



Florida Hometown Heroes Housing Program Announced

Governor Ron DeSantis announced the June 1 launch of the Florida Hometown Heroes Housing Program to help Floridians in over 50 critical professions purchase their first home. The Hometown Heroes Housing Program will be available to Floridians including law enforcement officers, firefighters, educators, healthcare professionals, childcare employees, and active military or veterans.

This \$100 million program is administered by the Florida Housing and Finance Corporation and has the highest and most inclusive eligibility of all Florida Housing down payment assistance programs. The program is geared to expanding on Florida's existing housing programs to reach critical workers and those who have served our country. Find more about the program online.

"In Florida, we value the contributions of our police, firefighters, teachers, and nurses," said Governor Ron De-Santis. "Our hometown heroes are the backbone of Florida communities and making sure that they can afford to be homeowners is a great way to give back to them and support the future of the American Dream."

"Recently I started looking to buy a house. With the help of my realtor and loan officer, there was so much that I didn't know about and they were able to help me and guide me," said Officer Ashton Wolfe, Cape Coral Police Department. "I joined the military when I was 18. I was stationed in Washington, and when I left the military I came back to Cape Coral to serve my community as a police officer. The program Salute

Our Soldiers, which is becoming the Hometown Heroes program, allowed me to buy a house at the age of 23... so it has done great things for me."

"I have been a teacher for 25 years," said Melba Lugo, Second Grade Teacher, Mid Cape Global Academy. "In one day, I changed cities, I changed jobs and I bought a house. Thank you for this program and I want to thank all of these people that have made this possible."

Funds will be available to reserve starting June 1, which coincides with National Homeownership Month. This occasion celebrates the value that owning a home brings to families, communities, and neighborhoods across America.

To qualify for this program, homebuyers must connect with a participating

loan officer, have a minimum credit score of 640, provide certification for one of the eligible occupations, and meet the income threshold for their county. Eligible borrowers will receive up to 5% of the first mortgage loan amount (up to a maximum of \$25,000) in down payment and closing cost assistance in the form of a 0%, nonamortizing, 30-year deferred second mortgage.







In 1966, a small group of artists began to meet at the Islamorada studio of Miami artist, Bernice Shambaugh and this group became known as the Purple Isles Fine Arts Guild. In 1974, after withdrawing from the Florida Federation of Art, the Guild decided to operate independently to expand its membership, evolving to a fine arts Guild including photography.


The Guild changed its name to Art Guild of the Purple Isles or AGPI. Over the years AGPI has become an active group of more than 100 artists who are:

The AGPI mission statement in the bylaws of the Art Guild of the Purple Isles states the Guild will support students in Upper Keys schools with supplies and mentoring from our artist members.

- AGPI has a long standing history of involvement with community student art education as follows:
- AGPI mentored, promoted and assisted Art Teachers and students in local schools by completing many interior wall murals at the Key Largo School and Plantation Keys School. (We plan to resume school murals when the COVID threat is over).
- AGPI and The History of Diving Museum collabo-

rated for the third year on its 2021 exhibit entitled "The Art of the Abyss." This was funded through a grant from the Community Foundation of the Florida Keys. Students from Plantation Key School, Key Largo Middle and Elementary, Ocean Studies Montessori and Coral Shores High School created art Sculptures depicting creatures from the Abyss and was displayed in combination with artworks by AGPI artists in the Spring of 2021.

Tenth Place

(Andaman Islands, India)
John Allen Chau, a self proclaimed world explorer
inspired by Livingston and
Jesus, was killed by the very
tribe of natives he was offering eternal life. According to
the BBC in Delhi, Chau bribed
six fishermen to ferry him to
the off-limits island so he
could offer the Sentinelese
tribe gifts of scissors, a
soccer ball, and Jesus.

In a letter he wrote to his family, this Vancouver resident and Alabama native said he wanted to make contact with the 60,000 year old tribe because "The eternal [life] of this [Sentinelese] tribe is at hand."

He paddled to the island in a kayak and was immediately "attacked by arrows but continued walking," stated the global news agency AFP. The fishermen then witnessed the natives "tying a rope around his neck and dragging his body" along the shore. They were clearly rejecting his gifts.

The tribe, the most isolated on earth, has taken a well documented, zero tolerance approach to visitors since a British occupation almost wiped them out during the 1800's. It's no surprise Chau's remains remain unrecovered.

Ninth Place

Fourth Place

Sylvester Briddell, Jr., 26, was killed as he won a bet with friends who said he would not put a revolver loaded with four bullets into his mouth and pull the trigger.

Third Place

After stepping around a marked police patrol car parked at the front door, a man walked into H&J Leather & Firearms intent on robbing the store. The shop was full of customers and a uniformed officer was standing at the counter. Upon seeing the officer, the would-be robber announced a hold-up and fired a few wild shots from a target pistol. The officer and a clerk promptly returned fire, and several customers also drew their guns and fired. The robber was pronounced dead at the scene by Paramedics.
