

Critters in Our Midst: Possums (*Didelphis virginiana*)

Not sure if the possum cared that I was photographing it. Maybe it couldn't see me or was just used to my presence?

Although I espouse the principles of planting for wildlife, I always seem surprised when it actually works. Wildlife need food, water, cover and a place to raise their young in order to live. Though there's little in this world I can control, there's an opportunity to make a difference when we plant for wildlife.

Though sometimes I may put a handful of sunflower seeds on the "seed table" for the resident cardinals or blue jays, I don't feed the critters. I do make sure my planting choices and practices are compatible with the needs of our native creatures. The best thing you can do to attract wildlife is plant native plants and they will come.

Critters can be pretty sneaky. Case in point: the gardener picked a ripe avocado and put it beside his lunchbox only to return to find it had disappeared. Hmmm? He assumed I had picked it up. I had not. A short while later we opened a storage box and there was movement and I screamed (of course), as I've never become accustomed to

actually seeing wildlife in my yard, and an enormous possum crawled out. It must've weighed 15 pounds! It had been the culprit that stole the avocado, and by

yard, looking for ripe fruit or vegetables, and clearing up any rotting fruit on the ground, I came across what appeared to be a dead possum. It was intact, no

the looks of things may have consumed many more. The possum just lumbered off when it saw us.

My thought is there's enough here for both of us, and I don't mind sharing some fruit or produce from my garden. One morning in January while surveying the

I picked it up, placed it in a grocery bag, and put it in the trash can. I didn't think any more of it. That is until I told the story to a naturalist who asked me if I

was sure it wasn't "Playing Possum"... you know, acting dead to dissuade a predator.

A possum will hiss, growl and flash a mouthful of 50 fierce-looking teeth in hopes of scaring a predator. If that doesn't work they will play dead, since the predator is less interested in dead meat. The naturalist said it's an involuntary comatose-like state induced by extreme

"We discovered a large possum enjoying some scraps outside the front door the other night. We used to have one who came so regularly every evening you could set your watch by him. I do believe that nothing in nature is ugly; however, I must also admit that there are some things that aren't exactly beautiful, and the possum is one them! This particular one was quite tame and would be quite still to be stroked.

His coat was as silky and soft as goose down which made him beautiful to touch. Perhaps we lay too much store in believing beauty to be a visual thing, whereas in fact it should involve all the senses."



AN OPOSSUM RESCUE


One lucky orphaned possum was adopted by my webmaster Brittney Novalsky, who named it "Paris," and she raised it from the size of a tiny mouse until 3 years old. Brittney says Paris loved to cuddle, go on bike rides, and had a very special diet to keep her healthy. Brittney drove an hour round trip to get Paris quail eggs.



The opossum is North America's only marsupial. Infants stay inside the mother's pouch to nurse and develop, but if the mother dies while still nursing,



her offspring rarely survive. At 7 weeks old, the young leave the pouch but stick close to mom, still nursing and often riding atop her back



Though a possum's life span is a short 3-4 years, Brittney says the experience of knowing love from an opossum was worth it.



FRED'S TILTON HILTON - DOWNTOWN CARD SOUND ROAD

On the back of the shirt is Carol's original image of Fred's Place - the "Tilton Hilton." The restaurant, complete with slanting dance floor, blue crabs and cold beer, was located on the curve just across the Monroe County line, in the historic fishing village of Downtown Card Sound.


The photograph, taken in 1988 is a reminder of the once thriving community of nonconformists, squatters, and fishermen, who made their living from the surrounding waters, mostly by selling blue crabs. In its peak during the late 50's, this area was home to 100 residents, some who had State issued leases for "fishing camps."

Hurricane destruction, along with the politics of environmental safety, ushered in clean-up crews and by 2010, just a few wooden docks, and Alabama Jacks remain in Downtown Card Sound.

Sonora Louise Smart Dodd first brought up the idea of a father's day in 1909. She wanted a special day to honor her father, William Smart.

When Sonora's mother died in childbirth with her sixth child, William was left to raise the newborn and five other children by himself on a farm in Washington state. As an adult, Sonora realized how strong and unselfish her dad had been raising his kids as a single parent.

Sonora wanted Father's

Day to be celebrated on the first Sunday in June, because it was close to her dad's birthday. Instead, the first Father's Day celebration took place on June 19, 1910 in Spokane, Washington.

In 1966, President Lyndon Johnson made the third Sunday of June Father's Day.

It wasn't until 1972 that President Richard Nixon made Father's Day a national holiday - about 60 years after Mother's Day had been made a national holiday.

Saturday 7-11: Caribbean Club w/Luke Sommer Glenn Band





Another scar for my good leg.

I try my best to shield my left lowermost extremity from befalling injury but it seems like it is marked by destiny to absorb the impact of the chaos that is life for the old and unsteady. My right leg, which is less affected by the diabetic induced neuropathy seems to escape the onslaught because it is far less likely to get infected by relatively minor cuts and bites. That seems to just be the way things on this planet work, its very nature.

Last night my 18 year old Tinker kitty was circling my legs and meowing impatiently as I'm exiting my van which is a #\$\$%ing process with groceries, cell phone, medicines
