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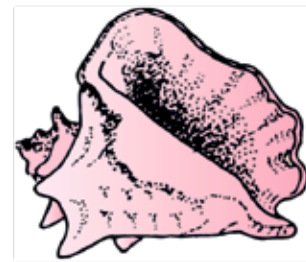

I knew what I was giving up when I decided to follow my muse instead of the life that had been presented to me. The majority of my fellow musicians eventually acquiesced to the grind sooner or later.

I had already tried it the "proper" way and I kept getting laid off from electronics jobs due to lack of work. All of the recently laid off would gather at a local watering hole and put on a brave face.

Getting laid off the week before Xmas was a hard pill to swallow especially for the ladies that worked on the assembly line stuffing parts into printed circuit boards. There was no job security, I might as well be a musician...

I dated a church girl who had just graduated high school... I was 4 years older. Her dad decided I should forget about electronics and go to work for him at Union Carbide making rocket fuel for NASA. I couldn't stand the smell of the place when I drove by - his hands were all eaten up from chemicals - thanks, but no effing way.

The band had gotten a 5 night a week gig at the Straw Hat Club in beautiful Cape Canaveral. I wound up living with some strippers for a while before hooking up with the bartender and moving in with her.

I miss living with the strippers. I would escort them to the nude beach, which was an hour drive, and they would go topless and wear string, butt floss bikini bottoms to create a "special" tan line as they were totally nude when they performed. Those girls made crazy money and they weren't really into drugs so they

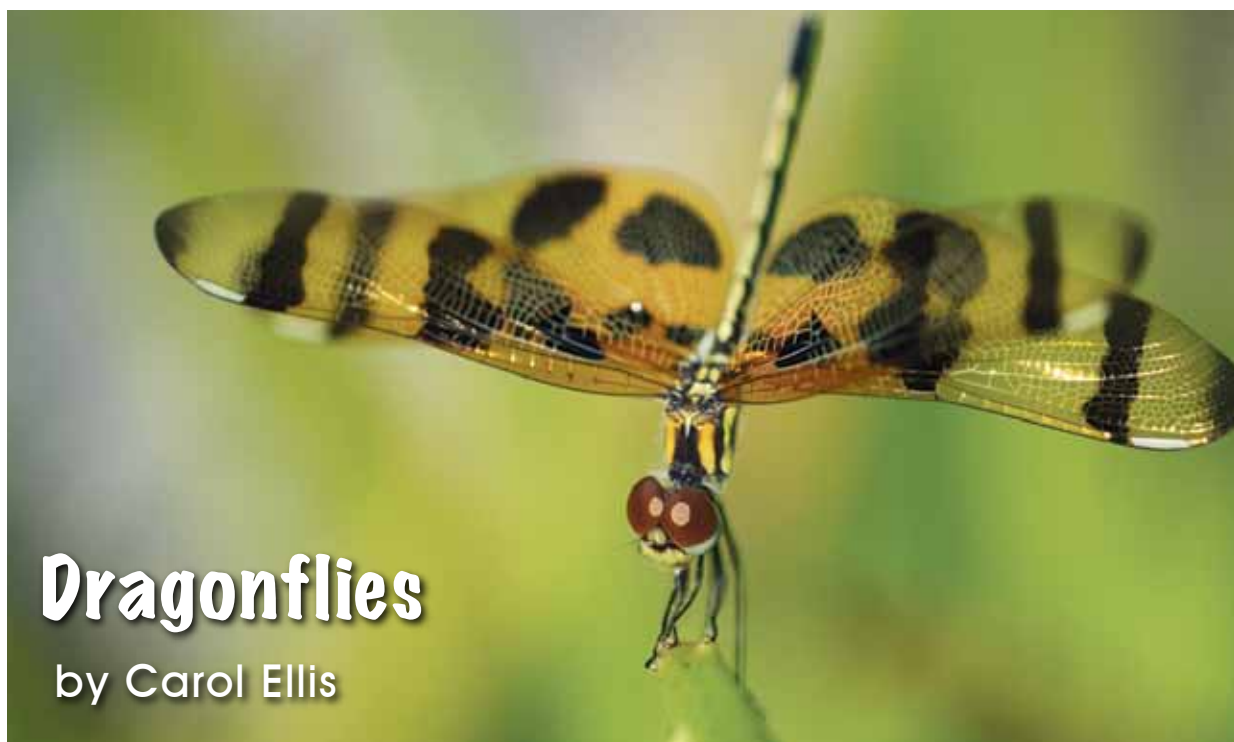

Dragonflies

A Dragonfly has many lensed eyes and a nearly 360-degree field of view.

A golden glint catches my eye. Atop a purple bloom, a Dragonfly sits with tightly clenched legs, its small body changing direction like a pennant in the wind. How beautiful... a God-given work of art.

My butterfly garden has produced many moments of joy in its first year. Designed with pollinators in mind, it has hosted many things with wings. From the buzzing bees to migrating birds splashing in the fountain; from hungry caterpillars to butterflies sipping sweet nectar, their larvae munching on the milkweed where chrysalis will soon hang.

The purple firespike was planted for the hummingbirds, a species which still

remains elusive from my vision and that of my camera. The good news is the Dragonfly took advantage of the firespike's spindle-like bloom to rest. The creature let me take multiple photos with my camera lens just inches away from its tiny form. What a fearless critter! Is that why they call it the Dragonfly?

The name Dragonfly is from the Old English word dragoun, referring to a mythical serpent or sea monster; and the word fleoge referring to flying insects. By putting the two words together you get dragounfleoge, meaning dragon-like flying insect. There is nothing to fear about these "dragons." They don't bite because they don't have teeth. They do have a serrated mandible which comes in handy for holding and crushing prey.

The Halloween Pennant Dragonfly (*Celithemis eponina*) featured in my photos is named for its orange-colored wings, with dark brown bands. It is found in the Eastern U.S., especially near fresh water ponds, and is seen perching on tall grasses, reeds and cattails. The males are

often spotted in groups of 10-15 and are in search of a female. The males are more vibrantly colored, and have a red face while the females have a yellowish face, and heart-like markings on their abdomen.

They appear in the Keys usually in late Spring/early Summer, about the same time as the mosquitos arrive and the snowbirds depart. Dragonflies are known as "Mosquito Hawks." They are excellent flyers, which is a good thing, because they only eat while in flight. Dragonflies catch their prey by grabbing it with their feet or mandibles.

Getting a picture of a Dragonfly catching a mosquito in flight would definitely be a prize winning photo! The behavior is not rare... It's estimated adult Dragonflies consume 30 - 100 mosquitos per day, and if they can't fly they will starve.

There are three stages in the life-cycle of the Dragonfly: egg, larva (also known as nymph) and adult. The female Dragonfly deposits eggs in a pond and a tadpole-like prolarva emerges from the egg. This stage lasts up to a year in warmer climates, and here the larvae hunt for mosquito larvae and more.



This photo appears to show the adult dragonfly chewing foliage, but that is not the case. Dragonflies are meat eaters... consuming exclusively flying insects, especially mosquitos, flies and gnats.

So how did they find my garden in the Upper Keys which is surrounded by coastal marshes and mangrove swamps? Dragonflies can do well in small freshwater ponds like mine, which never runs dry, is free from chlorine and chemicals; my pond even has a red mangrove living in it which was planted from seed. The leaf debris at the bottom of the pond creates a natural habitat and circulation keeps it clear. I often see tadpoles, and the birds are regular visitors. Perhaps I have a Dragonfly habitat?

An outdoor pond has some benefits: my orchids like the transpiration of the circulating water, the birds have a place to drink, especially migrating birds who stop there. Am I on their map? My pool lady saw my waterfall and asked if I'd like it cleaned of algae. No, I replied, it is for the birds. If you have a pond, don't keep it too clean, for you may disturb the areas where critters lay their eggs. Also chlorine is not good for our critters to drink. There is nothing wrong with a little "green." Avoid

pesticides near the water. That goes for ponds and also our nearshore waters.

Dragonflies have the potential to control mosquitos, and indirectly the diseases they carry.

So think twice when you get that notice from the Florida Keys Mosquito Control District (FKMCD). These agencies commonly use the organophosphate insecticides malathion and naled and the synthetic pyrethroid insecticides prallethrin, etofenprox, pyrethrins, permethrin, resmethrin and sumithrin for adult mosquito control.

There is collateral damage from broad application of these compounds.



Dragonfly eggs laid in quiet ponds hatch as nymphs possessing a voracious appetite. They begin controlling the mosquito population by eating mosquito larvae, plus fish and tadpoles. They remain in this stage for just weeks, months, or up to 1-3 years. Would it be better to burn a mosquito coil or apply spray to our clothing to keep areas mosquito free?

It's not a perfect world, so lets make "more better" choices.

The art of making colorful sushi and beautiful Thai dishes creates a feast for the eye and the tastebuds. Anyone who has visited Num Thai Restaurant (at mile marker 103.2 bayside) knows this to be true.

Num and his wife, Tiki, worked in a high-end South Beach restaurant in the mid 80s: she as a manager and he as a buyer and chef. They would escape to Key Largo to relax from their high pressure jobs. In 1991 they decided to open their own restaurant and knew Key Largo was really the place they wanted be. Their skills were well matched and

he had made good connections in Miami - so they made the big move.

It started small. One storefront and a lot of hard work eventually grew to three storefronts offering a sparkling sushi bar and three distinct spaces for seated dining. Two rooms can accommodate single diners and groups of 10 with ease. The handsome red and

gold dining room can be reserved for private parties. The menu is extensive with many Thai dishes and a large list of unique sushi rolls, nigiri, sashimi and more. Wine, beer and sake are available.

Num is at work early in the morning selecting fish at Key Largo Fisheries and prepping the sushi bar. Other specialty fish come ice-cold from suppliers in Miami that he has known for decades. The staff is an international mix, heavy on Thai influence. Num makes

Why We Have Pennekamp Park

John D. Pennekamp (1897-1978) was not a marine biologist or a career politician; he was a hard-nosed editor for the Miami Herald. Despite his desk-bound profession, Pennekamp became one of Florida's most fierce environmental champions, playing a pivotal role in the creation of Everglades National Park. However, his most enduring legacy lies just offshore in Key Largo.



In the 1950s, the Florida Keys' coral reefs were under siege. Souvenir hunters were dynamiting reefs to harvest coral, and spearfishers were depleting fish populations at an unsustainable rate. Pennekamp used his editorial influence to sound the alarm, relentlessly pushing for the protection of these underwater treasures. He collaborated with biologist Dr. Gilbert Voss to propose a radical idea: a park that existed primarily beneath the waves.

Why the Park Bears His Name

In 1960, their efforts culminated in the establishment of the nation's first undersea park. In recognition of his tireless advocacy and his ability to mobilize public opinion through the press, Florida Governor LeRoy Collins named the sanctuary John Pennekamp Coral Reef State Park.

Today, the park protects approximately 70 nautical square miles of seagrass beds, mangrove forests, and living coral. It serves as a living monument to a man who proved that a pen can be just as effective as a boat in preserving the ocean's wonders.

For the second consecutive year, employees of Dolphins Plus Bayside participated in the ICareTrash Derby.


I Care Corals is a group dedicated to keeping the waters of the Florida Keys clean. The Derby attracts locals and people from around the world to help clean our

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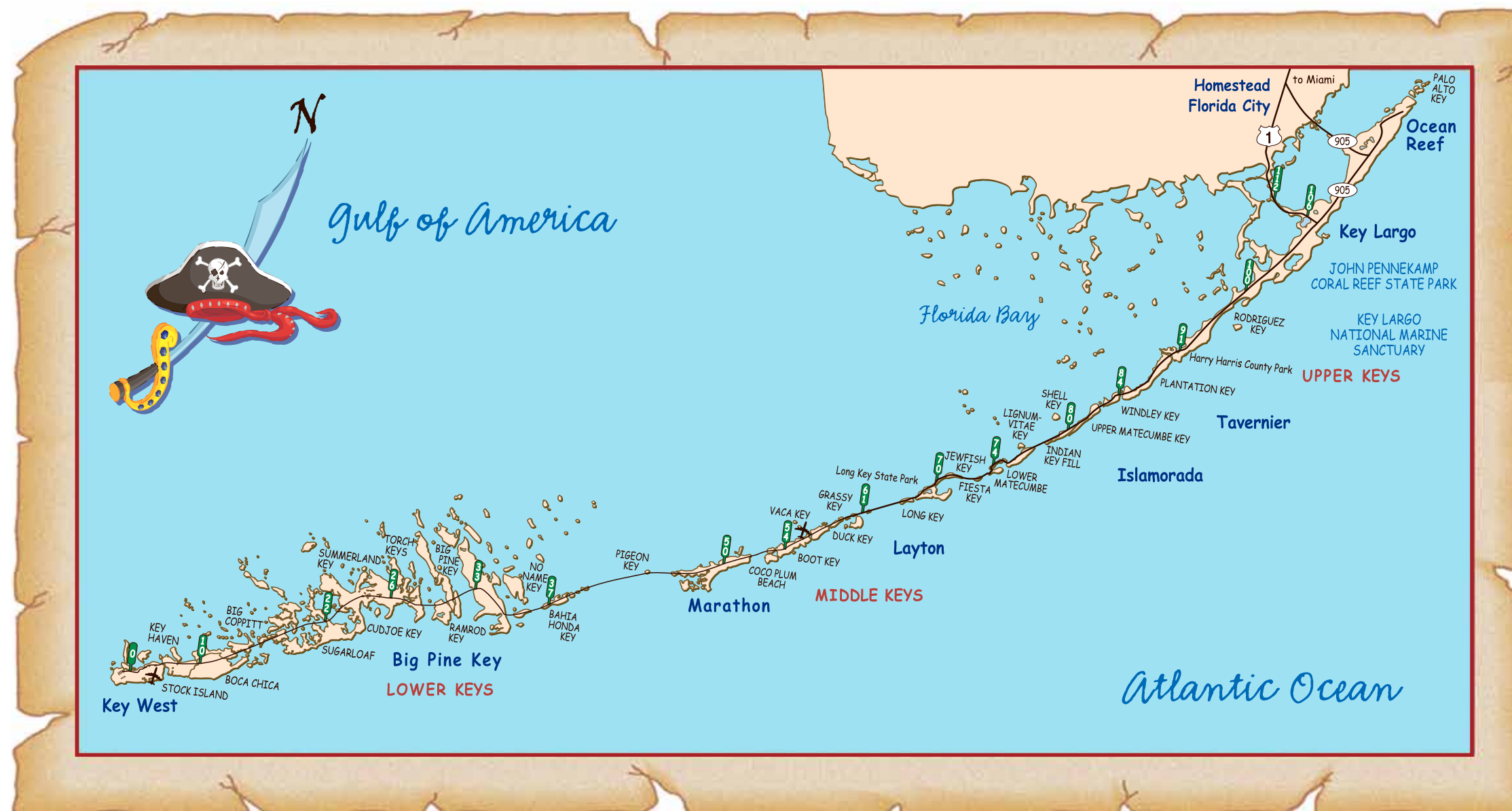
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Duct Tape and Hurricane Season

Whether you call it Duck Tape (because it is waterproof) or Duct Tape (because it connects air ducts) you definitely need a case or two of the utilitarian, pewter-colored tape. Here are just some of the ways you can use it before and after a hurricane.



Before the storm:

Wind indicator: adhere rock to end of a yard of tape and dangle it from a tree branch you can see from your window. Hanging down straight - no worries. Swaying - Cat 1. Swinging wildly - Cat 3. Rock missing and the tape is flapping - Cat 5.

Cover your windows and sliders with tape. Nothing will penetrate that barrier.

Run tape along the outside of each door. Start waist high, down along the bottom and up the other side. This will prevent flooding.

Lash down the car port with tape and adhere to cement blocks.

Keep dock lines from fraying - tape before you cut.

Tape shutters closed just to be sure they will hold.

Inside the house: tape all your kitchen cabinets and drawers shut with belongings in them. Do the same with bedroom dressers, then tape the dressers to the floor.

Tape your valuables inside your washer and dryer drums for safe keeping. They are unlikely to go anywhere.

Running out of rope to tie things down? This is a two man operation: stick the end of the duct tape roll to a portable drill - run the tape out as far as you need - turn on the drill and the tape will twist into a strong rope.

It is hot work prepping for a storm. Keep sweat out of your eyes: create a little gutter with a piece of tape stuck to your forehead.

After a storm:

Repair a favorite tree wrap/splint broken branches with tape. The tree will mend the wound. Of course, if you tape up your trees before the storm, they will be indestructible.

If you must go outside during a hurricane, cover yourself with 10 layers or more of duct tape. Nothing will penetrate that barrier.

Cover your styrofoam cooler with duct tape. It will last a lot longer and look spiffy. Repair a hinge on your Igloo cooler with a tape hinge.

There will be debris on the road. Use tape to repair a punctured tire.

Don't walk through flood water; it is not sanitary. Duct tape 5-gallon buckets to your feet to stay dry.

Repair any boat hull with overlapping strips of tape.

A quick first aid tip: small wounds can be covered with tape. Big wounds? Use tape to secure towels, shirts or other compresses in place.

While the electric is down - tape your flashlight to your hat.

Fix car damage with duct tape.

Mosquitoes go crazy after a storm. Make a body suit of inside-out tape to trap mosquitoes.

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Monroe Co. Woman Arrested After Allegedly Running "Trunk-side BBQ Squirrel Plate" Operation In Parking Lot

Deputies say a Stock Island woman is facing multiple charges after allegedly operating what authorities are calling "an unlicensed mobile squirrel based food enterprise" out of the trunk of her 2004 Buick LeSabre.



According to MCSO, 42-year-old Darlene "Darla Mae" Pinder was arrested Tuesday afternoon after deputies received "no fewer than nine complaints" about a woman hollering, "Hot squirrel plates! Ten dollars, comes with slaw!" in the grocery store parking lot.

Witnesses told deputies the trunk of Pinder's Buick was "set up like a makeshift concession stand," complete with a folding card table, a crockpot plugged into a questionable extension cord, and a handwritten sign reading "SQUIRREL BBQ — FARM TO TRUNK."

THE BUST

Deputies say when they approached the vehicle, Pinder attempted to slam the trunk shut, shouting, "These ain't for sale, they're for my church!" before a cloud of hickory smoke billowed out, revealing at least 14 foil-wrapped plates stacked like a tailgate buffet.

A deputy on scene reported that the aroma was "shockingly pleasant, if not concerning."

Pinder was taken into custody after allegedly trying to bribe officers with a "family size sampler plate."

CAR IMPOUNDED

The Buick was immediately impounded, though the towing company reportedly demanded hazard pay after discovering the backseat was "full of squirrel pelts, three crockpots, and what appeared to be a bucket labeled 'KEY LIME MARINADE.'"

The tow truck driver, who asked not to be named, said, "I've hauled meth labs, I've hauled gator traps, but this... this is new."

COMMUNITY REACTION

Local resident Melva Ann Albury said she wasn't surprised. "Darla Mae's been cooking critters since '98. Once she tried to sell me a iguana pot pie at a yard sale. Honestly, the squirrel plate wasn't half bad."

Another shopper added, "I thought it was a fundraiser. Around here, you never know."

CHARGES

Crews faces charges including: Operating an unlicensed food service; Illegal sale of wildlife; Obstruction; Possession of an extension cord described as "a fire hazard in three states."

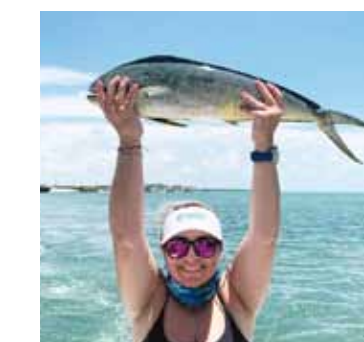
