A wide spectrum of wildlife, both local and migratory, depends on the rich, natural environment of the Florida Keys, but for most of us, their presence goes largely ignored. Small discoveries, usually while in the presence of “naturalist” friends, led to my interest in writing about nature and often I get alerts regarding wildlife from neighbors.

In late February I got an email from former photography student Mary Lou Krause: "Carol... there is a Great White Heron nesting on the island near our condo. At this time she has her babies. Might be a nice picture."

The island Mary Lou was referring to is a native outcrop of mangroves next to a protected mangrove forest. It lies a hundred yards offshore of Pumpkin Cay condominium complex. Though it has no official name, the neighbors call it "Pumpkin Cay Island" because of where it is located. Her condo is a great viewing spot for observing marine life such as bottlenose dolphin, sting-rays, turtles, brown pelicans and this pair of Great White Herons and three babies in their nest.

Pumpkin Cay Island checks all the appropriate boxes for ideal nesting bird habitat; it has sturdy branches to build a nest made of sticks, and is surrounded by water, with a seagrass bottom full of fish and crustaceans. Nesting birds feel safe there because of the distance created by the channel between the mangrove island and the sea-walled shoreline. There is some human traffic... small boats tied to cleats, a few fishing stations, the

occasional dog walker... but this doesn't seem to bother the herons.

The tidal flow from the ocean through Pumpkin Creek provides clear, clean water essential for wading birds, who very slowly forage in the shallow water, waiting for a fish to spear with their sharp bills. Herons will hunt during day or night; the most important factor is the varying tidal depth of the water.

Mindful not to get too close for fear of disturbing the birds, I set up my camera with long lens a hundred feet behind the seawall. There was one very large adult heron visible in the nest. It was late afternoon and the soft light lit up its feathers in contrast to the green mangroves. I didn't see the babies right away, but soon noticed yellow beaks and

black eyes popping up from beneath the adult's long light yellow legs. First I saw one rather bold baby, climbing up to the rim of the stick nest, its fluff feathers lit by the sun, then a second came into view, and the finally a third, clearly the most elusive, occupied the lowest portion of nest.

For the next few days I visited the herons during morning and late afternoon, and was fortunate to get photographs of both adults, in their natural environment, going about their everyday duties. This Great Blue Heron (white morph) nest on Pumpkin Cay Island is in the northernmost range for these birds, exclusively found in the Florida Keys and the Everglades.

One morning I could see momma heron patiently waiting on the nest for her partner to return with food, and to give her a break from tending the nest. Moments before he arrived, she rose up in the nest, stretching her long neck. Soon her mate swooped in and they stood close with necks and chest touching. After a little "mutual

appreciation" time, the female flew over to the seawall. As she perched on the seawall, she turned her head in the direction of the camera, with one leg raised, outstretched claws, and looked straight at me, as if to say "Can't I get a moment of peace?"

I loved this photo (right) so much that I printed it life-size, and placed it where I would frequently walk by it, make eye-contact and say "Hi!" This is the largest heron in North America, 39"- 52" tall with a wingspan of 5'10".


The heron made me smile, and it needed more of a name than "big bird."

What better way to get a name than display the heron at an event full of children and adults? I held a contest at the Eco Fair at Ocean Reef, where I was doing a book signing for "Critters in our Midst".



This heron was printed life-size, and featured in a "Name the Bird" contest. It received the name "Pumpkin" since it lives at Pumpkin Creek.

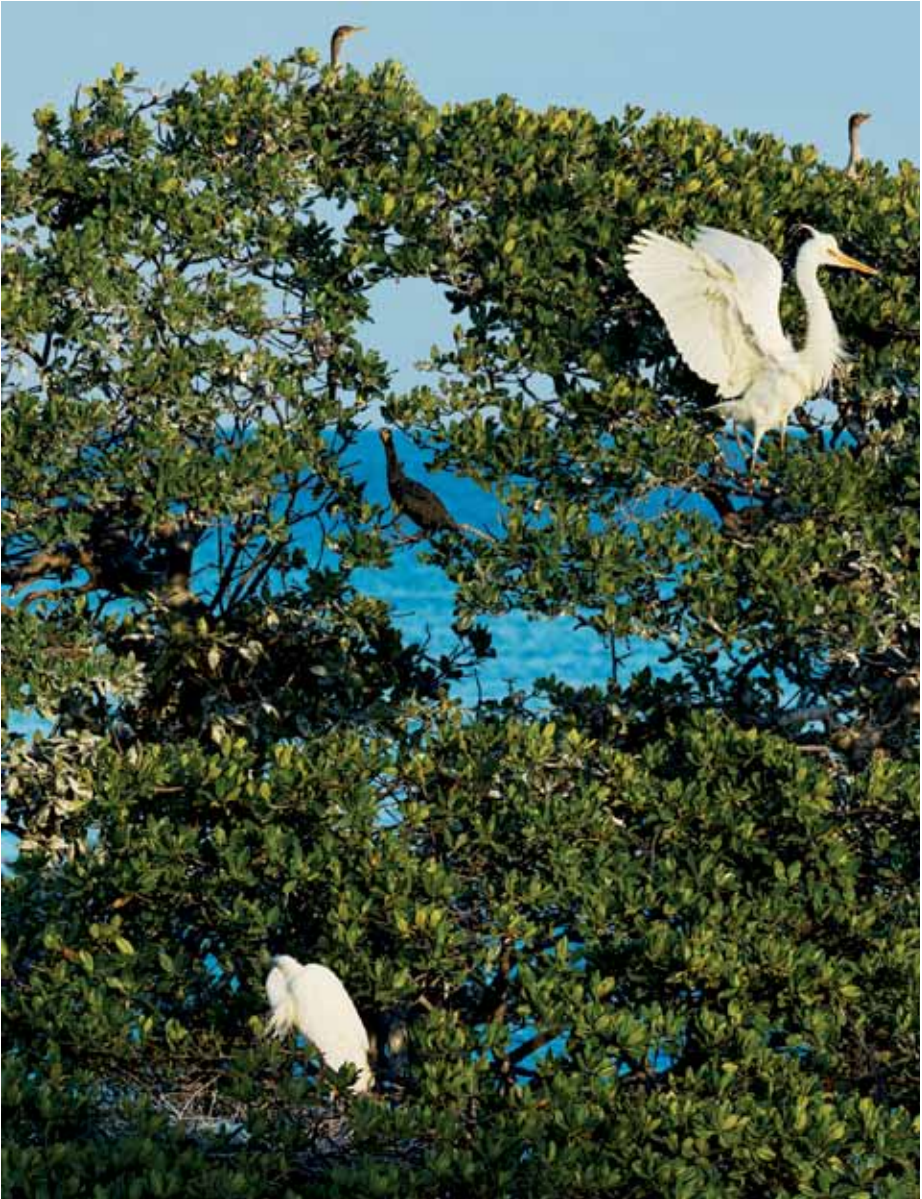


CAROL ELLIS has lived in South Florida her entire life and Key Largo for 37 years.

Despite the vast changes made by man to modify and occupy the coastline, most species can live nicely in proximity to humans as long as their most basic ecological needs are met: food, shelter and nesting sites. Habitat loss accompanying human development poses a great threat to wildlife, and water quality degradation is harmful particularly for wading birds.

Family Tradition Floats On

Decades ago, the romance and adventure of living in the Florida Keys was palatable. When Janice Pare moved here from Chicago as a newlywed with her husband who loved to fish - they knew they had found paradise. Fifty-six years later, Janice is still loving her Key Largo community and island life. One remnant of that spirit of adventure has remained in the form of the legendary "message in a bottle" floating out to sea.

Over the last 10 years Pare has launched 20 special bottles into the current and 7 have rewarded her with responses from near and far. The bottles are unique crescent moon shaped. In years

past, she would find them in yard sales and thrift stores. Now they are rare to find around town and the fancy bottles likely come from Amazon. The messages vary, some are hand written and some printed out. Each one tell a little bit about Pare and the Keys and encourages the reader to let her know who they are and where they found the bottle.

The project has become a family affair. Son, Jim Warnaar, seals the bottles carefully so they make the trip across the seas. Grandson, Captain and Mate Dillon Warnaar launches the bottle from the Fantastic II sport fishing charter, where he works with Captain Justin Hopper. If

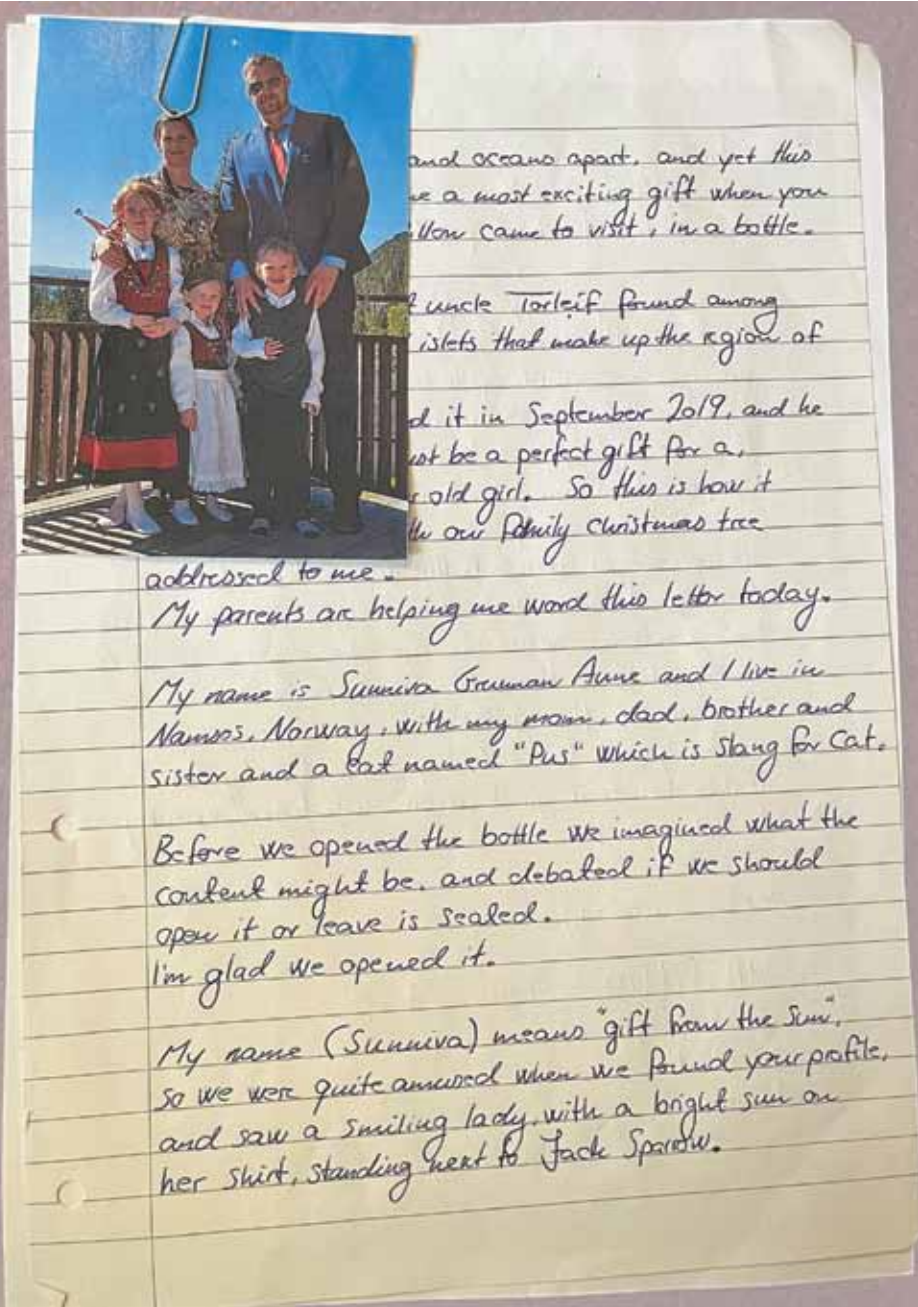

they have a young fisher-person on that day, they get the honor of tossing the bottle into the current. With 5 grandchildren, 3 greats - and twins on the way - this Keys family tradition could go on for a very long time.

Seven bottles of the 20, often floating for years, have been found and people responded to the message. Usually an excited phone call will prompt an hour-long conversation and a new long-distance friendship. As expected bottles are found either on a beach or sparkling in the ocean. As one would expect, several bottles were found along the Florida coast: Caesar's Creek/Dade County,

Key Biscayne, Daytona and Jupiter. A little farther away, one bottle was found by a couple on Corolla Beach in North Carolina and Grand Turks Island.

The most surprising find was noted in a letter from Norway. The 9 year old girl wrote eloquently about her great-uncle finding the bottle along their shoreline and saving it as a Christmas gift for his niece. She appreciated the romance and adventure that the bottle contained. "We are generations and oceans apart, and yet this Christmas you sent me a most exciting gift when you and your grandson came to visit - in a bottle."



Earth Day the Keys Way

Pam Caputo, Science, Technology, Engineering, Art & Math (STEAM) program instructor at Key Largo School, knows how to inspire people for Earth Day. She envisioned one of the school buildings with large, inviting walls as the perfect space for murals. "Although I'm not an artist, I've always wanted to see something creative on that wall."

In March, Deb Riolo, of BellaNonaArt, donated art work for a fundraiser Caputo was organizing. Conversation lead to the idea of working with the kids on an Earth Day project. Riolo accepted the challenge and the collaboration began.

Donations of paint came from Berry's Benjamin Moore, KLI, and Riolo's own supplies. The artist painted the background of the two murals: the lower half of mangroves on one and the globes of the hemispheres on the other.

Keeping the Earth Day theme, the mangrove mural included sponge prints of leaves, pods and flowers pressed by students, raising awareness of the Keys' fragile ecosystem.

Science teacher Jessica Graham came up with the inspir-

ing idea of using children's handprints to create a mural of the world. Riolo worked with KLS Everglades Ambassadors to scale the design onto the wall. On Earth Day students added blue and green handprints to complete the global mural. As



Riolo stated "The kids are literally leaving their handprint at this year's KLS Earth Day event." KLS principal, Darren Pais, along with the Earth Day Committee, invited local organizations, including REEF,



Dolphins Plus, Crocodile Lake Refuge, MOTE Marine Lab, and Turtle Hammock to host engaging learning stations for the students.

Throughout Earth Day, all 400 students rotated through student-run interactive stations: "Where Does Our Water Come From—and Where Does It Go?", a nature

scavenger hunt, pop-top bracelet making, edible aquifers and guided tours of the school nature trail.

Ms. Caputo, admiring the work of her students, was heard to say, "I truly hope we'll collaborate on more murals for KLS in the future."

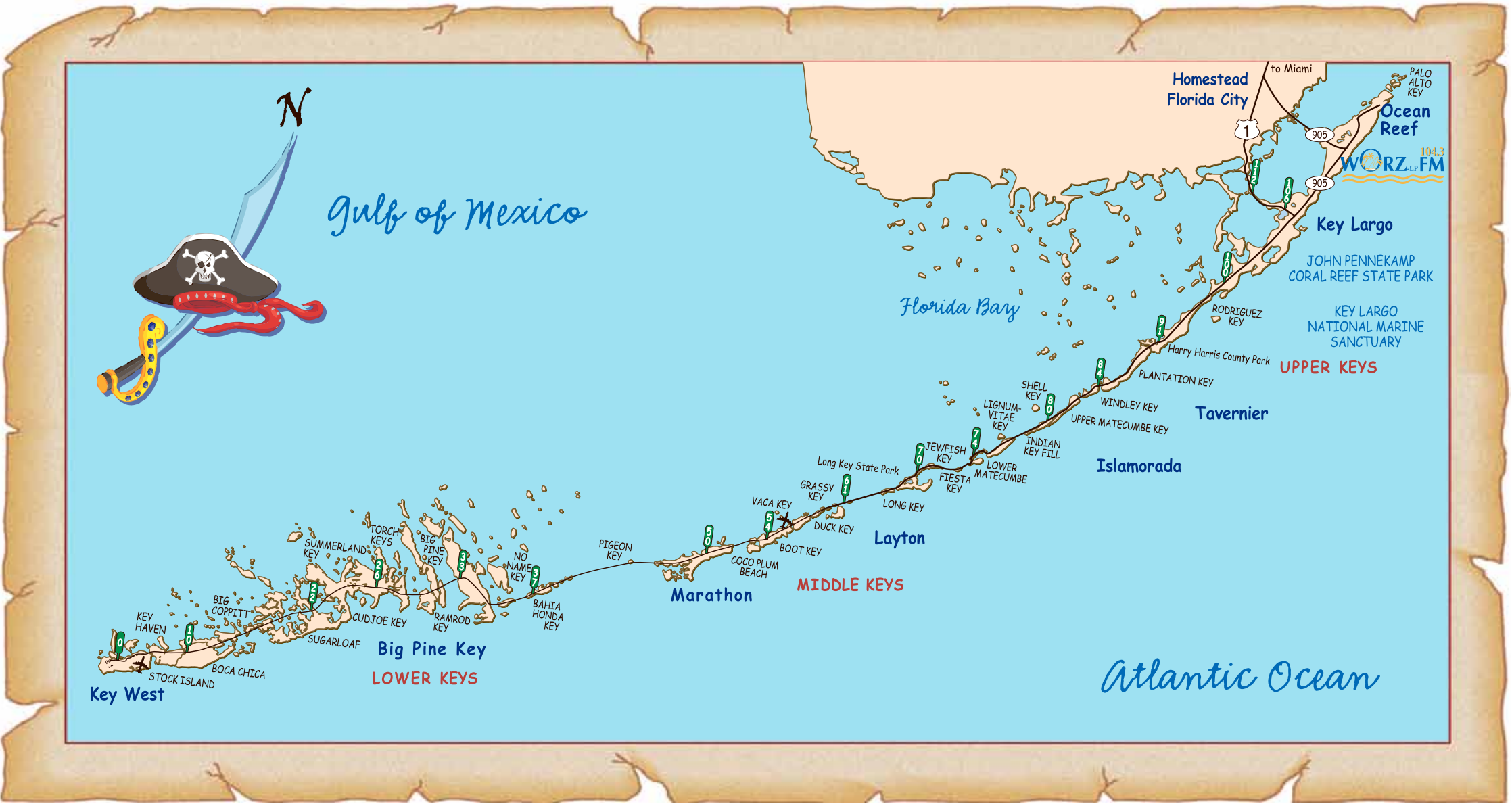



On the shirt back is Carol's image of Ruby Stern, matriarch of Downtown Card Sound Road, a place that doesn't exist on any map... yet was home to a community of free spirits, fishermen and independent thinkers who took up residence there. Located on the west side of the road south of Alabama Jack's, and the toll booth, the shack was originally built by workers who constructed the toll bridge around 1968. In 1972 Ruby moved in and lived there for 27 years. She'd sit on the steps of her shack, with an old Colt 44 daring anyone to throw her off the land. She stayed. Not even the destructive forces of hurricane Andrew and the county's condemnation of the shack could send her from her spot on the bay on Card Sound. She moved to a trailer alongside and lived there until 1999 when she had to leave due to illness, and died at age 90.

Casual anglers and fishing enthusiasts are invited to fish the non-intimidating LLGF Screamin' Reels Tournament in May in Islamorada. Hosted by the nonprofit Ladies Let's Go Fishing Foundation, this unique tournament welcomes anglers to compete for inshore or offshore species while learning valuable fishing skills along the way.

The action-packed weekend kicks off on Friday with a presentation on fishing rules and conservation, plus a meet and greet with fundraisers from 6:30-8 pm at the Tavernier Elks Club.

On Saturday and Sunday, participants will take to the water in a friendly competition aboard private boats or guided charter boats, departing from Whale Harbor and other locations. The 2024 event saw an impressive 180 fish hooked across inshore and offshore categories.
