and be sure to use them within two days of purchase. Stone crab claws without cracks in the shell can be frozen for up to six months. Thaw frozen claws in the refrigerator for 12 to 18 hours.

Parrotfish eat algae and dead coral. They spend up to 90% of their day nibbling. In other words, they clean the reef. This is important because most of the reefs across the tropics are being smothered by algae


After all that eating, get this: They poop fine white sand – lots of it!
Each parrotfish produces up to 320 kilograms (700 pounds) of sand each year.

Their numbers are so depleted,

and algae levels are so high, that they cannot be fished sustainably right now anywhere in the Caribbean. These flamboyant, algaeeating, sand-pooping fish need to be left in the water.

And when they are left to chomp away, they do a brilliant job. A massive new report concludes that reefs where parrotfish were abundant in the 1980s are the reefs that are healthy now.

So please let's not eat them!
Please educate our fishermen...
Say no to catching parrot fish! Let's not buy parrot fish so they won't have reason to catch them anymore.
