



Jaunita takes pride in the Keys community and gives back through helping the Orchid Club, and the Garden Club of the Upper Keys. She donates her time and orchids to local fundraisers. Most all her regular customers are also her friends. One friend, Karen Beal, says Juanita is the "hardest working person in Key Largo."


Ninteen years ago, local realtor Jane Wasmund, contacted the Key Largo Post Office and asked a question: "Who answers the Santa Mail?"



Katsugyo is Japanese which roughly translates to 'live fish.' The Katsugyo Bag is anything but a bag, but is instead a complete self-contained live fish transporting vessel..

There's actually a whole separate compartment taking up half of the cylindrical prototype which has a number of life support components. The Katsugyo Bag is not designed to keep ornamental fish comfortable but instead is intended to keep live food fish 'alive' so that they remain fresh until they are ready to be prepared for consumption. Or you could just take a pet for a walk. Your choice!


## Betty Bauman Wins "Women Rocking the Web" Award



Note: If you ever feel compelled to 'mug' yourself with a taser, one note of caution:


