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



Hold your position in the trees, my Green anole buddy! I've got your six.



Curly tailed lizards were introduced to Florida in the 1940's by sugar cane growers seeking to control insects. They live in dry areas, under coral rocks in the Keys and eat bugs and insects, but also flowers.

Another lizard, the Peter's Rock agama, began showing up in my yard around the end of 2020. Though first introduced by the pet trade in 1976, this lizard's population really took off in the Keys, coincidentally during the pandemic, when the Keys were also "discovered" by an influx of new human residents, whose demand for second homes sent prices up, and the local workforce out. During mating season, Peter's Rock agamas are pretty boys with boldly colored red heads, and a black body with more orange and ending with a black tip. Shy, they quickly retreat from humans, seeking cover under rocks or into the foliage. Both the agama

and the curly-tail are sit-and-wait predators, who watch for crawling insects and butterflies. It's no coincidence their favorite hangout in my yard is a coral rock covered by Corkystemmed passion flower, the larval host plant for a variety of butterflies, including Gulf Fritillary, Julia Heliconian and Zebra Heliconian butterflies. The Peter's Rock agama also preys on the Cuban brown anole.

Whisky Tango Foxtrot! Take cover, my Green anole buddy. There is a large predator heading your way. It's an invasion!

The Green iguana was introduced to Florida via the pet trade; somehow they got loose and now are found in the Keys, to as far north as Tampa Bay, and

all parts in between. They feed on foliage, flowers and fruit, and will eat insects, lizards, small animals, nesting birds and eggs. The males grow to six feet long including the tail, that can whip you and transmit salmonella; alligators, dogs and raccoons are their only natural predators. They dig nesting burrows that contain an average of 40 eggs. These destructive burrows cause erosion and undermine seawalls, and can cause you to twist an ankle while walking near one.

It is hard to calculate how many iguanas there are. A friend hunkered down in his home during hurricane Irma was amazed at how many iguanas were in the trees; as the storm raged on, soon revealed were dozens of iguanas, clinging to the defoliated branches. Cold blooded, they fall from the trees when temperatures go below 45 degrees, an opportune time to reduce their population. Green iguanas are here through no fault of their own, but I'm all for the death penalty due to their destructive behavior; call a Nuisance and Wildlife Management Pro, to do it humanely.



There is one reptile in my yard, who can be heard during May at dawn and at dusk, but rarely seen. Its diet includes insects, baby birds, and small mammals such as nesting mice. It lives in tree crevices, and even inside structures, behind suspended ceilings or within walls. A native of Southeast Asia, the Tokay gecko's call is described as "tuck-too," too-kay; it was this sound that prompted U.S. troops in Vietnam to informally dub it the "F\*ck You" Lizard... an informal "reception committee," and the only ones there speaking the truth.

#### James "JC" Costello Nov. 21, 1950 — May 19, 2023

Born in Winter Haven, JC worked as an engineering draftsman for many years, until meeting his wife, Sue Beal, in Pittsburgh in 1982. They moved to Key Largo in 1986, where JC took over a landscape maintenance company. Many remember him as the "man in white," seen working at many locations along US 1. He was proud of his commercial work featuring geometric precision, colorful bougainvilleas and crotons, and he always had time for a cup of coffee with anyone who stopped by.

JC played trumpet for years, in his youth. Later he switched to harmonica and the blues, which he enjoyed immensely, grateful to play with and learn from other local musicians in the Upper from his plants. Keys. He was always studying the blues masters and trying to improve.

His first wilderness camping trip was at 6 months old; he was an Eagle Scout and an outdoorsman, once briefly holding a national record for rifle shooting. JC was an avid fisherman, often fishing Flamingo and the Everglades. He was skilled, especially at catching snook. He went at every opportunity, in a Dolphin skiff he customized himself, and enjoyed just being on the water, even if no fish came home with him.

Another passion was growing unique crotons from seed, combining the genetics of the different plants to see what would grow from it. He was a member of the Croton Society, and other members would come to admire and take cuttings

He will be missed as one of the Keys characters in town.

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#### FRED'S TILTON HILTON - DOWNTOWN CARD SOUND ROAD

On the back of the shirt is Carol's original image of Fred's Place - the "Tilton Hilton." The restaurant, complete with slanting dance floor, blue crabs and cold beer, was located on the curve just across the Monroe County line, in the historic fishing village of Downtown Card Sound.

The photograph, taken in 1988 is a reminder of the once thriving community of nonconformists, squatters, and fishermen, who made their living from the surrounding waters, mostly by selling blue crabs. In its peak during the late 50's, this area was home to 100 residents, some who had State issued leases for "fishing camps."

Hurricane destruction, along with the politics of environmental safety, ushered in clean-up crews and by 2010, just a few wooden docks, and Alabama Jack. remain in Downtown Card Sound.

15. Law of Physical Appearance If the clothes fit, they're ugly.


16. Law of Public Speaking A closed mouth gathers no feet!



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
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## **Feeling Jealous**
