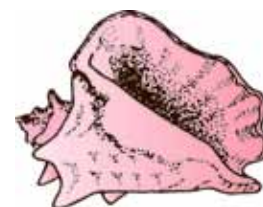



Checking Myself Out — A blog by Luke Sommer Glenn

It had been quite a while since I had the displeasure of going inside a crowded convenience store. I'm not talking about crowded with people, I'm talking about crammed with shit that no one should put in or on their bodies. There is no way they could fit one more item anywhere without completely blocking the aisles, which two adults cannot pass by each other without intimate contact as it is.

Now that I don't buy beer and tobacco every day, I rarely have an occasion to go inside a convenience store. I usually just pull up to the pump, check the tamper tags, stick in my card, fill up and go. No fuss, no muss, as it is said.

When we were on the road going cross country, a conveniently located convenience store could be your best friend at 3 AM, espe-

cially when the sausage dog consumed eight hours earlier from the previous store is getting more demanding about an exit by the second, if you know what I mean.

Convenience stores had more personality back then, each a reflection of the area in which they were located. All the trinkets and crap gave us something to look at while we waited our turns for the, as usual, one-seat shitter. Some were even loose with their placement of the adult magazines so we could glance through the articles while we waited...

It was always a mad scramble to get out of the band van first. We startled quite a few night clerks as we busted through the door in a mad dash to locate the bathroom... "Where's the can, man?" I would usually ask. We only stopped when the van needed to stop, as in

needing gas, the van had a 35-gallon tank and would usually run for eight hours between fill ups.

The guys would grab snacks for the road and pay for the gas at the counter with a human being in charge of the interaction between consumer and cash register. In other words, they rung up our shit and gave us back our change.

Skip back ahead to the other day when I had an occasion to go into the Circle K at mile marker 102 in beautiful Key Largo. The smell of junk food preservatives was overwhelming. I squoze my way around in search of what I was sent to get. I approached the checkout counter and couldn't figure out wtf was going on. Did 10 years magically pass while I was in there?

Then it happened. I was reminded of a time when my dad could not figure out how to use the newfangled, electronic gas pumps. He was used to flipping the switch to turn the pump on, maybe twist a knob on the side that cleared the previous purchase and fill the car up with high test or ethyl, as it was sometimes called. The new style pump had 3 different grades of gas and an electronic key pad... dad, born in 1922, struggled with a basic TV remote when he finally broke down and bought a solid state model. The main reason he gave in

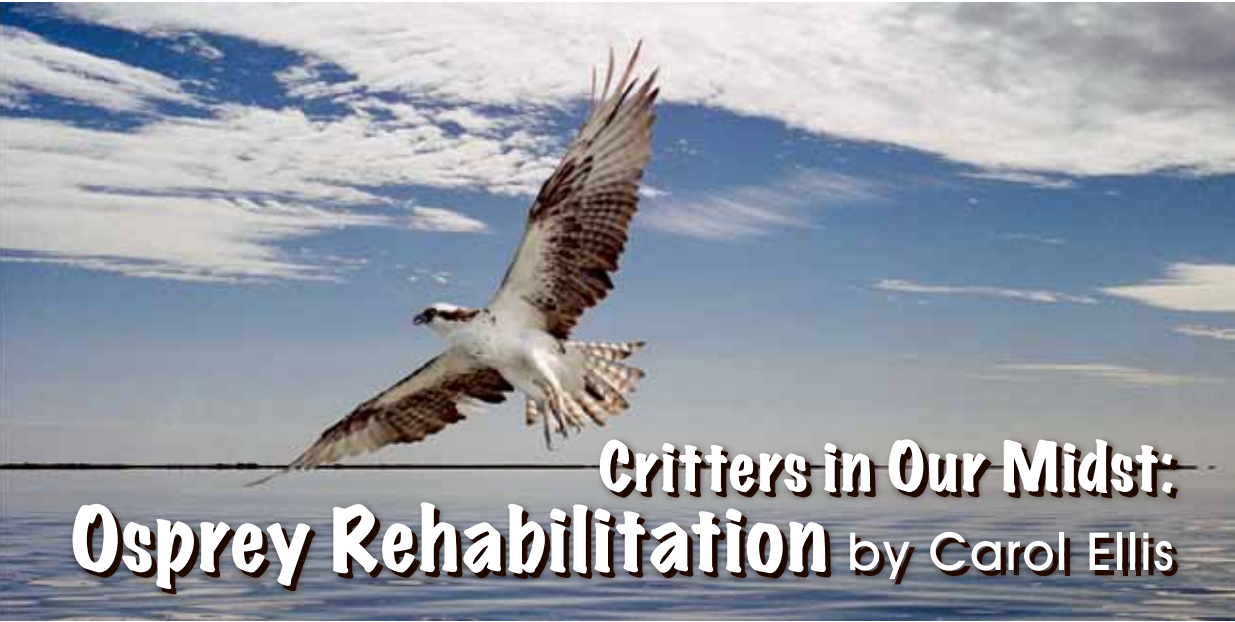

was because the Eckerd Drug Store got rid of their tube tester machine... you have to be old to understand... it's a thing from last century.

Meanwhile, this century, the checkout counter is gone, in its place is a robotic looking bin. An impatient employee points and spouts directions in Spanish at me. I can work the self check outs at Winn-Dixie and our new Publix but the one at the Circle K is not very user-friendly. And the ones at Publix don't take cash which is an inconvenience, guess they don't want to mess around with change dispensers and the like.

The Winn-Dixie at 106 takes bills one at a time. It's fun to stick all of the dollar bills from the tip bucket in, one at a time, \$36 for kitty and dog treats. It's super fun for everyone waiting in line behind me as the machine spits back a bill which I fumble finger to turn the other direction and it sucks it right in... most of the time, anyway. Sometimes I have to stretch out the wrinkles a few times... I've always been good at stretching out the wrinkles.

Funny how there's always an employee to make sure I didn't forget to scan anything but never one around to approve age restricted items... cameras everywhere with facial recognition but... I remind myself that I'll be dead soon enough, it's just a thing...

This spring I noticed that Osprey were missing from where I live in North Key Largo. Absent were their short mellow whistling calls, and all of the Osprey platforms in the mangroves and natural areas lie empty. Golfers were noticing the nesting poles on the three golf courses were also abandoned. Birders concurred that our local Osprey were indeed absent.

Inquiring minds want to know! My quest to find an answer led to many “round-about” theories, but no idea as to why our resident Osprey were missing. In the 1960s Osprey were listed as a threatened species, in decline due to the use of the pesticide DDT, which was banned in 1972. Osprey rebounded and were removed from threatened status in 2009. Currently, the overall population is doing well.

Osprey in the Keys tend to stay here year-round, though we do get some wintering migrants from the north. Their recent absence could just be due to

seasonal change, when Osprey northerners (like snowbirds) have started to leave this area to head to their northern nesting grounds. Another possibility is some of our locals journeyed into Central/South America and may just not have made it back yet.

Maybe something is sending them away? Could there be predation on the nest or food scarcity? Are raccoon, iguana or python, preying on their nests or competing for food? Osprey rarely eat anything other than live fish, and I wasn't aware of any issues regarding lack of fish. Catfish, mullet and ladyfish are favorite foods found in the shallow waters of Florida Bay. Based on research concerning mercury levels in waterways, which, given Monroe County's predisposition for higher concentrations, could mercury be affecting behavior or breeding success? Because we have had drought for the past two years? All possibilities, but only speculation on my part.

A second release took place at Pennekamp Park.

The most inspiring news came from Erin Allison, Executive Director of Florida Keys Wild Bird Rehabilitation Center (FKWBC), who reported admissions were up at FKWBC, where four Osprey fledglings were in her care. Erin reported “one was orphaned, two fell from nest, and one due to emaciation. All young-uns.” She quipped “perhaps we weren't seeing any because they were all in her care!”

Her patients were most likely our local birds just learning how to be Osprey. At FKWBC birds are checked for injuries such as broken bones and bruises and treated for emaciation, mites and internal parasites. When ready, the birds are put into a large L-shaped flight enclosure, where they can learn how to fly, circle, perch and get their stamina up before release.

After about 6 weeks in rehabilitation, two of the fledgling Osprey were set to be released back into the wild, and I was fortunate to witness the releases.

The first release was from the dock behind a bayside Key Largo bar during “Happy Hour.” The FKWBC releases birds from this location in order to bring attention to their mission. The dock leads out toward the bay, surrounding mangrove islands and shallow fishing grounds. Bayleigh MacHaffie, Operations Director at FKWBC, toss released the Osprey. It flew away from land, and soon made a dive into the water. An Osprey has keen eyesight, and can see neutral colored fish from 300 ft. high in the air. They dive with wings half closed, and instantly grab their prey with their long talons, and moments later shake the water from its wings and emerge up into the air again, heading off to its nest where the fish will be consumed.

This released Osprey did not emerge from the water right away. A few tense moments ensued. Some onlookers called for action to rescue the bird, The FKWBC assured nervous observers that this is what “fish hawk” do. After a short while the bird was retrieved. “Mr. Osprey crash landed, got water logged, and we took him to a beach so he could dry off and he flew off beautifully on his own,” Erin explained.

The second release took place the following day on a secluded beach inside Pennekamp State Park. Present were friends of the park and park rangers, including Joshua Wenkert Lane, who found the fledgling Osprey wandering around on the ground near Pennekamp Marina. The bird did not have the flight capabilities to return to the nest, and it was too risky to leave the bird on the ground.

Sara Read, Education and Outreach Coordinator at FKWBC explained, “Fledging is a natural part of a birds life cycle, so there is a period of time where there is an awkward guy hopping around on the ground figuring out how to fly. If it is in a very populated area like John Pennekamp that is where we run into issues, when human interference can play a role, and potentially injure the bird.” The release was described as a “walk-out” where Lane opened the carrier door, and the bird named “Penne” walked through the opening, and flew away to a happier tomorrow.

Both releases were beautiful, hopeful occasions made possible by the professionals who care for injured and orphaned wild birds and the donors who support their mission.

Stop in at the Key Largo Library any time in June to enjoy the one-woman art exhibit featuring Gloria Avner.

Gloria's mantra is "Be open to life!" and she expresses that in her art with lively use of color, media and subjects.

Gloria attended U.C. Berkeley during exciting times in the late 60s. A bohemian-style world traveler in her 20s, she lived in London and journeyed through Morocco and India. For 40 years she studied, curated and sold tribal art from Africa and Indonesia at the Arteffects Gallery. She also studied at the respected John

Campbell Folk School in North Carolina and Bellas Artes in Mexico.

The world offered adventure and Gloria has maintained that zest for whatever life has to offer. She has studied bronze casting in Mexico, painting in Sri Lanka and Cambodia. She even contributed to an art project with Yoko Ono.

And she has much to offer Life. Well known for batik painting, a unique blend of watercolor and wax techniques, Gloria offers classes appropriate for any skill level. Layering paint,

ink and wax in a batik process that blends spontaneous color and lines has been a lifelong passion and one she is happy to share. Our Place in Paradise Gallery (mile marker 88.7) offers her classes seasonally. Gloria has also taught at the Key Largo Library.

Not surprisingly, she will take on a school classroom project to support a Peace theme or to beautify the welcoming doors of the Upper Keys Jewish Community Center with a Tree of Life. Her work reflects joy and an open heart.

Gloria exhibits regularly in the Art Guild of the Purple Isles shows. Her paintings

and writings have been featured in Culture magazine and in other publications. Her artwork is also available on FineArtAmerica.com.

"I feel my current work is on a subconscious track to bring light into the world we interact with - animals, oceans and people. It is not just decorative art you are bringing into your home - it is something that engages each viewer in a personal way."

Despite being known as a professional artist in both coastal Maine, her summer home, and the Keys for decades, Our Place in Paradise Gallery recently hosted her first solo show. Fellow artists and patrons packed the house on opening night!

Basking in the shows success, she said "The one thing I love about the Keys community, the art community in particular, is that it draws you in and makes you family."

Angel Meditation

A meditation with your angels can add a new gentleness into your normal meditation routine.

sounds of the various rescue vehicles and helicopters throughout the story. It was a big hit, according to everyone.

The visit ended with a tour of the ambulance where youngsters and parents could examine equipment and ask questions. The paramedics hoped that if the children needed to take a ride inside one day - it would be a little less scary for them.



Everyone got stickers and a big wave as the crew prepared to drive away. They ended the visit with a quick chirp on the siren, flashing lights and saying goodbye on the microphone speaker - thrilling everyone one last time.

On the shirt back is Carol's image of Ruby Stern, matriarch of Downtown Card Sound Road, a place that doesn't exist on any map... yet was home to a community of free spirits, fishermen and independent thinkers who took up residence there. Located on the west side of the road south of Alabama Jack's, and the toll booth, the shack was originally built by workers who constructed the toll bridge around 1968. In 1972 Ruby moved in and lived there for 27 years. She'd sit on the steps of her shack, with an old Colt 44 daring anyone to throw her off the land. She stayed. Not even the destructive forces of hurricane Andrew and the county's condemnation of the shack could send her from her spot on the bay on Card Sound. She moved to a trailer alongside and lived there until 1999 when she had to leave due to illness, and died at age 90.

Coffee filters Who knew!?

And you can buy 1,000 at the dollar store for almost nothing even the large ones.

1. Coffee filters make excellent covers for bowls or dishes in the microwave.
2. Clean windows, mirrors, and chrome... Coffee filters are lint-free so they'll leave windows sparkling.
3. Protect China by separating your good dishes with a coffee filter between each dish.
4. Filter broken cork from wine. If you break the cork when opening a wine bottle, filter the wine through a coffee filter.
5. Protect a cast-iron skillet. Place a coffee filter in the skillet to absorb moisture and prevent rust.
6. Apply shoe polish. Ball up a lint-free coffee filter.
7. Recycle frying oil. After frying, strain oil through a sieve lined with a coffee filter.
8. Weigh chopped foods. Place chopped ingredients in a coffee filter on a kitchen scale.
9. Hold tacos. Coffee filters make convenient wrappers for messy foods.
10. Stop the soil from leaking out of a plant pot. Line a plant pot with a coffee filter to prevent the soil from going through the drainage holes.
- 11.. Prevent a Popsicle from dripping. Poke one or two holes as needed in a filter.
12. Do you wax your eyebrows? Use strips of coffee filters!
13. Put a few on a plate and put your fried bacon, French

fries, chicken fingers, etc on them. It soaks up all the grease.

14. Keep in the bathroom. They make great "razor nick fixers." And you can use them to wipe dentures.

15 As a sewing backing. Use a filter as an easy-to-tear backing for embroidering or appliqueing soft fabrics.

16. Put baking soda into a coffee filter and insert into shoes or a closet to absorb or prevent odors.

17. Use them to strain soup stock and to tie fresh herbs in to put in soups and stews.

18. Use one to prevent spilling when you add fluids to your car.

19. Use them as a spoon rest while cooking and clean up small counter spills.

20. Use to hold dry ingredients when baking or when cutting a piece of fruit or veggies.. Saves on having extra bowls to wash.

21. Use them to wrap Christmas ornaments for storage.

22. Use to remove fingernail polish when out of cotton balls.

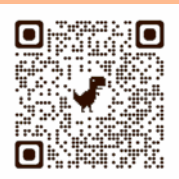

A man goes to the doctor, worried about his wife's temper. The doctor asks, "What's the problem?"

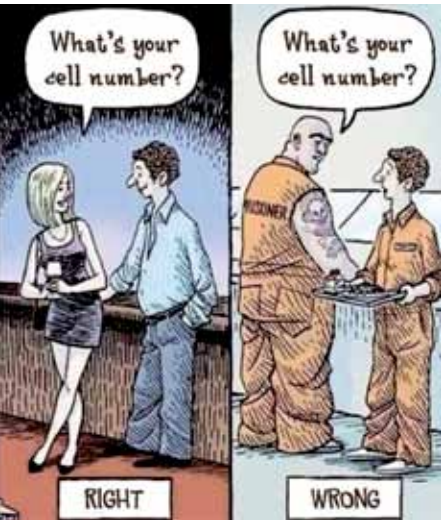
