They are NOT street legal.

They are:

- Classified as off-road vehicles
- Not eligible for registration
- Not equipped with operable pedals
- Capable of speeds exceeding 28 mph
- Equipped with motors exceeding 750 watts

E-dirt bikes not allowed:

- Roadways
- Sidewalks
- Bike lanes
- Bike paths
- Public rights-of-way

- Riders may be cited
- Vehicle impoundment
- Possible criminal charges
