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



Artist of the Month: Ginger Hill

Although I lived my entire life in Maryland, I remember vacationing in the Florida Keys with my family as a child. I was always amazed by the clear turquoise water, the amazing sea life and the beautiful tropical plants of the Keys. As a child, I was always encouraged by my mom to dabble in art. She would draw something and I would try to copy it. I loved art!

I studied painting and practiced lettering throughout my early school years. In 1980, I graduated from the University of Maryland with a degree in Fine Art. Over the years, I have had a wide



variety of art-related jobs: technical illustrator; display work for a large department store; make up artist; floral designer. As a mother of two daughters, I painted elaborate whimsical murals in their rooms when they were young... and I discovered my passion for painting murals.

Once my daughters were grown I wasn't sure what to do with myself. Divorced and tired of living in a cold climate, I moved to the Keys. I didn't have a job lined up and I only had one acquaintance in Key Largo. I took the chance on a new life in paradise.

The first year was a struggle, trying to find my niche. But I fell in love with the climate and my new community and I made friends

quickly. Then came Hurricane Irma. Fortunately, I was back in Maryland visiting my mom when the storm hit. My apartment was ravaged and most of my belongings were lost in the storm surge. But I was not discouraged. I have always been a bit of a "salvager," so I started combing



through mountains of debris in search of distressed and broken fence boards and discarded cabinet doors. They became my new canvases, and painting on Irma debris became my new niche.

From there, word spread and I began selling my art at local fairs and festivals. Then came requests for signs for local businesses and murals in private homes. Many people like my skilled lettering and whimsical style of painting native fish and birds. I really enjoy the unlimited variety of work that comes my way.


I love custom orders and commissions. I never know what project the next phone





call will bring or what challenge is around the corner. My designs can be seen on dozens of mailboxes throughout the Keys. I've also been asked to restore a 15-ft. marlin mount for a local tackle shop. That project led to more fish restorations.

I am often commissioned to do pet portraits and even mermaid portraits. I've made photo op boards (where tourists pose for funny photos) for several local



businesses. I enjoy painting whimsical window designs and fun chalkboard menus for local businesses like my ice cream shop.

I am often asked to host "paint and sip" social painting parties. These are always a fun time and I love sharing my talent with my community. It's fun to help others and see their surprise when they realize they can create

their own masterpiece.

I've been fortunate to have the opportunity to sell some of my tiki art and signs at KLI. My fun, Keysey designs can also be seen at Key Largo park on the dugouts, and I even painted a



map for our new Disc Golf course there as well. I was even commissioned to paint a map of all the fire stations in the Keys at the Firehouse Museum in Key Largo.

Ocean Dreams Cancer Healing Center's mission is to provide Hope, Healing, Education, & Relief from the day-to-day stresses of dealing with disease

Founder Terry Sutton's story: In 2015 at the age of 51 I was told the words you never want to hear, "You have stage 4 metastasized cancer." My family and I were shocked, devastated and confused. Was this to be my death sentence? During the next four years I had multiple surgeries to remove tumors in my colon/rectum, liver and left lung. Then in August of 2018 tests showed that the liver tumor continued to re-grow even after 3 earlier liver surgeries. There were no treatment options

Then in March of 2019 they said "Your liver tumor is pushing on and closing off your hepatic vein - it is 70% closed. "You will have less than 2 months to live. The only option we can offer you is a liver transplant to remove the aggressive cancer tumor. We have never offered this to a stage 4 cancer patient before and it is your only option for life. And since your liver is still functioning you do not have a MELD score to qualify you to be on the list for a cadaver liver. You must have a living donor liver transplant. And oh, by the way, you must find your own liver," Said the doctors. BYOL - Bring your own liver, what a concept!

left. The doctors said for me

to get my affairs in order

because I had about 6

months left to live.

"And don't worry about the Vena Cava, we will find one in our spare parts refrigerator. What? Yes, when you

donate your organs, you are donating your entire body. We harvest all of the good parts to be used in cases like this." Even more crazy now. I need 2 donors, one living and one cadaver part.

Ok, let's get our heads wrapped around this. How would I find someone willing to give up a portion of their healthy liver? It just didn't seem possible. Then a miracle came along named Danielle. She had just moved in the house next door an had made friends with my wife Brenda while I was in the hospital.

Danielle gave me part of her liver and that is why I am alive today. When I came out of surgery and got my life back I had a vision of dedicating my life to educating those suffering with the cancer diagnosis and their families and bringing them all together and Ocean Dreams Healing Center became a reality. And what better place could there be than beautiful Key Largo?

Ocean Dreams is a 50 (c)3 non-profit organization. Currently, we offer virtual educational programs and 1on - 1 coaching and listening ears to those diagnosed with cancer and their caregivers. Ocean Dreams Cancer

Healing Center's mission is to provide Hope, Healing, Education, & Relief from the day-to-day stresses of dealing with disease, to individuals & their caregivers, to improve the quality of their life together as they search for a cure.

themes such as fairy tales, fantastical poems and epics.


